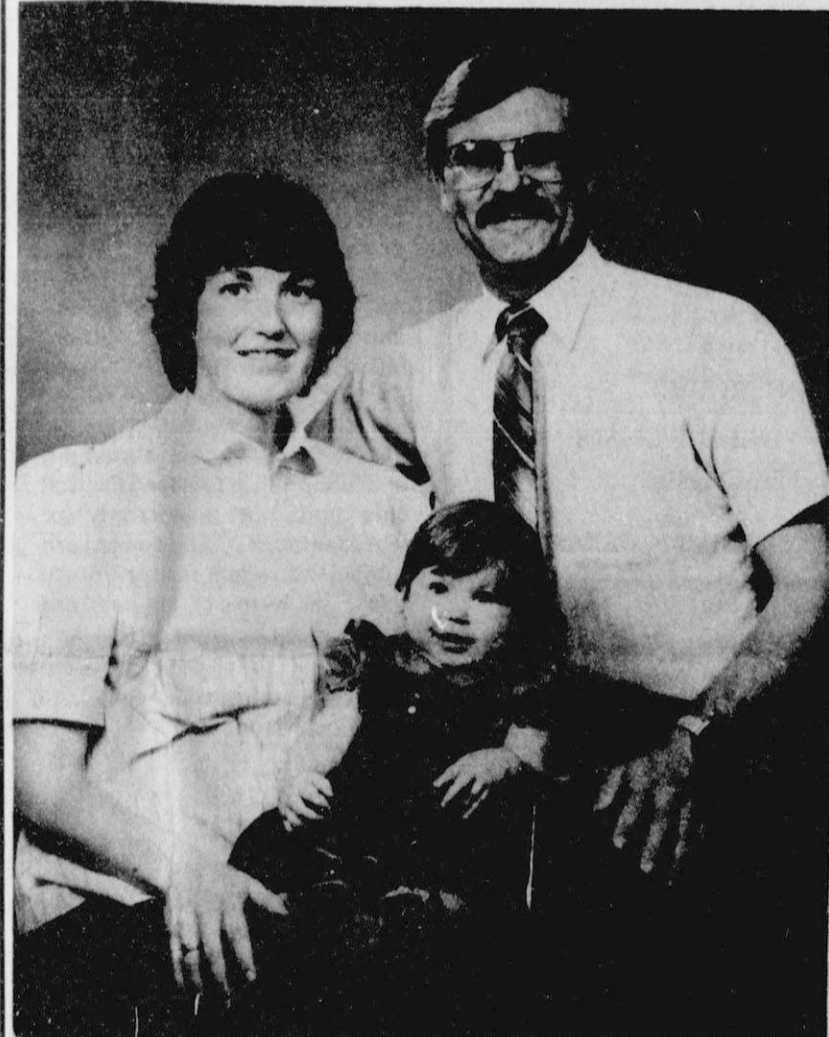

Accessibility to courthouse studied

County Judge Roy Lee McClellan, Commissioner Precinct #1, Garland Head Gruver citizen Buddy Etling, Spearman citizen, Faye Lynch met Friday at the courthouse with Buck Ramsey of Amarillo, who is on the Potter County committee to get present county facilities accessible to handicapped individuals.

In order for the county to receive Federal Revenue Sharing they must have a plan devised by October 17, 1984 to bring county owned buildings under these standards.

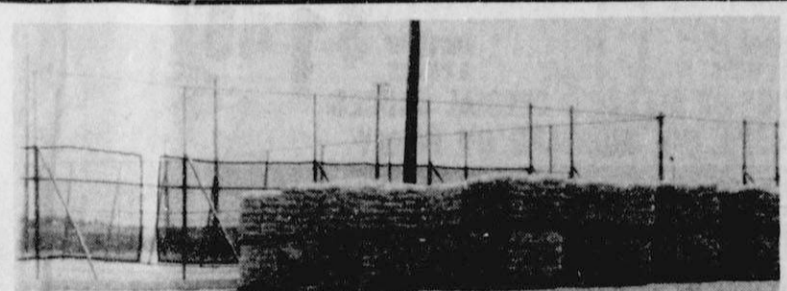
The county then has two years to complete the project. The funds for this project will come out of revenue sharing money.

In order to comply, the county will have to build a ramp on the east side of the courthouse and also will have to install a chair lift that will take disabled citizens to all stories which they might need to use.

Rest room changes will also need to be made.

Approximate cost will be \$50,000.00.

Mrs. Lynch and Mr. Etling, both paraplegics, gave their suggestions on possible needed changes for disabled persons.

W.O. Groves services held

W.O. Groves, 81, died Monday.

Services were at 2 p.m. Wednesday in First Christian Church with the Rev. Martin Foster, pastor, officiating. Burial was in Hansford Cemetery by Boxwell Brothers Funeral Directors.

