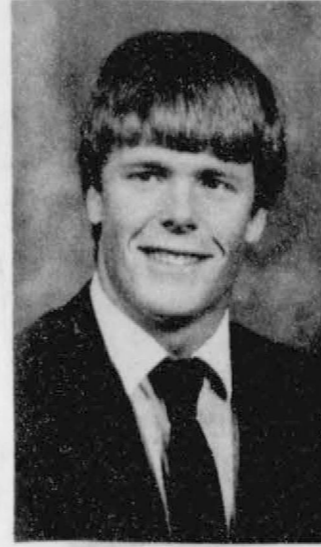
Jeff Laird will run the 110 Hurdles at 3:40 p.m. Friday. If he qualifies he will run at 2:00 p.m. Saturday.

## Election is Saturday

Thirty people have cast absentee ballots as of late Monday in the Democratic and Republican primaries. Absentee balloting ended at 5 p.m. Tuesday at the county clerk's office at Hansford County Courthouse.

Be sure and go to the polls Saturday, May 5 and vote. This is the only way your voice will be heard. Democratic and Republican party precinct conventions will also be held Saturday.

On the Republican Primary Election ballot, Ronald Reagan appears for the office of the President of the United States. Candidates for United States Senator are Henry C. (Hank) Grover, Ron Paul, Rob Mosbacher and Phil Gramm.

For United States Representative District 13, Beau Boulter.

For Railroad Commissioner, John Thomas Henderson.

For Chief Justice, Supreme Court, John L. Bates.

For Judge, Court of Criminal Appeals, Place 1, Virgil E. Mulanax.

For District Judge, 84th Judicial District, J.E. Blackburn.

For District Attorney, 84th Judicial District, Gene Compton.

For County Chairman, Roy L. Bulls.

For Precinct Chairman, Precinct No. 1--Alton Ellsworth; No. 2--Ray Ralston; No. 3--Cecil Ralston; No. 4--Ila Jo Hart; No. 5--Mike Schnell; No. 6--Wiley Sheets; and No. 8--Tommy Rodgers.

Burial was in Gruver Cemetery by Boxwell Brothers Funeral Home of Spearman.

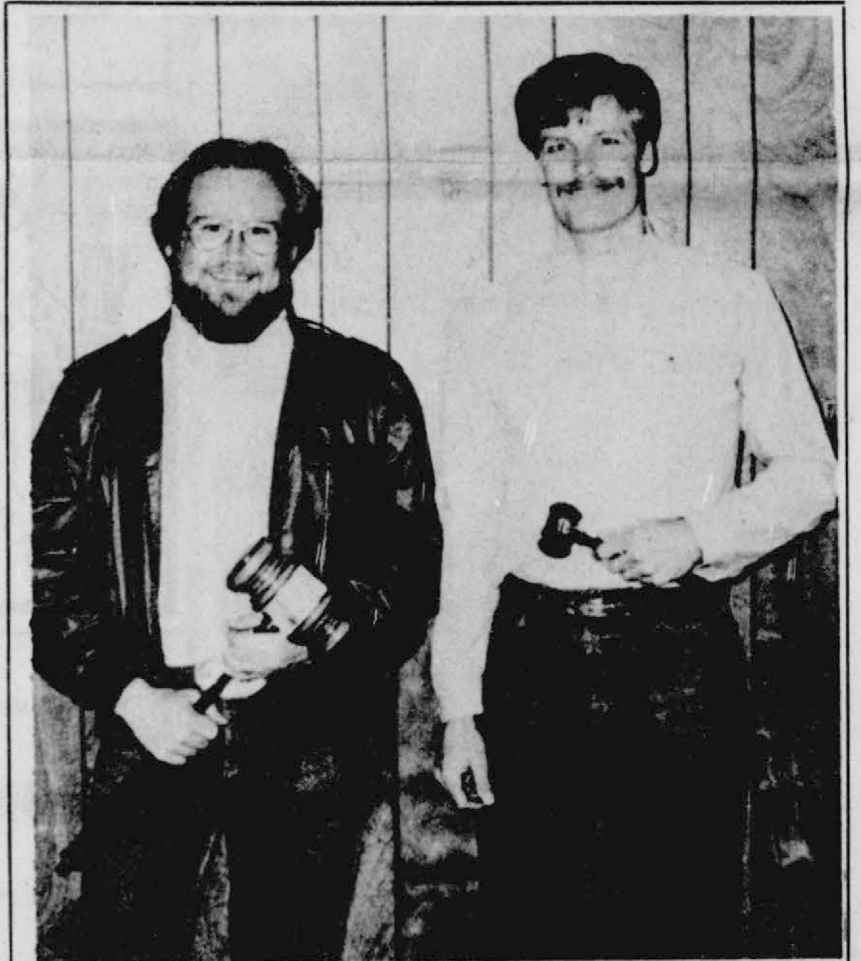
Mrs. Crane was born in Pampa. She had lived in Gruver since 1979. She was a member of First Christian church. She married Will Crane in 1982 in Gruver.
