## ENDORSE THE ADMINISTRATION

Texas endorsed the Wilson administration at the county conventions held throughout the state on Tuesday, May 4th. The Bailey forces were snowed under completely. This means that the 40 delegates to be elected at Dallas on the 24th inst. to attend the national convention at San Francisco will be rock-ribbed Wilson supporters. It begins to look more and more like President Wilson will be able to name the nominee at San Francisco. The administration forces are gaining ground every day, which means that Wm. G. McAdoo is gaining ground every day. McAdoo is the president's son-in-law. In the county convention held at the court house in Hansford Tuesday, a strong resolution endorsing the administration was adopted and A. F. Barkley was chosen as delegate to the state convention. Mr. Barkley informs the Reporter that he intends to be on hand at Dallas and intends to see to it that Hansford county is represented at one state convention. This is as it should be. The border counties of north and west Texas have never taken the interest in state politics that they should. They know more Oklahoma, Kansas and New Mexico politics than Texas politics. That is why scheming politicians have been able to run things to suit themselves in the past. But this year the entire state seems to have arose as one man, and the noise it made means the political death of Joseph Weldon Bailey, once the greatest senator of the Southland. Another non-progressive who is traveling toward political oblivion at a rapid rate is James E. Ferguson, candidate for president on the "American party" ticket. Bailey and Ferguson failed to see the penmanship on the ceiling. They did not "look up." Except ye be progressive ye cannot in nowise enter into a state office in Texas.

## BIG JO SELLS TO METZ

The Big Jo Lumber company this week sold their stock of lumber, buildings, sheds, etc., in Spearman to the Metz Lumber company of Wichita. The Metz company owns the Resident Lumber company at Spearman. The two yards will be combined and under the management of L. D. Coate will continue business under the name of the Spearman Lumber company. W. T. Bratton, who had charge of the Big Jo yard at this place, has returned to his former home at Guymon, where he has the appointment of postmaster. He is a splendid citizen and his many friends here regret that he did not decide to make this his permanent home. Mr. Coate is making arrangements to bring his wife here from Texhoma and become a full-fledged citizen of Spearman. This leaves only three lumber yards in our town, but they are whoppers. The Resident bought the Big Jo, the Panhandle bought Summers-Hood and the White House bought Bolin-Hall. The stock with which the six yards were opened in Spearman is here, except that which has been sold at retail, so if you contemplate building you can very likely find the material and make satisfactory arrangements at Spearman. Louie Coate is a lumber man from who-laid-the-chunk and an energetic young fellow, and with the enormous stock recently acquired through this last deal, will be in position to attend to the wants of his customers without hesitancy. Chester A. Nash, manager of the Big Jo yard at Guymon, came down Monday to assist Mr. Bratton in closing up the company's business at this place.

On Friday, April 30, they went to Hooker and defeated the crack team of that Oklahoma metropolis by a decisive score, and on Sunday, May 2, met the Perryton team on the home grounds and defeated them so badly we will not publish the score. Spearman's new battery, Rosson and Thurman, worked in the last game and delivered the goods in a satisfactory manner. It is to be hoped that these young fellows will make their home in Spearman. The ball team needs their services. With Hays and Rosson on the pitching staff and Thurman and McSpadden on the receiving end, Spearman has a ball team that will make the neighboring towns sit up and take notice. And, best of all, the town is not paying out a great sum of money each month for salaried ball players. Manager Buey plays home boys and believes that is the only way to build up a really strong base ball machine. The team went to Texhoma yesterday and were defeated by a two to five score.

The Colts will play Booker here on Sunday, May 9, and Whitedeer will be here on Sunday, May 16. A game was matched with Perryton to be played at Perryton on Wednesday, but for some reason did not materialize. The Perryton team evidently endeavored to find a little easier game, and matched one with Booker. A large number of Spearman folks intended to go to Perryton Wednesday to witness the ball game and air flights, but when the ball game was called off many of them decided to remain at home.

## A GOOD WORD FOR THE "MONROE" CAR

In a letter recently received from his brother-in-law, H. E. Wilcox of Bentonville, Arkansas, by Tom Burgess, the writer has the following compliment for the "Monroe," the new car which Buster Cator and J. E. Morrison are selling in this territory: "Where did Buster Cator buy his 'Monroe,' and has he got the agency for that territory. About twenty men, several of them accompanied by their wives, came from Erick, Oklahoma, to look over the county with a view to purchasing land. These men were attracted to this community by the recent purchases of Rossen and Rogers and what they have to say of the prospects here. They were a substantial appearing bunch of citizens and will be worth much to the community in which they decide to locate. J. R. Collard and assistants have them in charge, have closed several deals and expect to close several more within a short time.

