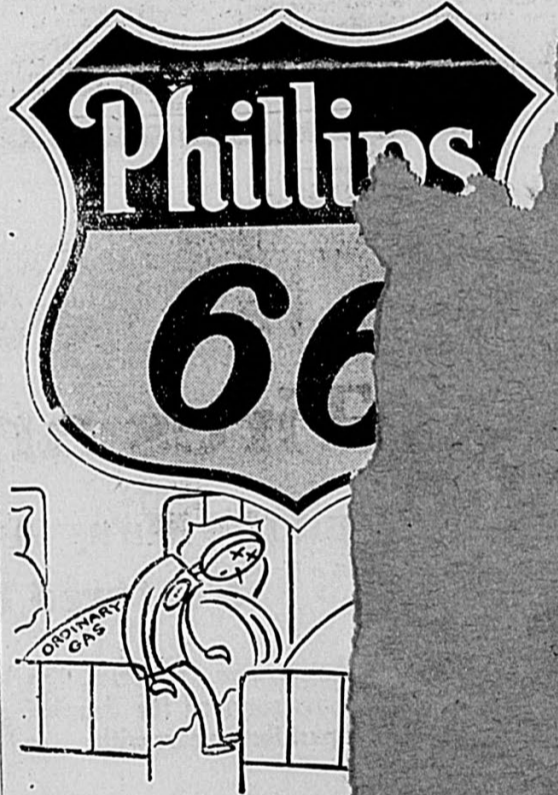
### LEGAL

State of Texas, County of Hansford.

Notice is hereby given that the Commissioners Court of Hansford County, Texas, at the February Term of the Commissioners Court, which will be held on the 13th day of February, A. D. 1933, at the Court House in Spearman, Texas, will receive bids from any banking corporation, association, or individual banker in Hansford County, Texas, that may desire to be selected as the depository of the funds of Hansford County, Texas.

Any banking corporation, association, or individual banker in such county desiring to bid, shall deliver to the county judge, on or before the first day of term of the Commissioners Court at which the selection of a depository is to be made, a sealed proposal stating the rate of interest offered on the funds of the county for the term between the date of such bid and the next regular time for the selection of a depository. Said bid shall be accompanied by a certified check for not less than one half of one per cent of the county revenue of the preceding year as a guarantee of good faith on the part of the bidder, and that, if his bid is accepted, he will enter into the bond provided by law. Upon the failure of the banking corporation, association or individual banker in such county that may be selected as such depository, to give the bond required by law, the amount of such certified check shall go to the county as liquidated damages, and the county judge shall readvertise for bids.

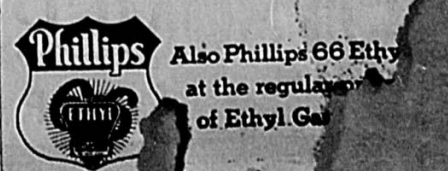
