With the dry weather residents rates in Soearman are about average as compared to Panhandle area standards.
Cities of Dalhart, Spearman, Canadian and Dumas are all in the range of $\$ 11.40$ to $\$ 12.65$ per 10,000 gailons. Pampa charges
$\$ 15.40$ for 10,000 gallons and Canyon's rate is $\$ 23.60$ for 10,000 gallons; and Borger rates are $\$ 20.75$ for 10,000 gallons. Perryton is the lowest with
$\$ 9.28$ per 10,000 and Amarillo, second lowest with $\$ 10.27$ per 10,000 gallons.
Cities producing their water from wells are cheaper than transmission cities, with the exception of Amarilla.
In sewer costs, the average of Spearman, Canadian, Dumas, Perryton and Dalhart is $\$ 4.65$ a month. Pampa, Borger, Canyon, $\$ 5.51$. Perryton is lowest with $\$ 2.60$ and Canyon charges $\$ 4.00$. Borger is high with $\$ 8.25$.
In the area of garbage rates the average is just over $\$ 5$ among In cities.

County farms decrease since 1978

Preliminary reports of the 1982 Census of Agriculture show that Census of Agriculture show that
the number of farms in the county decreased from 355 to 315 since the 1978 census. All land in farms
totaled 584,953 acres in 1982, an average of 1,857 acres per farm. The Census Bureau defines a farm as any place from which $\$ 1,000$ or more of agricultural would have been sold. Land from which crops were harvested increased to 203,607
acres since 1978.

The country's farmers sold
$\$ 194.7$ million in agricultrual pro$\$ 194.7$ million in agricultrual proreports from the 1982 Census of Agriculture. The 1982 sales figure represents an average of $\$ 617,940$ for each of the county's farms. The census reports that $\$ 26.6$ milion or 14 percent of total sales were for crops, while $\$ 168.1$ million or 86 percent of the total came from the sale of livestock, poultry, and their products. Preliminary data indicate that
expenditures for feed for livestock and poultry were $\$ 42.3$ million; total farm energy costs were $\$ 8.2$
million; fertilizer costs were $\$ 2.8$ million; and seed costs were \$1.2 million. Of the total farms in the county, 150 had grcss sales of $\$ 100,000 \mathrm{o}$ than $\$ 10,000$. Farms operated as sole proprietorships represented 80 percent of the total. In 1982, the average age of farm operators

## Etling recalls WW II bombings

Buddy Etling recalls D-Day

I made it in England in 1944 while I was in the 8th Air Force. On D-Day plus one, June 7 ,
1944, a German JU 88 fighter, similar in capability with the British Mesquito, followed our our bombers back to England from their raids on the Normand beach-head area. On that even-
ing, this JU88 shot down three of our B-24's. The B-24 had a nose tail, and top turret gun, but no belly gun, and was thus vulner able from the bottom side. Though these planes returned
from the front at 200 ft above the English Channel for protection of that vulnerable belly, three were fatally attacked. Our B-17, Fly ing Fortresses, had the additional threat to fighters
One of these B-24's crashed in our living site with three dead aboard. I watched it, on fire, in its last 3 minutes of flight. As gulfed a city block area, and it's motors rolled through several of ur quonset type barracks. crashed plane windshield of this crashed plane, I savaged enough plexiglass to make this model of

Before our heavy bombing, and
the Russian destruction of a large part of the German army, terrible
German raids on English cities German raids on English cites air raid in London, as well a raid on our base. I well remember with elation as Hamburg was destroyed in 24 hours by our bombers. Prior to D-Day, the Luttw V-2 rockets were a terrible morale factor on the British. These too, were launched largely from $\mathrm{Hol}-$ land, but unlike the buzz bomb fighters, though rarely, there was just no defense for the $\mathrm{V}-2$, only surprises of devestation from the war-head.
Once D-Day came, and the beach head was established, Hitler's reign had limited days,
though he was not initially convinced. Never in the history of the world has there been assembled,
with continual build-up and sup ply, a force of this magnitude of aircraft, inovative sea breakers, docking facilities, and dedicated manpower. The sacrifice of life and limb was beyond realization, even I wonder, by those in that
invasion. One of our famed generals said that never in his career, had he asked so much from his men, as in that invasion. However, Americans, who have never seen war, death and devestation
on U.S. soil, or did not participate in this, or any other war, may well take note, that the price of freedom and liberty has never been cheap, nor will it ever be.

danger, I know little about the extreme hazards and bloodshed required of those that faced the enemy on D-Day on the beaches of Normandy, since I did not weer

Despite its' need for constant deaning, most of us enjoy the rich golden color of brass in furnishings. With little time to clean, however, it's important to prolong the effect of a polishing job and to keep brass looking good.
Solid brass is a fairly durable alloy of copper and zinc, while brass platid to a steal brass bonded can take much harsher cleaning than plated brass. Use a magnet to test for plating. A magnet will stick to the steel beneath plated brass, but not to solid brass.
Tarnish doesn't harm brass, and can create an "entique' look. But tarnish tends to darken detail or have a lighter look in your brass, polishing is neces.
sary. coating. Brass is usually sealed with clear lacquer, varnish o epoxy. Where the coating nicks or wears away, it tarnishes from oxication.
Since you typically won't know which sealer was used, experi-
ment. Chemical strippers acetone (nail polish remover) mav do the trick. Wear rubber gloves, work in a well ventilated area and use very fine steel wool to remove the coating without scratching the brass. Traces of residue left by the stripper should be reter
8 gent and water.

moval, make a bath from house moval, make a bath from house-
hold products. Dismantle the piece before soaking in a mixture of the following:
1 part amonia to 2 parts hot water, or 1 part vinegar to 2 parts hot water, or 4 tablespoons baking soda to one quart boiling water.
For polishing solid brass, you cleaner in liquid or paste form. Liquid cleaners containing a very fine abrasive do a good job on the tarnish, but may leave residue in joints or carved areas if not completely removed. Both types of cleaner require elbow grease where tarnish is heavy.
Brass polish can damage wood finishes. So when cleaning wood hardware in place, tape light cardboard snugly around it to protect the wood underneath. Apply all polishes with a sof cloth in one direction, either along the length of the piece or in the direction in which it's been turned. Continue to polish with clean parts of Lie cloth so tanto to the brese rubbed back into to the brass.

Since the thin coating of brass is easily removed from plated brass, don't buff, use vinega and lemon, or use abrasives, like steel wool. Many mild com merical polishes may work on
brass plating, but do a test patch when using anything stronge than detergent and water. Use tung oil, commerical brass wax or lacquer to prolong and protect the polishing job First make sure the brass is clean and free of fingerprints, polishing compounds and othe substances. Since fingerprint will show up under the finish

For laoquer dipping, make $50-50$ solution of lacquer and
thinner. Dip the brass, and let it dry five to 15 minutes. Once you have lacquered a piece, avoid brass polish or ammonia-based cleaners.
