Panhandle Crisis Center Report Mary Frances Ellzey Can you believe? Our favorite project is now a reality! The complete with a hiahlv nomalifiad and delightful Superintendent. Thanks to all you warm-hearted people, from those who donated the use of the building to those who helped to furnish it, down to hose who merely loaned us dolly for moving the heavy things, of food, or funds for same. Thanks, thanks, and more thanks!

Also to those other givers who continue to serve our clients, such as the answering service, which makes our 24 -hour telephone ser vice possible. And to those volunies, such as manning the telephone, attending to filing, babysitting when necessary, or as counselors to those in need. This is a wonderful core of women (and an occasioinal man!), but thei ranks are thinning, some because of moves away from the area, one their own. So we are always in need of more volunteers. Pleas call the office (435-5008) if you think you would like to become a volunteer.

For our counseling volunteers we have regular monthly in-service training periods to fine-tune our abilitv to serve. Last Saturday we had an olutstanding one. Ochiltree General Hospital gave us a short course in the treatment of rape victims. This emphasized even going to the bathroom before receiving care. The Texas Department of Human Services gave shop course on protective services
for victims of battering and/or of rape or molestation. It was point ed out that if a child tells anyons about the possibility of battering or of molestation, that person (18 years old or older) is held responsible for reportging it to an agency within 48 hours for professiona nvestigatgion. We ve long know
his to be true for battering, etc is now true for sexual molestation is now true
of any type Joe Hannon, the Polioe Chief,
also gave a course on legal also gave a course on lega
appects. He pointed out that aspects. for bettering is now a possibility even without the viotim's filing a complaint. He stated hat arrest, including a possible ine, is a deterrant to future batterings. And battering must be topped. Children are always whether or not they are them. elves abused. They pay an awf price in fear, in hate for the batterer. They may grow up to be too timid to fend for themselves in an adequate way. They may they may simply become de
quent. They too may need counselling. It is partly because this continuing incidence of effects that is prompting the leg
crack-down on the batterers. crack-down on the batterers.
Rape is another form of violen Rape is another form of violence
prompted by anger. The victim prompted by anger. The victim suffers greatly from Ands violation
of his/her person. And so does the spouse or other family member
who is aware. Of course the victim who is sware. Of course the victim
(and the family) frequently goes
through the anguish by deciding to move away - far away from the scene of the assault on his/her able. It is a horrible experience. But unless the violater is caught, he remains tree to act iner ther victim, same way toward another victim,
or even (horrible to contemplate) or the same one. This too must be stoppod. But even if you, as a virim, are unwilling to pursue the violater, please get help in recovering from the outrage by
calling the Panhandle Crisis Center.
