Tax rebates up for county

State comptroller Bob Bullock sent checks totaling \$38.9 million to 967 Texas cities as their share of the one-percent city sales tax for July.

"These monthly rebates, and the retail sales they represent, continue to show increases over last year," Bullock said. The comptroller pointed out that for the first seven months of 1982, sales tax collections are running 14.4 percent ahead of 1981.

The City of Spearman received a check for \$10,457.14 for the period ending July 7, 1982. This compares to \$10,830.00 for the same period last year.

1982 payments to date to the city are \$113,881.94 compared to \$102,004.47 last year, up 10.56.

The City of Gruver received a check for \$749.42 for the period ending July 7, 1982, compared to \$1,020.00 for the same period last year. So far this year the City of Gruver has received \$16,130.38 compared to \$15,522.69 last year, up 3.91%.

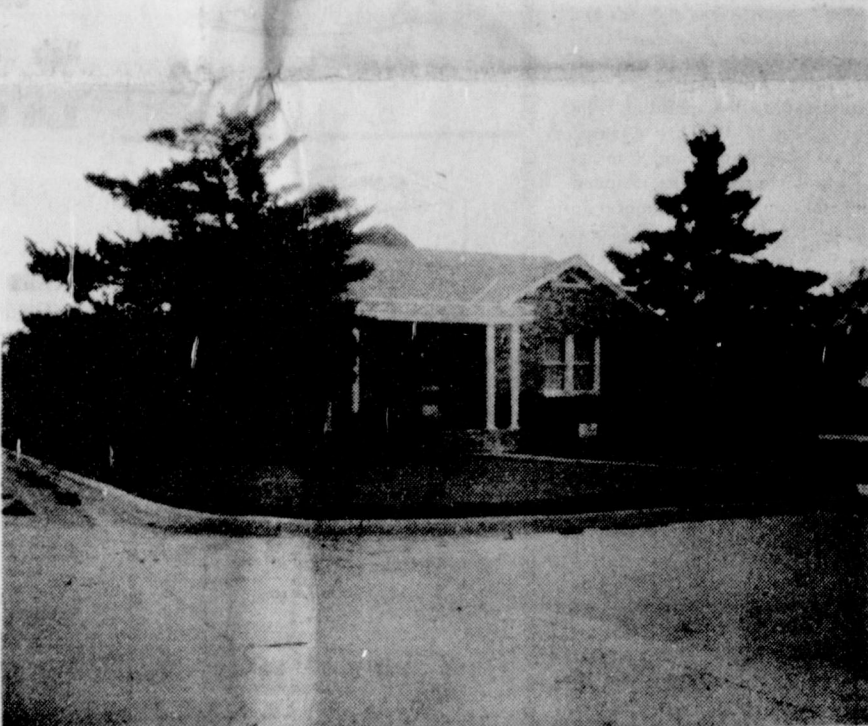
The Charlie West home at 706 Lee Drive was the July winner of Section 3 in the local "Put A Shine On Spearman" contest.



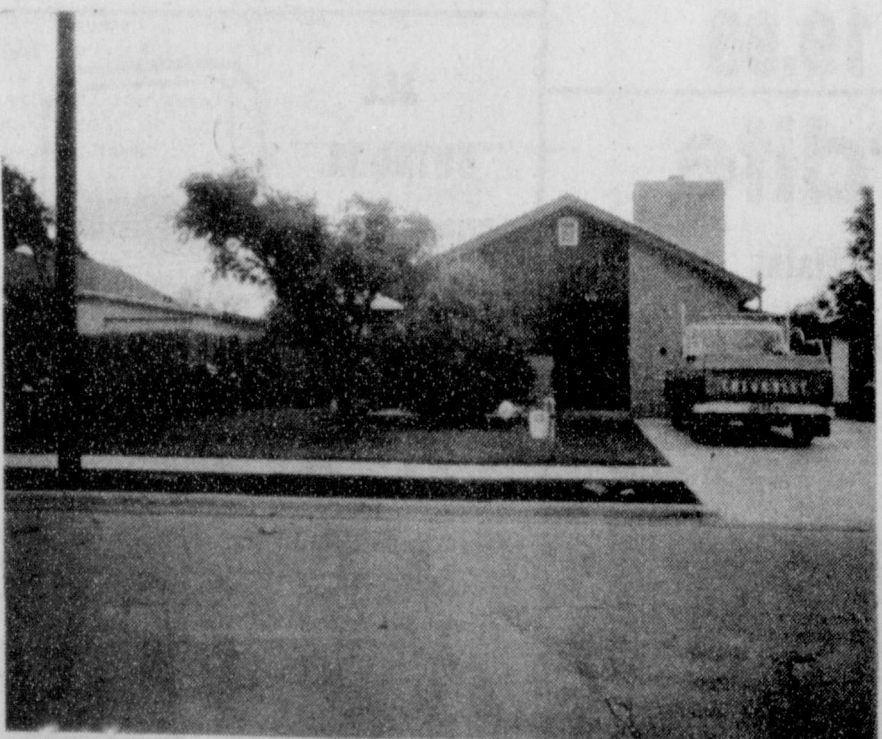
The home of Mrs. Luther Ryan, 32 N. James was the Section 1 winner in the "Put A Shine On Spearman" yards contest.



