



National manager Tom Lasorda, by the way, has never lost an All-Star game, having won two in 1978 and



Most inspectors make their daily rounds within their assigned districts, allowing them to live and work in the general area. The public benefits by the fact that, no matter where a citizen lives in the state, a TDA district office is only a few counties away.

One important qualification of the inspector is the ability to be the Department's public representative, for the field person is often the only contact citizens have with the Texas Department of Agriculture. This means always obtaining permission to perform inspection duties even though the inspections are mandated by law. It could also mean patiently explaining to a citizen that the Department does not have jurisdiction in a particular case, then guiding him to an agency which can help.

Since the inspector is, in fact, a law enforcement officer and deals face-to-face with the public every hour of his work day, it is inevitable that a few problems will occur. Take for instance, the time a service station operator threatened to assault two inspectors who asked to run accuracy tests on his motor fuel pumps. Or the Houston man who tried to punch an inspector who. refused to allow him to operate without a produce dealers license. Both cases had uneventful

endings, thanks to some quick thinking and calm action by inspectors. It is, as they say, all in a day's work. (Reprinted from the TDA Quarterly)

Research conducted following a measles outbreak in Buffalo, New York, has influenced many physicians to recommend that parents delay immunizing their children until after the infant's first birthday.

According to a recent broadcast sponsored by the Columbia-Presbyterian Medical Center and The Prudential Insurance Company, health officials in Buffalo found that the majority of the afflicted children studied had been immunized before their first birthday. Dr. Richard Judelson, Erie

County communicable disease control officer, said, "Children who receive the vaccine before 12 months of age were at a three-times greater risk of contracting measles. The ages between 13 and 14 months were gray areas. Our final conclusion, therefore, was to immunize children at 15 months of age."

Dr. Judelson explained that the blood of children less than a year old still contains measles antibodies passed on by the mother during

pregnancy.
"Most women in the United States are protected against measles," said Dr. Judelson. "Those antibodies go into the baby and stay with the infant from six to as many as 15 months. If the mother's antibodies are still present in the child, the vaccine virus is neutralized. We recommend waiting to immunize for 15 months, so those antibodies will have fully disappeared."





- 1 1/2 lb. thinly sliced beef-top sirloin, round steak, or flank steak
- 1 med. onion
- 1 green pepper 2 C. shredded green cabbage
- 2 C. shredded red cabbage
- yellow squash
- 1 zucchini squash 8 oz. mushrooms
- 1/4 C. soy sauce
- 2 T. Worcestershire sauce tsp. salt or more to taste 1/2 tsp. pepper




