A former smoker, Miss Blake quit smoking eight years ago. I smoked two packs a day for wenty years and quit cold tursmouth cancer is a strong incentive to give up cigarettes.
Amanda Blake was diagnosed as having cancer of the mouth in 1976. After undergoing surgery,
she is completely free of the disease today.
The annual Smokeout, now in its eighth year, is sponsored by the ACS nationwide to good-naturedly encouraged smokers to one day-if only to prove to themselves they can.