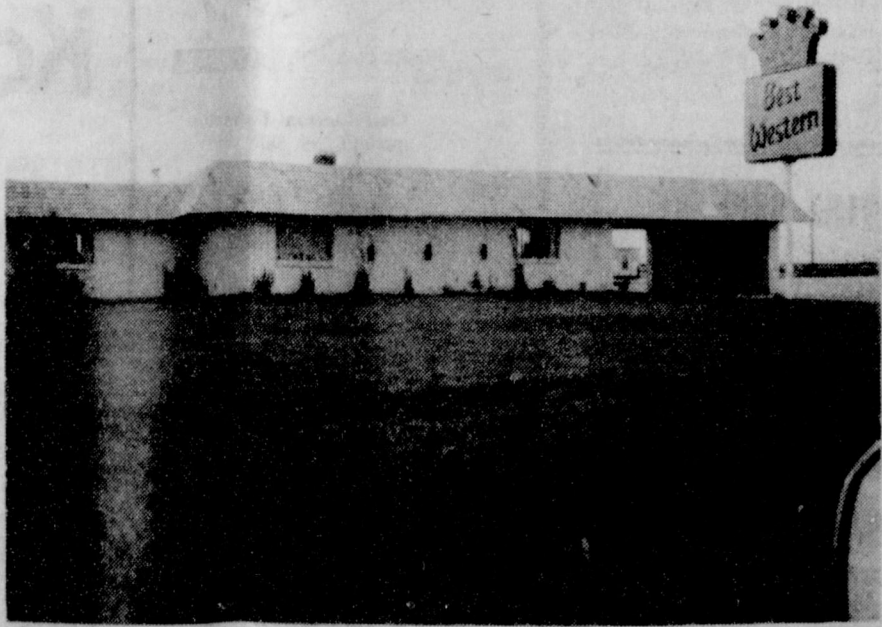
The Burl Buchanan home at 1112 Linn Drive was the Section 4 winner for July in the local "Put A Shine On Spearman" contest.

Perryton bank hosts show for local artists

The First National Bank in Perryton is sponsoring an ART SELECTION SHOW for area artists on September 1, 2, and 3. The Bank has expanded its building with a major addition and remodel, and it is seeking to purchase a number of pieces of art for the bank. The purpose of the ART SELECTION SHOW is to exhibit artwork by local and area artists so that the bank can select and purchase local art.

The Ochiltree County Art Association is participating in the show. It will coordinate the displays of the works in the exhibition. The Association was formed to promote education and appreciation of arts.

This will be an Open Show. All amateur and professional artists (including photographers) located within 100 miles of Perryton are invited to submit entries for the show. Guidelines for the event are: A person may submit up to 3 pieces of art done by himself or herself. The art should be two-dimensional wall art, such as paintings, drawings, etc. The size should not exceed 36" x 40". Any medium is acceptable, i.e. oil, watercolor, pastel, photograph, etc. It is recommended that art pieces be framed and suitable for hanging. The artist will indicate the price of his or her work on an entry card.

The artist should hand deliver the work to the First National Bank Community Room (Lower Level) by 12:00 noon on Wednesday, September 1. The selections will be made on Thursday, September 2. The exhibition will be open to the public Thursday afternoon and all day Friday. Making the selections will be Clause Heppner and Associates, Design firm from Denver, noted Colorado artist Vincent and Carolyn Tolpo, and a bank representative. Pieces selected will be purchased immediately by the bank. If an artist's work is selected, but the artist does not elect to sell the work, it may be exhibited by the bank "on loan" for a period of time, such as six months.

The theme for the ART SELECTION SHOW is: *The Southwest: Yesterday and Today*. John Cluck, President of First National Bank, commented: "We intentionally made the theme very broad. It creates a huge variety of art possibilities, from historical to contemporary scenes, from the High Plains to the seashore, from still-lives to landscapes to portraits. There could be an unlimited spectrum of good subjects. We invite artists from every town and county in this area to participate. It's the best way we know to choose art from our immediate communities that everybody can enjoy. It will be an excellent opportunity for the public to view the abundance of talent we have right here in the area."

Super Bowl XVI, the 1982 World's Fair, and Perryton all have one thing in common. They are all experiencing the spirit and enthusiasm of Up With People.

