### HANSFORD COUNTY FREE FROM TUBERCULOSIS

Moore & Parsons, real estate dealers and prominent business men of Woodward, Oklahoma, were in Spearman Thursday, visiting with J. R. Collard and looking after business matters. These gentlemen are boosting Woodward's efforts to entice the federal government to locate a tubercular sanitarium at that town and in so doing they present some facts and figures not generally known to the public. For instance, in 1897 a body of eminent French surgeons were sent by their government to America to find if possible a suitable location for the treatment of tuberculosis. The following is a statement that has been taken from the report made to the French government: "In the United States of North America on the 100 degrees of longitude west of Greenwich we found an area the like of which does not exist in the world. From a central point on the said 100 degree midway between the Arkansas River in Kansas and the Red River in Texas, a circle drawn with that point as the center with a radius of 100 miles will contain an area within which Tubercle Bacilla does not and cannot exist." Refer to your map any you will find that Hansford county is embraced within this circle, and do you remember of ever having known a native Hansford county cow being afflicted with tuberculosis. These men claim that with the big government sanitarium, it is possible to cure any case of consumption and that tuberculosis in animals will always remain practically unknown anyway, due to this country's peculiar climatic conditions. This matter only bears out the Reporter's claim that the Spearman country is the finest dairying country in the land.

Messrs. Moore & Parsons will meet with the Chamber of Commerce today to discuss the matter referred to above as an advertising feature, and the Reporter will have more to say on the subject from week to week.

Ben Holt, of the Holt community in north Hutchinson county, and one of the most successful farmers in the southwest, was in the city Tuesday and purchased a Fordson tractor while here. The Fordson, like the Jitney, is gradually becoming an absolute necessity.

M. J. Koontz is driving a brand new Four-Ninety Chevrolet which he recently purchased through the Spearman agents, Mizar & Bryan. The price of the Four-Ninety recently took a good, healthy decline, which makes this popular little car still more popular.

Mr. and Mrs. C. W. King have given up their lease on the Lone Star hotel and will retire from business on August 1. They are advertising the hotel fixtures for sale at auction, the sale to take place tomorrow, Saturday. Mr. and Mrs. King have conducted the hotel in a commendable manner and were building up a splendid business, but on account of help being so scarce and unreliable, they have decided to move back to their home. Henry Crawford has leased the building and will take charge of the same on August 1. Mr. and Mrs. Crawford, with their daughter and other help, will conduct a first class hotel. They know the business from a to z; have had years of experience, and we predict for them much success in their new location. They have for the past several months conducted the Royal Cafe.

### THE PRICE OF WHEAT AND THE FREIGHT RATES

We hear of some complaint among the farmers about the wheat buyers of Spearman not paying as much for wheat as the buyers of Texhoma, Guymon and other points. The Reporter believes the Spearman buyers are paying as much and in many cases more than any buyers in the country, and that it is the difference in freight rates that makes the difference in the price received by the farmer for his wheat. We have secured the following data on freight rates which may be of interest: The rate from Spearman to Galveston is 51½ cents per hundred, or 30 9-10 cents per bushel. The rates from Texhoma to Galveston is 40½ cents per hundred or 24 3-10 cents per bushel. Spearman pays 6 6-10 cents per bushel more freight than Texhoma pays. On Wednesday of this week Texhoma paid \$1.00 per bushel for wheat and Spearman paid 93 cents. Add the difference in the freight to the Spearman buyers price and note the difference. There is no difference, or at least it is so small it cannot be considered a difference. The next day Spearman, perhaps, had a shade the better of the argument, and so it goes. Farmers who sell their wheat at Spearman are getting every cent the market will allow.

The car shortage bugaboo has appeared again, also, and some few farmers are placing individual orders for cars. This practice works a hardship on everyone who is connected in any way with the shipment of grain from this point and does not benefit the farmer in any way. After all expenses are paid, he has received no more for his grain than he could have sold for at the elevators in Spearman, but he has lessened the chances of getting cars for other men.

The safest and best way to market your grain is to bring it to the Spearman elevators. Spearman grain men are doing all in their power to build up a wheat market here and they are paying all the grain is worth and extending every other courtesy consistent with sound business principles.