#### NOTICE

**To Owners of Dogs in Hansford County, Texas.**

WHEREAS, it has come to the notice of the Health Officer of Hansford county, Texas, that there has been running at large within the borders of Hansford county, dogs supposed to be afflicted with hydrophobia, and whereas said dogs have been known to have been fighting with other dogs in the county and also fighting and biting stock, and whereas said dogs have also bitten one or more of the citizens of Hansford county; it is therefore deemed necessary to the public health of the citizens of Hansford county and the public at large that all dogs be restrained, or muzzled, to prevent further endangering the lives and health of our citizens

Therefore, I, J. H. HANEY, Public Health officer of Hansford county, do hereby issue the following order:

"That all dogs in Hansford county be restrained from running at large unless said dogs are properly and securely muzzled in such a manner as to prevent the possibility of their biting either persons or stock, and in the event that any dogs are found running at large without the restraining measures above stated, the sheriff is hereby authorized to kill said dogs so running at large.

This order is to remain in force and effect until such time as it is deemed advisable by me to rescind said order.

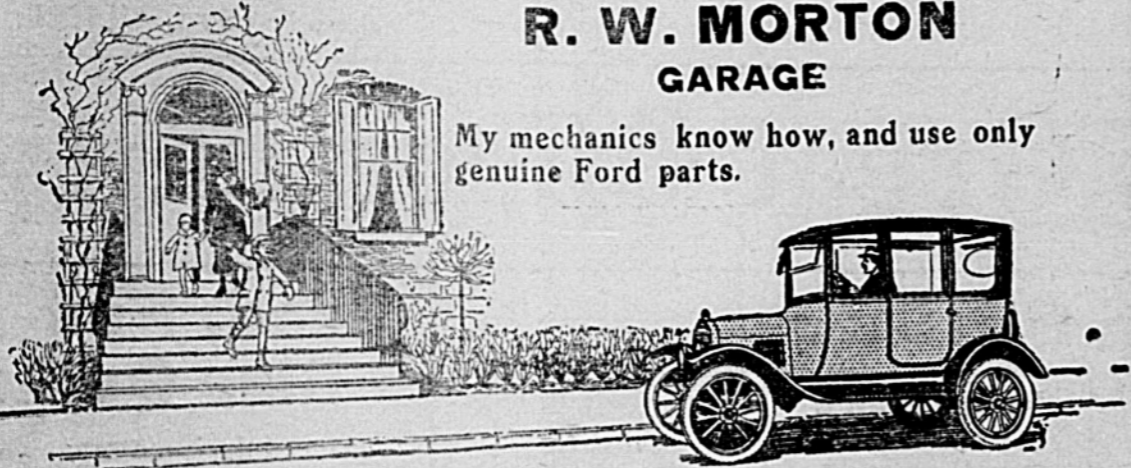

## SOUND BUSINESS BASIS FOR CHURCH

Interchurch World Movement  
Natural Growth of Tendency  
to Eliminate Waste.

### AVOIDS USELESS COMPETITION

Religious Financiering Revolutionized  
by Success of Men and Millions  
Movement and Co-operation  
is Result.

The Interchurch World Movement of North America is an attempt by forward-looking leaders of the various evangelical denominations of the United States and Canada to co-ordinate the resources in men, money and material of Protestant America.

Historically it is the logical outgrowth of a tendency of the national boards in each denomination to form working alliances among themselves, in which each board shall preserve its identity and control its own personnel and treasury.

In former times, the home mission society, the foreign mission society, the church extension society and the various philanthropic and eleemosynary agencies of any denomination conducted their affairs independently of one another. Each surveyed its own restricted territory, prepared a budget of money and workers for its own purposes and made its own appeal to its constituency for support.

This could only mean that these agencies were more or less in competition with one another; that there were waste and duplication of work and money, and that among them all some work was neglected and some denominational resources were entirely overlooked. Because of their specialized training, the leaders of each agency regarded themselves as peculiarly fitted for their tasks, and jealously regarded attempts at outside interference.

#### Decide on Experiment.

After decades of such haphazard methods, the leaders of one denomination decided on an experiment. They thought it would be possible for the agencies to get together for a common study of all the opportunities and resources of their brotherhood, to make out a unified budget of men and money, and to conduct a concerted appeal for funds. It was made clear that each constituent board should preserve complete autonomy.