The international cast of 100 young men and women is coming to Perryton during the Wheatheart Celebration in August. They will be performing at the Perryton High School Auditorium on Saturday, August 21, at 7:00 p.m., sponsored by First National Bank.

Tickets for the performance go on sale August 2 at the Bank and at the Ochiltree Chamber of Commerce.

The energy of the Up With People show has been enjoyed by millions in 42 countries around the world. Up With People made their third Super Bowl appearance at this year's Super Bowl XVI half-time show. A special cast is appearing daily at the 1982 World's Fair in Knoxville, Tennessee.

Called a "festival in music for the whole family," the 1982 edition of Up With People has something for everyone. The talented cast and band soon involve the audience directly in the production.

Incorporated in 1968 as a non-profit, independent, international, educational program, Up With People has a two-fold purpose: to build bridges of understanding and communication among peoples, cultures and countries; and to give young people a learning experience that not only broadens the intellect, but matures the person. Each cast member, aged 18 to 26, is also a student. During the 11 months the students spend on the road, they travel an average of 35,000 miles, learning first hand of the diversity of cultures and customs around the world. In each community they visit, cast members stay with "host families" sharing in their homes, families and interests. Students may also receive college credit for independent study assignments they undertake on the road.

The Up With People cast will arrive in Perryton on Thursday, August 19. A small group of the cast members will perform as entertainment for the Wheatheart of the Nation Pageant on Friday night. The entire 100 members cast will ride in the Celebration Parade on Saturday morning, August 21. That evening, the Up With People Show will be presented at 7:00 p.m. in Perryton High School Auditorium. The Show goes for two hours. There will be both reserved seat tickets and general admission tickets. Discounts will be given to students and senior citizens. Ticket sales begin August 2.

Disaster Aid

An agricultural region covering 76 counties--involving parts of Texas, New Mexico and Oklahoma--ravaged by spring and summer storms, will be eligible for various types of disaster assistance, Secretary of Agriculture John R. Block announced July 15.

Special disaster payments and other farm program benefits for cotton, wheat and feed grain will be provided to those farmers who qualify in this region centered in the high plains of Texas.

Block said he was taking this unusual action to meet the needs created by a unique and widespread natural disaster caused by severe weather. Over the last several weeks a combination of hail, heavy rainfall, wind and cold weather has devastated crops. Earlier in the spring, drought conditions prevailed in this area until about the first of May.

Rainfall in the affected region normally averages about 19 inches per year. A series of severe storms moving through this region in recent weeks dropped 30 inches of rain in a six-week period. Excess moisture stunted plant growth, washed out crops and damaged young plants with hail.

The disaster declaration was made in Lubbock, Texas, where Block phoned the disaster approval and details to Texas Gov. William P. Clements, who was meeting with a group of farmers and agribusiness leaders in Lubbock.

"The extent of crop losses and the widespread nature of the disaster call for extraordinary measures," Block told Clements and the farmers. "Therefore, after consulting with President Reagan, I am today implementing a program of emergency assistance to provide relief to producers in this 76-county area of Texas and adjoining counties in New Mexico and Oklahoma," Block said.

Emergency conservation funds provided through the programs of USDA's Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service will be included in the disaster assistance to meet erosion and soil deterioration caused by the disaster.

The disaster assistance will be in addition to the insured benefits available to the farmers covered by USDA's Federal Crop Insurance Corporation. Insured farmers will receive full indemnities to the extent of their policy coverage. Additional insurance adjusters have been committed to the region to expedite insurance payments.

"We are making disaster assistance available in this region because our revised and expanded FCIC insurance program is still in a transitional phase. And, at this time we are not as far along as we earlier had hoped to be," Block said.

"We continue to support the principle and the mandate from Congress that the expanded crop insurance program will replace disaster payments. The heavy losses created by the storm damage in this three-state region dramatically demonstrate the necessity for farmers here, and nationwide, to take advantage of the protection offered by the Federal Crop Insurance Corporation," Block said.

Block also announced USDA's Farmers Home Administration is prepared to help farmers with emergency disaster loans in counties that meet the normal criteria for such aid.

The special disaster payments, as authorized by the Agriculture and Food Act of 1981, are as follows:

COTTON: 20.5 cents per bushel for crop losses in excess of 25 percent of the crop.

WHEAT: \$1.75 per bushel for wheat losses in excess of 40 percent of the crop.

FEED GRAINS: 15 cents per bushel for corn, 18 cents per bushel for grain sorghum, and 15 cents per bushel for barley for any losses that exceed 40 percent of those three crops.

Area-wide highway meeting set

AMARILLO--Growing needs for an adequate highway system to transport products in the Texas Panhandle will be the topic of a major area-wide meeting sponsored by the Amarillo Chamber of Commerce Highway Committee July 22.

