There is not a closed trust on the season whereby the government cooperates with blooded landowners to post their land and charge a large fee for hunting. Just why the season was opened in Roberts county this writer does not know. So far as the average man is concerned the land owners along the Canadian can brand their deer and keep them for decorations, or he can fatten them up and eat them every other day. ### CERTIFICATE OF MERIT AWARDED REPORTER

The Spearman Reporter management in receipt of a certificate of merit, issued by the department of public safety. The certificate cites the fact that this newspaper contributed to traffic safety for the year 1938 by publishing news stories calculated to educate the drivers of this county.

In presenting the certificate a representative of the department of public safety informed this writer that records showed in 108 deaths occurred in traffic accidents in the 30 counties of the northern district of Texas in 1937. The record showed only 68 deaths in traffic accidents in 1938 and only 36 such deaths in 1939 to date.
