## Many campers wouldn't think of going Into the field without their binoculars or wildife. Here are some tips from Bushnell, makers of binoculars, spotting scopes and sports optics: - Outdoor photographers who travel off the beaten path with extra cameras ond lenses often with extra cameras and ripods at home. If you carry a large child's bean bag in your camera case. youll have a steady support which can cradle a telephoto lens when rested on a tree limb or rock. <br> - When using optics of high magnifica tion, a sturdy base is essential for steadiness. Spotting scopes should be used on a tripod, not hand-held, for max- imum results. People who observe imum resuits. People who observe wildilife from a vehicle should use a window mount, one of the handiest tools for steadying a spotting scope. Attached firmly to the glass of a partially opened inrmly to the glass of a partially opened window, it also doubles as a camera base. And it avoids the movement and noise of opening the vehicle's door. - When using a telephoto lens on camera, a gosing a telephoto lens on a use a shutter speed slower than the focal length of the lens. For example, a length of the lens. For example, a 500 mm lens should not be hand-held at a shutter speed less than $1 / 500$ of a second. For a 1000 mm lens,, $1 / 1000$ of a second should be held shutter speed.
