Kansas City, Martin said, some of the PIK certificates came out with the wrong amounts.
Martin said the first deficiency payouts made in 1986 were ignored by
the computer the computer, resulting in PIKs whic Checks sent out by theunt. were more accurate, Martin said. "We're writing a lot of checks ourselves, plus making advance payments and loans, and
swamped," Martin said.
In spite of the computer errors
Martin stated that Hansford Count Martin stated that Hansford County
would receive 4.8 million dollars for would receive 4.8 million dollars for
the PIK program. The wheat program the PIK program. The wheat program
with payments made in June, July and December total 9.4 million dollars. The target price set for 1986 wheat
by the federa government was $\$ 4.38$;
the loan level the loan level was $\$ 2.40$. This left a
deficiency payment due of $\$ 1.98$.
was advance payment of 91.5 cents was requested by most producers, leaving a balance of $\$ 1.065$. In some
cases, an additional 10 percent pay cases, an adaite.
The first of the final payments was due Dec. 15, but were not made because of the computer errors. Fach payment is now being manually
rechecked by the Hansford office, with new payments being issued in case of computer errors.
The deficiency payment was 65
cents per bushel for barley, and 37 cents per bushel for barley, and 37
cents for wheat. Eligible barley and oat producers will receive additional deficiency payments in July if the
national average market prices are national average mat
below the loan rates.

Milton Hertz, administrator of the national ASCS program, said the additional deficiency payments will be paid 50 percent in cash, and 50
percent in Payment in Kind certificates.
The cash payment however, will be subject to a 4.3 percent reduction to comply with provisions in the Gramm-