To include state legislators, county judges, mayors, bankers, and chamber of commerce executives from the 26-county 31st State Senatorial District, the meeting will be held at 6:30 p.m., Thursday (July 22) at the Big Texan Steak Ranch in Amarillo.

At the meeting a broad appeal for Panhandle highways funding will be discussed. Additionally, a coalition of area leaders and officials will be formed to present the appeal to the State Highway and Public Transportation Commission this Autumn. State Senator Bill Sarpalius has agreed to be the Panhandle spokesman for the delegation.

In the letter inviting area leaders to Amarillo for the initial meeting, Barney Wiegand, C of C Highway Committee chairman wrote, "...the Commission is accumulating a tremendous back-log of worthwhile projects that cannot be funded in the foreseeable future, simply because there isn't enough money. The major centers of Houston, Dallas-Fort Worth and San Antonio are becoming noisier with their funding requests, which total more dollars than are available for the entire state, and also are more persuasive as they point to astronomical traffic counts and traffic delays. That is our competition for a fair share of the funds." Wiegand has tagged the highway effort "The Pitch for the Panhandle."

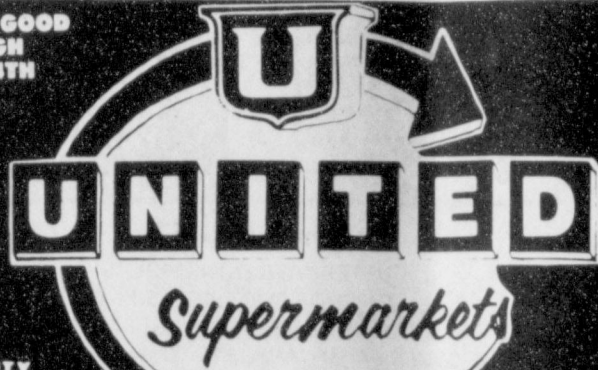

IS A COMPUTER YOUR FAMILY'S 'NEWEST MEMBER'?

Is a computer your family's "newest member"? If so, watch it! Computers and micro-processor technology continue to invade today's households. In fact, in the next 10-15 years, the home as we know it today may be completely reshaped. SECRETARY, MAID As a home appliance, the computer will act as a secretary and maid. Wired into the home's electrical system, the electronic brain can be pro-

grammed to perk coffee in the morning, heat the oven and start dinner, secure the doors--even vacuum the floors! It could even select the least expensive times to do laundry or heat water. VALUES, DIGNITY 'AT STAKE' However, while the prospects of convenience and hassle-free living sound exciting, other aspects of the computer invasion of the home require additional effort to preserve our

human values and dignity. People have a fear of computers--fear of being replaced by a machine. While computers can outperform people in some situations, the computer can only do what it's programmed to do.

We need to accept the routine or mundane tasks that computers can do, which, in turn, allows us more time to spend on exciting activities and interests. FAMILY COMMUNICATION 'AT STAKE'

As computers become a more popular appliance in households, we also face the danger of decreased communication by family members.

Families who already had limited communication before the introduction of the computer are now becoming further alienated from one another in some cases.

Interacting with a machine

and responding to the challenge of creating new functions for the machine to perform become an all-consuming task which causes some people to forget the other members of the household.

As a result, communication with anyone other than the machine becomes almost nonexistent in these cases.

LIVING WITH A COMPUTER

Awareness of the addictive nature of computer programming and interaction can prevent much of this alienation. Establishing a schedule for various family members, setting time limits for computer activities and sharing computer activities as a family are some of the ways to prevent the loss of inter-family communication.

Personal privacy remains an issue in our age of electronics. Some legislation has been passed to protect individual

privacy, more is in process and still more needs to be written. Individuals need to analyze the full impact of sharing information via electronic mail, computer information networks and electronic funds transfer.

Finally, electronics in the home offers a challenge to each family member, the challenge to learn all about this new home-management revolution and how to make it work for the benefit of each family member. It is not complicated but it does require a period of adjustment and continual experimentation to enjoy its full potential.

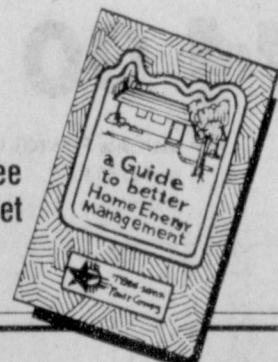

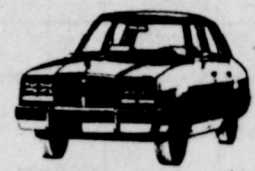

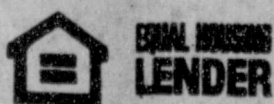
