Prior to considering the First State Bank building as a posible site for city-hall, the councilmen had considered renovating and repairing fire damage at old city hall. They had received three base bids from Amarillo firms, the lowest for cost extra. In fact, the council yoted oaccept the apparent low bid for the renovation at their June 14 meeting but held up on awarding th contract at that time. At their next meeting they again held up on warding the contract.
