| NOTICE OF TAX Rflief available TO CERTAIN HOMEOWNERS OVER 65 |
| :---: |
| Homeowners who were 65 years of age or older on January 1, 1979, and failed to receive their school district homestead exemptions in 1979 have until April 1 of this year to do so. In this way, elderly homeowners will be able to take advantage of the school tax freeze associated with the $\$ 10,000$ homestead exemption. <br> According to a law passed by the 67th Legislature, over-65 homeowners who were qualified for the school homestead "tax freeze" in 1979, but who did not apply for or receive their homestead exemption, may file an application with the chief appraiser of the county appraisal district in which the homestead is located. <br> Eligible over-65 homeowners in Hansford County must make application to the Hansford County Appraisal District, 13 W. Kenneth St., Spearman, Texas, before April 1, 1982. <br> To qualify for this tax relief, a homeowner must have satisfied these requirements on January 1, 1979: <br> $\star$ Been 65 years of age or older <br> $\star$ Owned his home <br> * Used that home as his residence homestead <br> The chief appraiser of the Hansford County Appraisal District will consider all applications and notify each applicant before April 15, 1982. If the application is approved, the chief appraiser will make an entry on the appropriate school district's 1982 appraisal records. <br> This entry will indicate the amount of school tax the over-65 taxpayer should have paid in 1979, had he applied for and been granted the $\$ 5,000$ general homestead exemption and the $\$ 10,000$ over- 65 homestead exemption. No refunds of taxes paid may be given for 1979, 1980 or 1981. <br> For 1982, the taxpayer's school taxes on his homestead may not exceed the amount of taxes the school district would have imposed on the homestead for 1979, had the taxpayer received his homestead exemptions. This frozen tax amount will remain the same as long as the homestead remains the same. <br> For applications contact Alice Peddy, chief appraiser at the Hansford County Appraisal District, 13 W .
