### FINE HOGS

J. A. Meade, secretary and manager of Texas County Breeder's Association and himself a breeder of registered Duroc Jersey hogs, spent Wednesday in the city, being enroute to his farm on the Frisco from Beaver county, where he attended Slocum's annual bred sow sale. Mr. Meade made some purchases at this sale of which he is justly proud, among them being Miss O. U. King, carrying the blood of two national grand champions, with a litter of six gilts and five boar pigs at her side, out of National Sensation, the pick of a champion litter at last year's National Swine Show. These pigs have the blood of three national grand champions. Mr. Meade says this sow and litter of pigs cost him a goodly sum of money but it would take still more to buy them now. Another purchase was Miss Dream Stiltz and her litter mate Miss Dream Stiltz 2nd. Mr. Meade expects to show these two sows at the Texas County Free Fair this coming fall. Another purchase was Princess Cherry Dream 6th and five other bred sows and gilts. Mr. Meade says that to obtain these wonderful hogs he was

compelled to outbid one breeder from Utah, one from Kansas and still another from Oklahoma City, but he has them and is putting them on his Frisco farm. Meade is making a great success in the hog business and his advice to beginners is to start right. He says the best in none too good for this country and even if many people do not fully appreciate the thoroughbred stuff at present, they will later on. He says he has seen farmers laugh at a neighbor for spending a goodly sum for one good sow, but when the sow's pigs sold for twice or three times what the average pig would bring, the laugh would be on the other fellow, who would come around, sooner or later and himself buy registered stuff. There is money in hogs and the better the hog the more money is made.

### Has Good Hogs

In looking over the catalogue of the Texas County Breeder's Association we find that our gentral sheriff, H. L. Wilbanks, is owner of a much finer and more noted Duroc Jersey boar than we at first supposed. This pig is out of Prince Orion and his dam is Lady Mary; he has lots of type, with good, straight sides, strong legs and a well arched back, and those are the things that the big hog men are breeding for. This is a wonderful boar and we are glad Mr. Wilbanks brought him into the Spearman country.

## Daddy's Evening Fairy Tale

### BRAVE PIGEONS

"It is not boasting," said Mr. Homing Pigeon, "where I speak of the great work my father and grandfather and others of my family did.

"But to think that one's relatives have saved thousands of lives.

"The old Jaguar boasts of the creatures he can kill. He boasts of his strength.

"But the Homing Pigeon boasts of his wisdom which he thinks is better than strength.

"And he boasts of his power and willingness and eagerness to save lives.

"To be sure, my family wouldn't like it if they heard me say that they boasted of such things, for such is not the case.

"But I should say that we must always live up to the wonderful ideal of saving lives whenever we can.

"Now an ideal is a very lofty or noble or splendid purpose. Our ideal is to save lives. We think lives are important and valuable and wonderful, and that when we save lives we make happiness where otherwise there would be unhappiness.

"So every little homing pigeon is brought up with the idea of doing as much as is possible to help people.

"We are happy among ourselves. One of us may be the leader, but that

doesn't mean that that one will be cross and conceited and proud.

"It merely means that that one wants to be careful to lead the others in doing the work they should do.

"Of course we are also called carrier pigeons because we carry messages. That is a sensible and suitable name for us.

"We go off in pairs very often to do our work.

"Some of the family now live in parks, some belong to certain people, and others are being looked after for the rest of their lives.

"We're all well looked after, but when I say that some of us are being looked after for the rest of our lives, I am speaking of those of my relations who did a lot of work in saving the lives of brave soldiers and who never minded how much work they did, and who never minded how tired they got.

"Some of them worked so very hard that they really shouldn't do any more work. They should take a long rest, and so they are doing this.

"And they are being helped in taking this rest by people who are looking after them and seeing that they will be cared for, without any more work being done by themselves.

"It is right that they should rest, for they have worked so hard. But it was right that they should work, for the homing pigeons believe in doing good work in their lifetime.

"But oh, forgive me, if I say too much about the way my father and grandfather and others of my family did in saving lives.

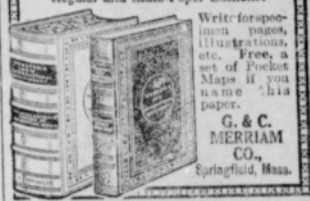

H. King is plaintiff and Walter McKean and Hume McKean are defendants, said petition alleging that on the first day of March, A. 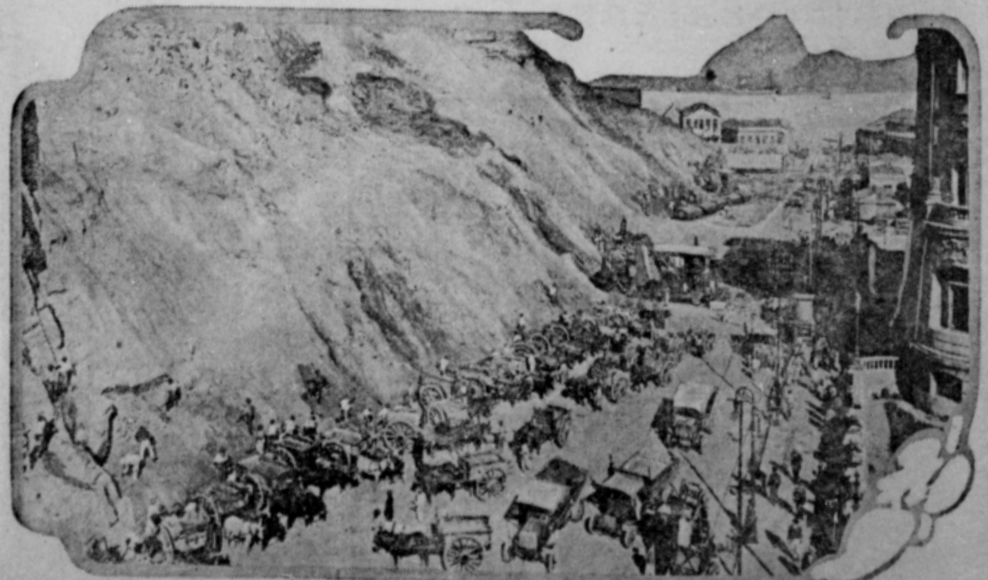
