| *****"******* <br> Social <br> "One of the most productive benefits paid by social Security is the monthly benefit paid to students be-l tween the ages of $18-22$ because of the retirement, disability, or death of the parent," Howard L. Weatherly, manager of the Pampa Social Security office stated. "In this age of ever increasing costs for education, these monthly benefits enable many students to continue their schooling." Mr. Weatherly continued. <br> However, even with this help, many students must work to finish paying for their education, and th's fact serves to remind us that some students who draw social security will need to report their work to their social security office. Students can work and earn $\$ 2520$ in 1975 without it affecting their monthly benefits. This is an increase over the $\mathbf{3 2 4 0 0}$ persons were allowed to make in 1974. If the beneficiary earns over $\$ 2520$, then $\$ 1$ of their social security student benefit must be witheld for every $\$ 2$ earned over the $\$ 2520 \mathrm{lim}$ it. However, even if the student makes over $\$ 2520$, he will still get his full social security check for any month that he does not earn wages of over $\$ 210$ and is not performing substantial services in self-employ- | ment.