When the board representatives met they found it possible to eliminate a great amount of organization expenses. They ultimately worked out a budget and plan of campaign that was satisfactory to all. This resulted in the famous "Men and Millions Movement" of the Disciples of Christ, which brought in what was then considered the staggering sum of \$6,300,000 for a five-year program.

The success of this enterprise revolutionized the whole business of church financiering. The other great denominations immediately adopted the plan. The denominational associations have come to be known as "forward movements," and some thirty of them are in existence today. Each one has clarified all the information in relation to enterprise within the denomination, and has reduced the business of collecting and spending money to a science.

#### World-Budget Formed.

The Interchurch World Movement is simply a plan to do interdenominationally what the forward movements have done within the various communions. It means that every denominational budget will be made in the light of world needs instead of in the semi-obscurity of incomplete information. It means that contributions to one denomination will not be in wasteful competition with contributions to another, because all the fellowships will have worked out their program together.

The functions of the Interchurch World Movement are threefold. First, it collects, by means of world surveys, all the pertinent facts on which denominational programs may be built. Second, it sets up the practical machinery of co-operation. Third, it acts in an advisory capacity whenever its advice is requested.

The Movement has nothing to do with organic church union or matters of creed or doctrine. Each constituent unit preserves complete autonomy, and is bound only so far as it wishes to be bound. Financial appeals are made by each denomination to its own constituency. Any surplus in undesignated funds, over and above the actual cost of administration, will be prorated among the denominations engaged in a given financial undertaking.

An illustration of one thing the Movement can do is to be found in a western community of 1,600 persons in which thirteen denominations have been supporting separate churches with missionary funds, while an adjacent territory of 50,000 persons has only three churches. By seeing that all missionary boards are supplied with information in such cases, the Movement will make possible a wiser distribution of funds.

Its first goals are to reduce unnecessary duplication and overlapping to a minimum and to bring about an intelligent division of labor in unoccupied fields. The Movement is, at bottom, an attempt to put church business on the sound, business-like foundations on which the great commercial institutions of America are built.

