### Farmers Be Careful With Your Stubble Fields

In the fall and winter when native pastures are short and dry, the stockmen are forced to supply additional forage. Supplemental feed has never been so abundant, and he instinctively holds what he has in reserve as long as possible. At this time of the year stubble and stalk fields are a most attractive source of forage and in too many cases the temptation to utilize them to the fullest degree is too strong to resist.

### Few Tenants Can Win Land Ownership Under Present Farm System.

We might not be seriously concerned with farm tenancy if it were a passing or transient condition if it were simply a stage by which the farmer reached a higher level. But tenancy as it exists in Texas and Oklahoma tends to be a permanent stratification in which the greater part of our farmers are permanently imbedded.

### CONTINUED RAIN PLACES CROPS IN GOOD CONDITION

With continued cloudy weather and local showers all over the county, wheat producers of this section enter the Fall growing season with more than a normal rainfall for a year during the first nine months, namely January thru Sept. Records of U. S. Weather Observer F. W. Brandt show that Hansford county has received a total of 21.08 inches of moisture this year thru the month of September. This record in comparison with those of the past drouth years is outstanding, and indicates that wheat in this sec. will get a healthy start for the 1937 harvest.

International Sunday School Lesson

Becoming a Christian  
Scripture Lesson: — Acts 16: 22-34.

Time A. D. 50

1. And the multitude rose up about them together and the magistrates rent their garments against them, and commanded to beat them with rods.

2. And when they had laid many stripes upon them, they cast them into prison, charging the jailer to keep them safely.

3. Who, received such a casting them into the inner prison, and made their feet fast with stocks.

4. But about midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing psalms unto God, and the prisoners were listening to them.

5. And suddenly there was a great earthquake, so that the foundations of the prison-house were shaken; and immediately all doors were open, and every man's bands were loosed.

6. And the jailer being roused out of sleep and seeing the prison doors open, drew his sword, and was about to kill himself, supposing that the prisoners had broken the wall, and were fled.

7. But Paul cried with a loud voice, saying, Do thyself no harm: for we are all here.

8. And he called lights and came in, and trembling for fear of Paul and Silas, he brought them out, and said, Sirs, what must I do to be saved?

9. And they cried, Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ and thou shalt be saved. Thou and thy house.

10. And he took them the same hour of the night and washed their stripes and was baptized with all his immediately.

11. And he brought them up into his house, and set food before them and rejoiced greatly with all his house, having believed in God.

INTRODUCTION

It is very significant that in the two principal events that Luke recorded of Paul's first visit to the Philippi of the Christian church there, women were prominent: one devout eager to hear the word of God; the other possessed with a spirit of devotion a pagan who certainly knew nothing of the Lord Jesus Christ, and probably nothing of the true God. The heathen inhabitants of Philippi regarded the woman as inspired by Apollo. The strange thing about this woman was that she continued to follow Paul and Silas, crying out that they were servants to the Most High God, who proclaimed unto you the way of salvation. It is very significant that the demons in the time of Jesus spoke of Christians as the sons of the Most High God.

The Demon Possessed Woman Healed

This woman however had become profitable for men who wickedly took advantage of her tragic state of demon possession. The man thing with them was the money she brought in, not her

life or her happiness. The first thought in the minds of brewers and distillers who dispense these things that wreck bodies of men, is not the eternal souls which they are condemning, but the gold which flows to them from such a diabolical business. Through this woman's deliverance there gain was gone, and they dragged Paul and Silas into the market place before the rulers, i. e. the chief governing power in his Roman colony. The word translated magistrates in V. 20 refers probably to the same groups. This pose of patriotism is all sound and fury. It is love of money that moves these masters far more than zeal for Rome.

Paul And Silas Beaten

And the multitude rose up together against them and the magistrates rent their garments off them, and commanded to beat them with rods. Paul later refers to three beatings with rods which he had suffered for the gospel's sake. This, however, is the only one to which we have definite reference. It is undoubtedly that to which he referred in the First Epistle to Thessalonians. And when they had laid many stripes upon them they cast them into prison, charging the jailer to keep them safely. Who having received such an order cast them into the inner prison. An inner prison had no window or outlet except a door leading into the outer prison, which when closed absolutely shut out light and air. The utter darkness the heat the stench of such a miserable place is often dwelt upon by later martyrs.

