Seal Coating Project For County Road

AMARILLO .- Work in Hansford County is included in the 1983 State Highway Safety and Betterment Program recently approved by the Texas State Highway and Public Transportation Commission.

The Hansford County project involves seal coating Farm to Market Road 520 from the Sherman County line east 10 miles to State Highway 136. The program sets aside \$71,500 for this project.


The seal coating helps preserve and protect the riding surface as well as improving the skid resistance and riding quali-

District Engineer A.L. McKee said the work is part of a continuing effort to modernize and increase the safety characteristics of roads and highways which are worn out or inadequate for today's traffic.

Statewide, the program provides improvements to 3,908 miles of highways. The program includes 656 projects in 198 counties in the state.

About 61 per cent of the financing included in the program is on U.S .-- and Statenumbered highways. 37 per cent is for FM and RM roads and two per cent is held in reserve.

Made to Order might be used to describe the Adult Horsemanship Camp to be held at the W.T.S.U. Horse Center the week of June 21. A variety of horse care, management, training and Western and English riding activities have been planned for the week long workshop. Instructor Gary Marble indicates that the participants will be able to concentrate their efforts on skills they need most for their work with horses or for success in showing, training, or just enjoying horses. Some of the more unique lessons that "campers" may want to practice include loading horses into the trailer, backing trailers, catching the devious horse, etc.

A variety of techniques will be used to improve riding and

horse control skills--including video taping, both small and large group lessons, trail rides, and games on horseback that have value in improving horsemanship. Learning by doing safely will be emphasized throughout the week.

Marble indicates that Becky Simmons, native of Alanreed, Texas and a graduate of the William Woods Equistrian program in Fulton, Missouri will be assisting in all areas of instruction and is a specialist in teaching English riding and riding hunters and jumpers.

Other activities at the W.T.S.U. Horse Center include 2 Youth Horsemanship Camps and English and Western riding lessons for youth and adults all summer.




Adrian Blackburn. The clean up campaign will be from May thru September. The Clubs that do the most work will be awarded prizes as follows:
