"DELICIOUS SHUDDERS"

One of the immortal characters of literature is the Fat Boy in Dicken's "Pickwick Papers" whose aim in life was to make folks' "flesh creep." We think that some of the Fat Boy's lineal descendants must have emigrated to America, where they increased and multiplied. So many different people seem to be engaged in the effort to make our flesh creep with their dire predictions of catastrophe and horror.

The only trouble with these calamity howlers is that they do not disclose the facts upon which their jeremiads are based. We hear, for example, a great deal about the "Red Menace," but nobody has told us just what that is. Where are the Communists who are going to overthrow the Government of the United States by force? Who are they? The Communist Party is one of the recognized political parties of this country, having an official place on the ballot in practically every State. At the Presidential election of 1932, when all the circumstances were calculated to encourage every element which wanted a change in the Government, the Communist candidate for the Presidency, William Z. Foster, received fewer than 90,000 votes. As compared with the 38 million votes that were cast, that does not look like much of a menace. Norman Thomas, the Socialist candidate, polled nearly ten times as many votes.

Our observation of Communists is that they take it out in talk, which is their indisputable right. And if they can muster enough votes to control the Government of the United States, that is also their indisputable right, the same right that Democrats and Republicans have. It seems to us rather silly to try to prevent anybody from talking, in a nation dedicated to the principle of free speech. Every effort at suppression of that liberty makes martyrs out of the ones suppressed and aids, rather than hampers, their cause.

We have no fear that the people of the United States will turn Communist, at least in our time. But a lot of people get a great deal of satisfaction, in the nature of what Wallace Irwin's Japanese Schoolboy used to term "delicious shudders" over the thought of such a calamity.