The Revival in The Prison At Philippi

V. 25 But about midnight Paul and Silas were praying and sing-

ing hymns unto God. Many times before this had the pailer imprisoned men in this dark hole, but these men were distinguished from all he had ever had under his charge; for, instead of groaning and mumbling in their pain and fear, Paul and Silas were heard talk to God singing hymns unto Him. This is surely what Job meant when he spoke of songs in the night. They sang together because they were counting it all joy to suffer in the name of Christ, because they knew God was on their side, because they knew nothing that man could do would take away their eternal hope. And he called for lights and sprang in and trembling with fear fell down before Paul and Silas. He then took them out of the jail and said, Sirs, what must I do to be saved?

The Way Of Salvation

And they said Believe on the Lord Jesus and thou shalt be saved, thou and thy house. Paul knew the answer to this question at once. In fact, he knew it better than anything else in the world. It was the one question that he longed to hear and have men ask him. To believe in Christ is not simply to believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God. Many believe thus and are not saved. To believe is not an emotional experience. It is an act of human will, of the soul of man; it is first decision; I will trust him. It is secondly obedience; I will obey.

Paul Claims The Privilege Of His Roman Citizenship

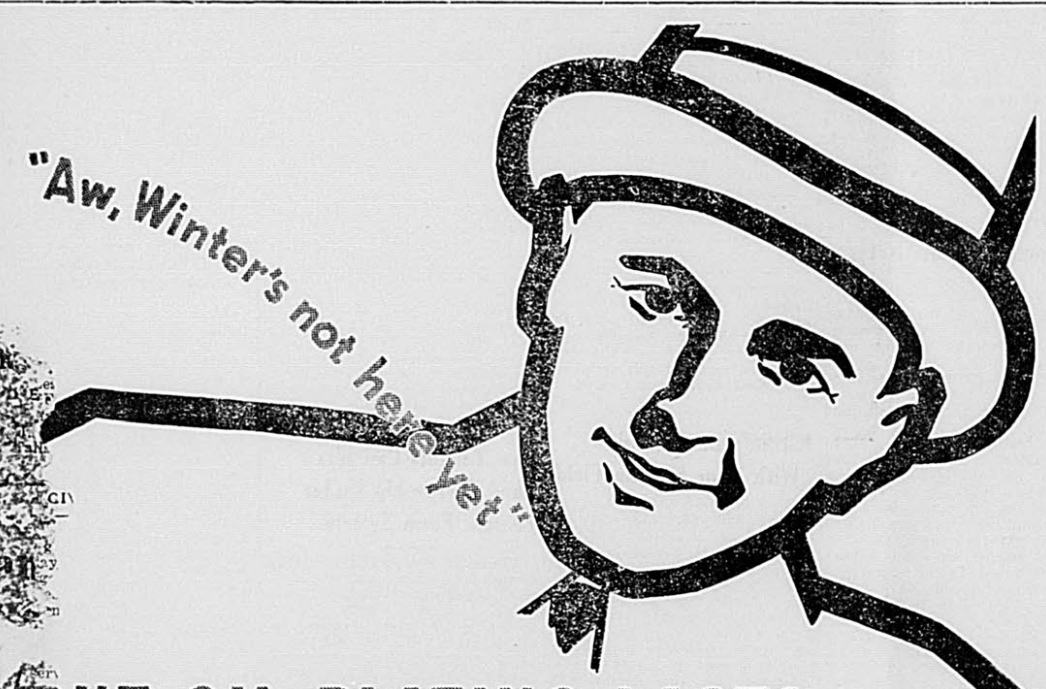

In the mind of the writer, such an occasion happened the past week when John McCarty of the Amarillo News-Globe, and countless other newspaper men over the state emphatically opposed the suggestion of Gov. Allred in ransferring funds from the highway to the Old Age Pension Fund.

Without a doubt the transfer would have been made and could have been made without crippling the high-  
way construction program of the state. Funds thus transferred would have been replaced just as soon as the revenue from taxes for old age pension could be collected.

As matters turn out, the state stand a chance of losing some of the Federal appropriations . . . since the state must have cash on hand to match every dollar of the Federal help. There is a brief period between the source of revenue for old age pensions and the present administration of the law. In other words there is no cash on hand at the present time to meet the needs of the pension fund.
