### CITATION BY PUBLICATION

The State of Texas. To the Sheriff or any Constable of Hansford County.—Greeting:

You are commanded to summon G. W. Bledsoe, whose residence is unknown, to appear at the regular term of District Court of Hansford County, Texas, to be held at the courthouse in Hansford, Texas, on the Third Monday in November, 1922, being November 29th, 1922, then and there to answer a petition work in said court on June 14th, 1922, in a suit numbered 253 on the docket thereof, wherein Addie Bledsoe is plaintiff and G. W. Bledsoe is defendant, the cause of action being as follows:

Plaintiff alleges that she and defendant were legally married in Dallas, Texas, on March 19th, 1919. That at said time plaintiff had a home and considerable other property. That defendant soon squandered her money and property and she lost her home. That soon afterwards defendant began a course of unkind, harsh, cruel and brutal treatment toward plaintiff, and often cursed, abused and mistreated plaintiff. At one time at the Taylor Rooming House in Spearman during winter of 1921-22, he beat and abused plaintiff, and struck her, called her such names as whore and bitch and caused her to stay out late and having improper relations with other men, which charges were false. That plaintiff was forced to work in restaurants late at night to make a living for herself and children. That his conduct has been such as to prevent her from being respectable. She asks for the custody of her two girls, aged 19 and 12, respectively.

You are further commanded to summon such defendant, and to serve this citation once in each week for four consecutive weeks, previous to the return day hereof, in some newspaper published in your county, if there be a newspaper published therein, but if not, then in the nearest county where a newspaper is published.

L. Wallin is plaintiff and Benjie Lee Wallin is defendant, said petition alleging that plaintiff and defendant, were legally married at Quanah, Texas, September 21st, 1919, and that during all of the time that he lived with defendant he was kind and affectionate to her and always provided for her support and maintenance, but that defendant, forgetful of her duties and obligations under their marriage vow, during the year 1921, began a course of unkind, harsh, cruel and tyrannical treatment toward plaintiff, which continued until they finally separated in about the latter part of the year 1920. That defendant often cursed and abused plaintiff and applied to him the vilest and most opprobrious epithets without any cause or provocation whatever on his part. That on or about August 15th, 1917, at their home she shared and cohabited with plaintiff and called him a son of a bitch, a low down son of a bitch, and a whore monger, and was guilty of such violent and outrageous conduct toward this plaintiff, that it

order to get away from her quarreling and abuse he was forced to leave the house and was lying down near a shed or barn and she slipped upon him and threw a large rock, weighing several pounds, down on his back to his great pain. That at another time about the latter part of 1920 in the month of December, at their home in Kirkland, Texas, she quarreled and abused plaintiff violently and grabbed him around the neck and tried to choke him and called him names and accused him of going with another woman, which charges were false, and this was done in the presence of another man, a neighbor, that defendant used violent and abusive language toward this plaintiff and exhibited violent and unbearable conduct toward plaintiff not only once, but at many and various times. That in her conduct toward plaintiff she displayed a violent temper and an insane jealousy of plaintiff. That she would accuse plaintiff of committing adultery with other women, of which plaintiff was entirely innocent.

Plaintiff further alleges that defendant was guilty of improper conduct toward other man, he shows that during the year 1917, she began keeping company with another man by the name of Virgil Hacker, who was a soldier in camp. That she corresponded with this man, and from some letters that were discovered she was engaged to this man, and had agreed to run off and leave this plaintiff and marry him. That

she would give this money which plaintiff live on. Plaintiff during the year 1918, defendant entered suit against him for a divorce, but that she reported and he consented to an agreement that he would do better. Plaintiff shows that of this relation still exists between them. Plaintiff further shows that of this marriage there was born one child, a girl, now twelve years old, named Ruby Lois. That said child has been living with him for some time past, and that he was able and willing to properly educate and maintain her, but that said defendant is not a proper person to take care of said child, and that she is not able to properly do so and has shown no desire to take care of her. Wherefore he prays that he have the custody of said child.

Plaintiff shows that the conduct of the defendant is such as above set out as to render their further living together as husband and wife entirely insupportable.

Herein fail not, but have before said court on the said first day of the next term thereof, this writ with your return thereon, showing how you have executed the same.
