MAKING JELLY The "secret to making good combination of pectin, acid and sugar in the right amounts. Whether you make your own jelly each year or you're trying it for the first time, it pays to know how these incredients work together. Pectin determines the firmness of the jelly. Too little pectin can produce a jelly too soft to hold its
form. But good hometade form. But good homemade jellies
don't have to have as much pectin as commerical jellies, which must be firm enough to withstand shipment.
Different kinds of pectins produce jeilies with various degrees or tirmness. For example, cran-
berry pectins yield jellies that
break easily into small clumps, while apple pectins create more elastic jellies.
The acidity of the fruit also has something to do with firmness. Juices from higher acid fruits yield firmer jellies than juices yrom lower acid fruits, even where the pectin content is the same. Fruits actually have a mixture of acids in them. But tartaric acid. which is plentiful in grapes and currents, is more efficient for jelly-making than citric or acetic
acid. ${ }^{a} \quad$ acid. $\begin{gathered}\text { Perhaps the biggest question in } \\ \text { jelly-making in }\end{gathered}$ jelly-making is how much sugar to add, since that can vary from fruit to fruit. Most of the time, it's better to use too liftle rather than

a cup or more of sugar. Partly ripe a cup or more of sugar. Partly ripe
currants, gooseberries and grapes may need one or more cups of sugar, but that depends on their stage of ripeness and the amount of water used to cook them. Heving low acid or low pectin fruits does not mean you have to give up on making jelly. Low pectin fruits can be made into

A memorable date in U.S. history is June 19, 1864 ,
On that day a Union iron-clad warship sank the Confederate raider Alabama in the English Channel The exploits of the Alabama are among the mosi amazing sea stories of all time. She was built in
England and delivered to the Confederacy at sea in the summer of 1862 .
Her captain was from New Jersey, and fought all through the
Alabamian.)
The Alabama was the forerunner of daring German merchant raiders in both World War I and World War II. Their captains were well aware of the accomplishments of the Alabama in her two year Captain Raphael Semmes and his cre destroyed 69 ships from the summer of 1862 to June 19 1864, flying the Confederate flag. Insurance rates on Yankee vessels soared during this period and the sea hero of Dixie was the curse of northern shipowners
The steel-plated USS Kearsarge arrived off the por of Cherbourg, where Alabama was refurbishing, and Captain Semmes was challenged to come out and fight a duel.
With
With wooden sides, Alabama had only minimum
hopes but Semmes accepted the calle hopes but Semmes accepted the challenge. Kearsarge
sank Alabama in the resulting gun fight but English sportsmen in their yachts picked up Semmes and 24 of her crew. Semmes was given hero-treatment in England.
He later sailed to Mexico, entered Texas, got across the Union-held Mississippi River and reached General
Lee in Virginia in the last months of the war. He was in charge of a battery of guns on the James River when Richmond fell, in April, 1865.