Mr. Groves was born in Iberia, Kan., and moved to Woodward, Okla., in 1908. He moved to Waka in 1926 and moved to Spearman in 1944. He married Gladys Tanner in 1934 in Woodward. She died in 1971. He married Elizabeth McClellan this year at Spearman.

He was a retired farmer and member, deacon, elder and board chairman of First Christian Church. He taught Sunday school for many years. He was instrumental in establishing the first hospital in Spearman and served on the first board of Hansford Hospital. He attended Phillips University in Enid, Okla., and was graduated from Oklahoma A&M in Stillwater in 1926.

Survivors include his wife; three daughters, Patricia Myers

of Houston, Anita Rude of Bedford and Thelma Groves of Oklahoma City; a son, Fred of Spearman; two sisters, Erma Groves of Arlington, Va., and Ethel White of Jacksonville, Fla.; and seven grandchildren.

Wreck here Monday night

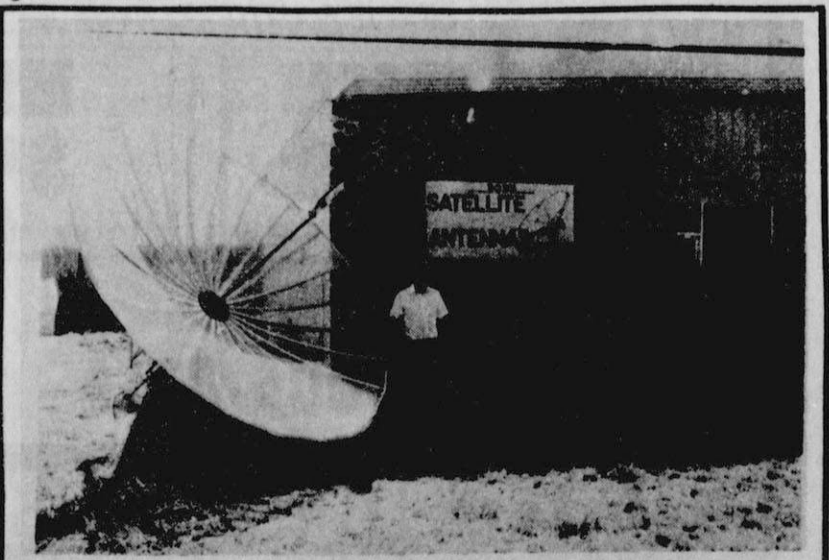


Don Lane Whitefield was injured in a motorcycle wreck here Sunday night. He is recuperating in an Amarillo hospital.

Chemical People to have seminars here



Marilyn Galightly will be a featured speaker at the Substance Abuse Rally to be held Monday, September 17.

The Chemical People of Hansford County will take an inovative step in the growing battle against substance abuse among the young people of our community. On Monday, Sept. 17 representatives from the Panhandle Substance Abuse Consortium will present seminars in the Spearman Schools. The goals of this "Rally Day" are to raise community awareness of substance abuse in every age group of our society and to give specific help to youth and adults in ways to combat and prevent substance abuse. Wayne Hughes, Regional Alcoholism Services Director for the Panhandle Regional Planning Commission, believes this is the first time a project of this nature has been held in Texas schools.

The substance abuse consortium was formed in 1982 so that professionals in the substance

are getting and how they can get involved. This will be done in an evening session following the school presentation. Speakers and topics throughout the day are as follows:

Larry Barber, Amarillo Council on Alcoholism will present *Getting it Together--What it takes to identify the drug problem in the community and how to turn the situation around. Who do we go to? What do we do? How do we form student activist groups to help combat peer pressure. When do we use positive peer pressure?*

Mr. Barber is a 1974 graduate of Baylor University with a bachelor's degree in communications. He has been executive director of the Amarillo Council on Alcoholism for over a year. Before that, he served as the council's director of education services.

Prior to working for the council, Mr. Barber was news director of KFDD TV in Amarillo. He held several similar posts around the state before coming to Amarillo in 1977.

He is a graduate of the Johnson Institute short course on Chemical Dependency and the Family and served in 1983 on the steering committee of the Texas Panhandle Chemical People. He was director of the young people's conference for the 11th Annual Tri-State Institute On Substance Abuse.

Bill Thompson, Texas Tech Family Practice--Aspects of Substance Abuse--The disease nature of substance abuse. How mood-altering and consciousness-altering substances affect behavior patterns. Presentation to science classes will deal with the chemical nature of substance abuse and how the long-range health, mental and physical abilities of the user are affected.

Mr. Thompson is an instructor in the Texas Tech School of Medicine and staff psychologist of the Texas Tech Family Practice Center. He joined the Tech faculty in 1982.

