## Bullock's School Plan

State Comptroller Bob Bullock has proposed an emergency
school plan to head off a looming school plan to head off a looming
crisis in Texas classrooms. "Unless there's a plan in place Unless there's a plan in place
by May 1 that meets the Texas Supreme Court's recent order, I'm forbidden to send any more state money to Texas schools," Bullock
He said he wouldn't defy the court's order, and urged the wait until next spring to consider a plan that meets the constitutional lest of the court.
"I'm suggesting a $\$ 600$ million guaranteed yield plan--including more teacher pay-coupled with $\$ 200$ million in bond money for and can meet the requirements
and and deadline the court set," Bullock said.
Bullock's plan, which is similar to one he suggested to lawmakers more than a year ago, makes up the difference between what a district needs and what it can raise
bv guaranteeing state money if
the district meets a tax rate test.
Texas will face an educational doomsday next May 1 , if our
schools don't have the money to stay open and operate. Time is short and we've got to focus on the equitable state aid formula. "Solving the crisis will cost the average Texans less than $\$ 35$ the first year. That figures out to less than a dime a day from each
Texan to help our schools," he said. to help our schools," he A temporary increase in exist-
ing taxes may be the only way to pay for the first year cost of the plan, Bullock said. Some news
taxes--like an income tax which taxes--like an income tax which
others propose--and money raising schemes--like a lottery-can't be put into place in time to produce the money needed.
"We cannot abandon the child"We cannot abandon the chiildren in our schools while we debate
the perfect system of education or the ultimate financing method. We must fix a broken system. We have studied the problem long enough

## WHO ARE THE BABYBOOMERS?
