This pump works ordinarily at the rate of seventy gallons a minute, but was speeded up to the rate of one hun-dred gallons a minute for this test. This increase of speed did not phase the supply of water in the least and the amount of water seems inexhaustible. A Case tractor was also used in making the test.

The City of Spearman now has three wells, the water from the three being pumped into a big gistern and then carried into the standpipe by the means of a booster pumps, at the new well a building has been constructed in which will be the office of the city water superintendent, Delon Kirk.

Quite a lot of loose talk and writng is being done in connection with the national problem of flood control, particularly with respect to the establishment of reservoirs to regulate the flow of flood waters.

The most deceptive suggestion or the subject, which has been given wide publicity, is that these proposed reservoirs would furnish great power possibilities, and also aid navi-

Now, anyone who reflects on the problem should be able to understand, reservoirs for flood control would have to be kept practically emptysduring normal times, in order that they might collect and hold surplus water when floods come Empty reservoirs do not aid navigation, neither do they furnish power. The interests of flood control and power development directly clash under the reservoir plan.

While considerable secondary power might be developed by the reservoir system, it seems doubtful that it would justify the investment necssary to handle it.





Any farm financing system having for its aim the relief, or promotion, f agriculture must be based upon ong time credit and the security for rach long time credit is farm land. The best security, and the security upon which the greatest amount of redit can be issued, is farm lands that are protected from erosion by terraces; and have been built or maintained in a high state of fertilong time loans, because the collatis financial obligations increases from year to year.