Mr. Thompson is a native of Alabama with a Master of Arts

Degree in Psychology from Alabama A&M University and a Bachelor's degree in Education from Athens State University. He graduated from Alabama A&M in 1974.

Before joining the Texas Tech faculty, Mr. Thompson was coordinator of the Substance Abuse Program for the Huntsville-Madison County Mental Health Center and was resident psychologist for the Huntsville Hospital.

Mari Panagiotou, Catholic Family Service, will speak on *Little Brother, Little Sister--How the substance abuse of a teenaged family member may be affecting other members of the family, particularly younger brothers and sisters. A similar presentation will be made to students of the second and third grade during the team visit.*

Ms. Panagiotou is Counseling Supervisor with Catholic Family Service of Amarillo, a post she has held for the past four years. Previous to coming to the Panhandle, she was a teacher with the American Community Schools in Athens, Greece from 1970 to 1978.

Ms. Panagiotou received her Master of Arts degree in counseling from Ball State University in Indiana in 1975 after having spent several years as a teacher and missionary in Africa, New York and Greece.

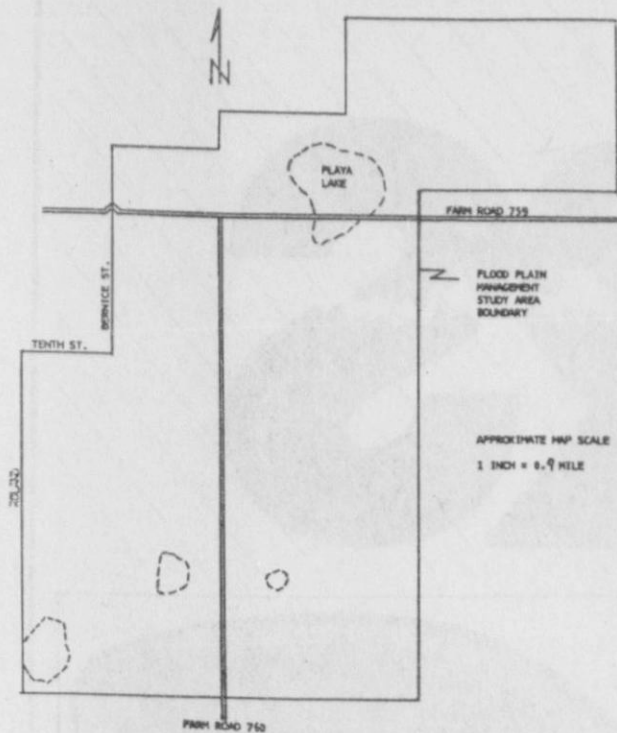

Flood plain management survey Sept. 17-27



In 1983, the City of Spearman, Hansford County Commissioners Court and the Hansford Soil & Water Conservation District requested that the Soil Conservation Service (SCS) do a flood plain management study on portions of the City of Spearman.

The SCS has recently received funding to begin the study. The flood hazard areas in Spearman and these immediate adjoining areas will be identified. The probable depth, width and velocity of floodwater and occurrence will be determined. In order to do this, detailed surveys must be made.

The SCS has hired a private surveying firm to do the surveying and they will be conducting their field surveying from Sep-

tember 17-27th. Much of the surveying work within the city will be done down streets, etc., but it will be necessary for a portion of the elevation reading to be taken on private property. The majority of elevation readings taken in the rural areas will be on private property. The rural landusers involved will be contacted and access permission requested.

Following completion of the surveying work, maps showing where flooding is likely to occur will be developed and alternatives to reduce flooding will also be studied.

"Mary Smith" takes her son to a daycare center each morning where he has a good breakfast. She goes on to work and eats a donut and coffee at her desk. To save time and energy at lunch, Mary goes across the street to a fast food restaurant and has a hamburger, fries and cola for lunch. She eats this on almost every work day.

Mary probably wouldn't consider wearing the same outfit over and over again each day. That would be dull, to say the least. Yet people like Mary don't think a thing about eating the same foods every day.

Variety is the "spice of life" in food as well as fashion. And more importantly, it is one key to a nutritious diet, since no one type of food can provide all the vitamins and minerals needed for a balanced diet.

Mary, for example, gets a good supply of nutrients (and fat) from her daily breakfast and lunch routine. But she also has a

deficient intake of the nutrients, such as vitamin C, that those foods lack.

She could nourish herself better by simply alternating the donut with a bran muffin or piece of toast from home, or even a biscuit or croissant from a fast food restaurant. Mary could sometimes exchange the hamburger for a turkey sandwich from home, or a slice of pizza, pita-pocket sandwich or salad from a fast food restaurant. She could also alternate orange juice or low-fat milk with cola.

With a few minor changes, most of us could have more variety and get more nutrients in our diet.