They report the recent sale of a Baby Grand and a Four-Ninety Chevrolet, besides several Wallis tractors. The Chevrolet is a popular low-priced car and a good seller.

The Standard Chautauqua Company closed their five day program here on Wednesday night. The performances were all very good and were highly appreciated and enjoyed by those who attended regularly. Mr. Justice, the manager, is a splendid young man and worked day and night to keep everything in tip top shape, that Spearman folks may get full benefit of their Chautauqua. He is an exceptionally good manager and made many friends in Spearman. It was thought best not to contract for a Chautauqua for next season, the business men of the town being too busy at this time to give the matter attention.

### Cotton a Curiosity

A bale of cotton on the streets of Spearman last Tuesday attracted as much attention as would an elephant or the wild man from Borneo. The town was full of harvest hands and it was interesting to listen to the different remarks made by the crowd. The boys from the south would say, "Well, I'll be darned," "Hello stranger," etc., while the fellows from northern Kansas, Iowa, the Dakotas—they're here from everywhere—would pull something like "Say, stranger, is that real cotton?" "Has it been ginned?" The bale was shipped here by H. T. Gilliam, a prosperous farmer of eight miles east of town, who says he wanted it as sort of an ornament or curiosity, and later may have it made into quilts and mattresses. Mr. Gilliam, like hundreds of others, came to this country to get out of a cotton country. He owns a fine farm east of Spearman, but it won't grow cotton. And Mr. Gilliam is glad that cotton will not grow on his farm. He says he has lived on the plains 21 years and expects to be here 21 years hence, but he never expects to produce a boll of cotton. ### FACING THE MUSIC.

JUST when or under what circumstances the expression "facing the music," originated is, so far as I know, unrelated history, but one thing is certain, it is one of the most expressive of the many pungent Americanisms that a nation apt in coloring phrases has originated.

I suspect that it had some sort of a military application in the beginning, that it meant that a soldier should always face the front where the band was playing and where the action was going on.

There are, as I understand it, only two explanations for a soldier being shot in the back.

One is that one of his own men, too excited to take proper aim, wounded him unintentionally. The other is that he had his back to the enemy and was running away.

The fellow that is facing the music never gets hit in the back.

That is just as true off the field of battle as it is on it. And it proves

that there is only one way to fight and that is facing the foe squarely.

You never can evade REAL trouble. You may defeat it. You may overcome what seems insuperable. But to do that you have to FIGHT it, not FEAR it.

And the best way to battle anything is to face it squarely, fight it fairly.

If you ever saw two boxers in the ring and one of them fought with the side of his body towards the other, you will have noticed perhaps that the man who fought sideways never landed a blow with the hand that was farthest from his opponent.

If he tried to strike with it his competitor knew long enough in advance to thoroughly guard himself against its effects.

The well-trained boxer faces the music. He stands squarely in front of his adversary where either hand will have to travel the shortest possible distance to land.

The man who turns away from trouble, who thinks to escape it by avoidance, who doesn't face it bravely and manfully indicates a lack of courage and an absence of judgment.

Nothing will give your adversary more encouragement than the evidence which you may display of a desire to quit.

Many a man has won a fight after he has lost it simply because his opponent gave up when he was not defeated.

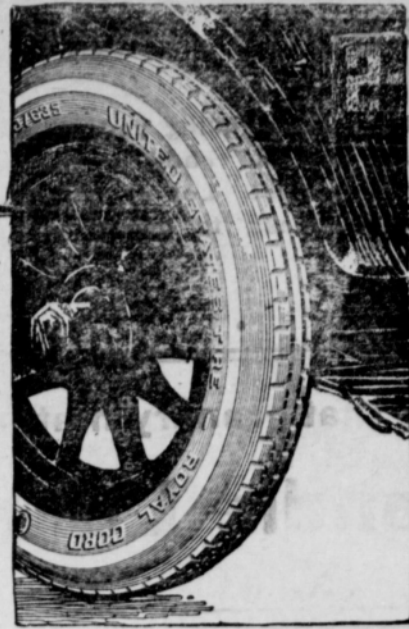
