1985 Palo Duro report

The Palo Duro River Authority (PDRA) is a sub-political body of the State of Texas and was established by the 63rd Legislature, Regular Session. 1973, Chapter 438. The Palo Duro River Authority consists of Hansford County, Moore County, and the City of

Stinnett, which was designated by the Department of Commerce in July of 1973 as a Title IV Re-development Area under the Public Works and economic Development Act of 1965, as amended.

The Palo Duro River Authority purposes to build a multi-purpose lake which will include water supply, treatment plant, distribution system, and recreation on the Palo Duro River 11 miles North of Spearman, Hansford County, Tx. This dam will impound a reservoir of 60,900 acre feet of water covering a surface of approximately 2,500 acres, with a daily sustained yield of 7.8 million gallons of water. This water will be used as municipal water supply for Gruver, Spearman, Cachis, Sunray, Dumas, and Stinnett, Texas for a combined total population of some 30,000.

In establishing this reservoir, there will be a loss of less than 100 acres of cultivated land and only two old homesteads will have to be relocated.

The completed project will protect watershed lands from erosion and maintain or increse producttivity, increase efficiency of use of irrigation water; reduce flooding of the roads, agricultural lands, and homestead properties in northern Texas and Oklehoma; reduce deposit of sediment on the flood plain and volume of sediment contributed to the North Canadian River. reduce streambank erosion and allow re-establishment of trees, shrubs, and other once existing vegetation long since washed away; provide incidental ground water recharge for irrigation; create surfact water for waterfowl and fishery resources; improve wildlife habitat on flood plain; increase migratory water fowl protection; create opportunities for additional employment and income to households; increase demand for goods and services, and initially reduce runoff to the North Canadian River. This site being studied by the Corp of Engineers is the only site North of the South Canadian

Ultimately, the reservoir will serve as a site for the storage of imported water to be used to irrigate the crop lands within the boundaries of the Palo Duro River Authority. Immediately, the reservoir will serve to attract light industry of an agricultural business nature to that instead of the present steady rural depletion and deterioration, there will be rural development, thus helping to bring about a better urban-rural population balance than is now the situation in Texas.

It is estimated that in the three year period following the completion of the dam, the Palo Duro River Authority area would gain some 1,900 jobs, these jobs would create not only an expanding population with sound economic base, but would obviously turn around the present population loss

The Palo Duro River Authority in 1978, issued \$6,500,00.00 in revenue bonds for pollution control and in 1982 we issued another \$6,000,000.00 These bonds will build facilities to provide air and water pollution control at the Kerr-McKee Diamond Shamrock gasoline plant in Moore County. At the present time, the Army Corps of Engineers has completed a feasibility study and they are now pursuing the project.

The Board of Engineers for Rivers and Harbors of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers has announced it is recommending the project. It has now been sent to the Secretary of the Army, the Office of Management and Budget, and the

Santa Crossed Unsafe Toys

Before Santa comes to town this holiday season, the Texas Society to Prevent Blindness (TSPB) Amarillo Branch hopes he will have crossed unsafe toys off the request lists children from Texas have sent

According to the Society, last year an estimated 5,035 children were treated in hospital emergency rooms for toy-related eye injuries. More than 80 percent of them were under age 15.

"Toy injuries can be prevented." says Gwen Fraze, Presi-

dent of the Amarillo Branch of TSPB. "However, the gifts that Santa-and parents-leave under the tree this holiday should be carefully selected."

The Society recommends that before making purchases, buyers inspect the toy and consider if it is appropriate for the child and his or her maturity level. "Toys purchased for one child often find their way into the hands of younger, less adept children," Mrs. Fraze says. 'This can be especially hazardous.'

The Society also suggests that shoppers keep a lookout for these potential hazards:

-- Check toys for any sharp, exposed edges, points, nails, screws and

-- Avoid projectile items, such as guns that shoot darts or cork. -- Examine dolls, stuffed animals and other cuddly toys for rigid interior frames that can poke

-- Check for loose parts that can become unattached, exposing sharp metal or plastic. -- Avoid toys that can shatter.

through outside coverings.

The Society is especially concerned that parents and friends continue to purchase projectile non-toys for children. These include air and spring operated guns, slingshots, bows and arrows and darts. Last year, these items resulted in approximately 3,600 people suffering eye injuries that required hospital emergency room treat-

"This year, keep the holiday spirits happy by only giving safe gifts and toys," says Mrs. Fraze.

A collection of boxes is on display at Hansford County Library during December, along with an assortment of very old Christmas


The postcards belonged to the late Jesse & Lula Womble and Caleb and Mary Pettitt. They date back to the early 1900's.
