Surge valve irrigation


Irrigation system efficiency in-
creases of $10-20 \%$ can be expect-
ed by using a surge valve contmoller on some soils in Hensford County. The greatest efficiency increas-
es usually occur on the lighter soils or those with a lower clay content. However, a $10 \%$ efficiensoils found in the county is quite common.
The surge valve controller is placed between the underground irrigation pipeline outlet and two sets of gated aluminum pipe. The
irrigation water is then delivered to the two sets of gated pipe on an alternating basis. These surges of water condition the furrow and allow for a faster rate of advence