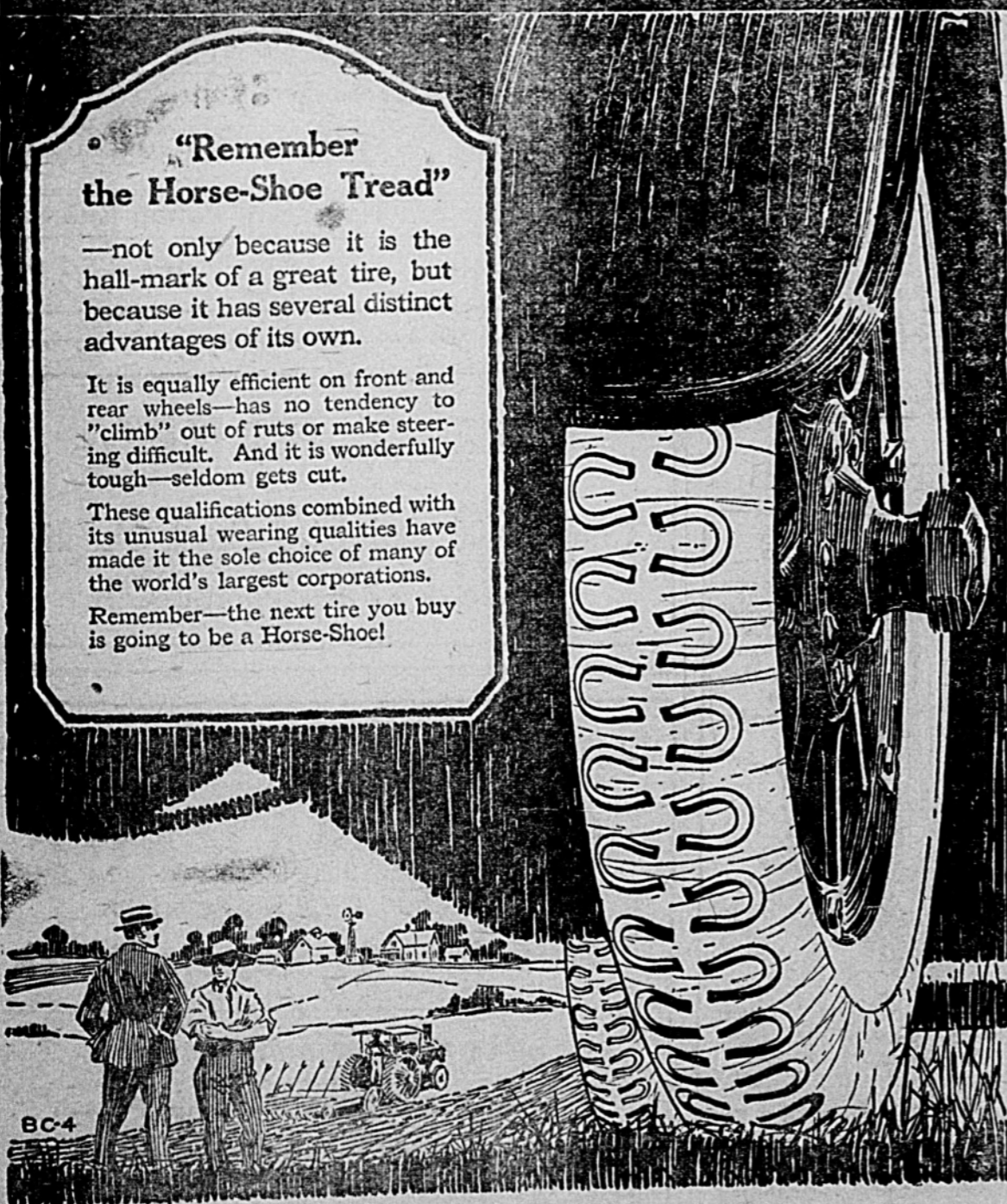

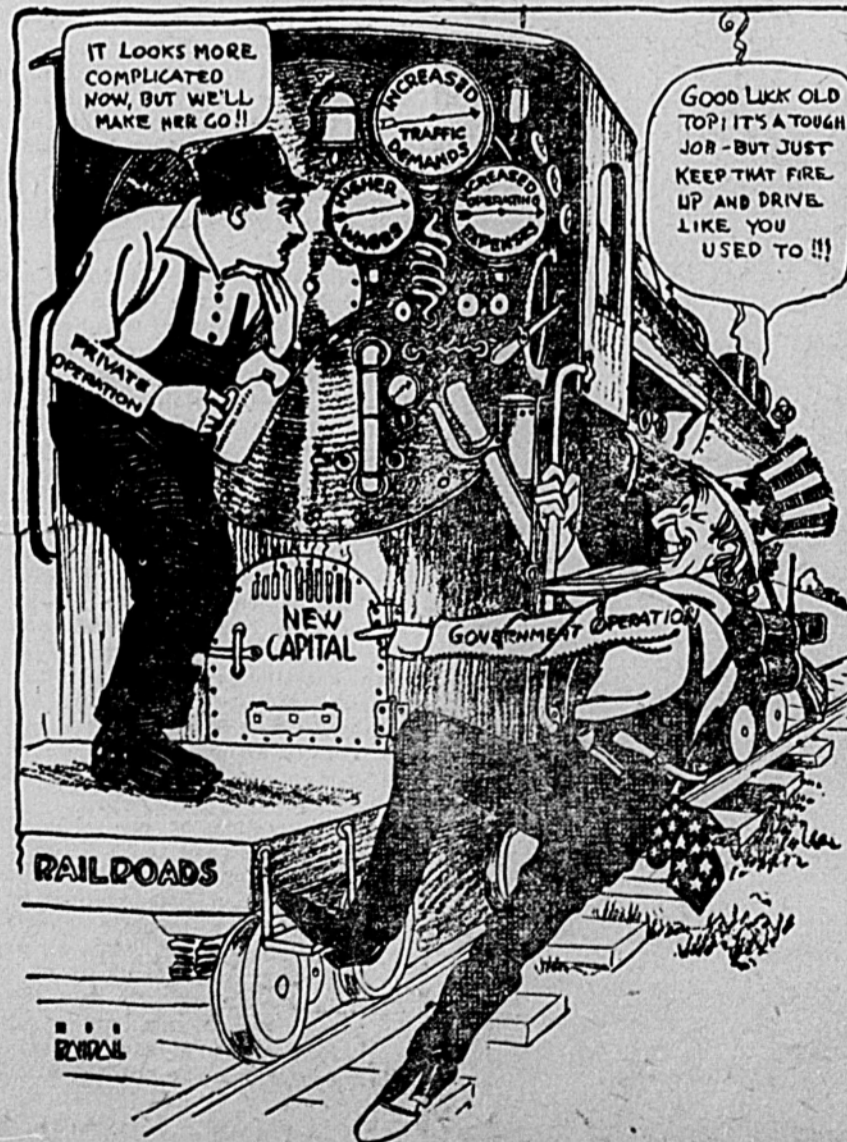
