Spearman boys, girls beat Gruver

The Spearman Lynx and Lynxettes kept their sights firmly trained on a post-season playoff berth as they swept a pair of games from district 1-AA cross-county basketball rivals from Gruver Tuesday evening in the Spearman varsity gym at Spearman junior high.

The Lynxettes downed their Lady Greyhound counterparts, 50-29, while the Lynx took an impressive 70-48 win over the Greyhounds.

The Spearman girls are still undefeated in district competition with a perfect 9-0 mark while the Lynx improved their situation to 6-3, just one game behind league leader Highland Park who is 7-2.

For the season, the Spearman boys hold a 17-8 mark overall. The Lynxettes are 23-2 for the year,

their only losses to perennial state contender Nazareth and the Wayland Baptist College JV Queen Bees.

Tuesday's contest saw the two girls' teams feeling out their opponents in the first frame as the score went to 7-6 in favor of home team Spearman.

By halftime, the Lynxettes had established both their offensive and defensive stance to take a 6-point lead into the lockers with a 20-14 count.

Spearman continued their domination of the court and the boards in the third quarter, going out to a 15-point lead, 38-23.

The Lynxettes defense continued strong throughout the remainder of the game, limiting the Lady Grey-

hounds to only six fourth-quarter points.

The Spearman girls tallied another 12 in the final frame to put the game on ice with a 50-29 win.

High point for Spearman was Krista Kirkland with 20 points, followed by Londee Bradley with 16.

Boys action saw the Lynx and Greyhounds hitting almost point for point in the opening stanza with Spearman taking a slight advantage, 12-11, going into the second quarter.

Once there, the Lynx began exercising control from both the floor and the grace line where they proved devastating that evening, hitting on 18 of 20 attempts for a 90 percent effort.

When halftime rolled around, Spearman was in control of the tempo of the game with a 12-point lead, 32-20.

The Greyhounds came back in the opening minutes of the third quarter to pull within eight points of their Spearman counterparts before the Lynx began pulling away again with a series of steals and unanswered points.

Going into the final quarter, Spearman had regained its advantage to control the scoreboard, 48-35.

They didn't slack up in the final period of play as they tacked on another 22 points to Gruver's 13 to place the final at 70-48.

The HANSFORD REPORT

Feeling like a fool is nothing new to me. I've been married now for going on 18 years and, if that isn't enough, I have a teenage son. That alone qualifies me for almost anything.

However, when Gruver's L.W. Ayres visited our office the other morning with his Hooley Stick, I had cause to re-evaluate that assessment. There's a difference between feeling foolish and feeling ignorant.

Neither situation is all that enjoyable, and it's a fine line, but there is a distinction.

Now, I'll have to admit that I had never seen a Hooley Stick, and there may be other folks around who have the same problem.

Lynx, Lynxettes strong for post season berths

With only three regular season games left on the 1987-88 district basketball schedule, the Spearman Lynxettes and Lynx are in the driver's seat for post-season playoff berths.

The Lynxettes stand in line to take the district 1-AA girls crown outright as they own an unblemished conference record of 9-0.

The Lynx, meanwhile, are 6-3 and one game behind 1-AA leader Highland Park at 7-2. They are being chased hard by the Stratford Elks who boast a 6-4 district mark.

Neither of the district crowns have been clinched in either boys or girls standings although it appears unlikely that either leader will be dethroned before the season's end a week from Friday.

The Spearman boys will have to face the Bucks in White Deer, their only district loss other than to league leader Highland Park. A loss here could spell trouble for any hopes of post season play.

The Texas Water Development Board and the Texas Water Commission finally reviewed and approved the PDRA plans and specifications in meetings held late last week in Austin.

Lee attended the meetings and was on hand to answer questions for the two state agencies.

The dam project in Hansford County is the first water plan submitted to the two Texas agencies since voters approved the issuance of bonds for water plans in constitutional balloting in 1985.

As such, the PDRA project has become a test case of sorts for the two agencies, notes Lee.

"I have been very encouraged from the conversations we've had in Austin," he says. "They have been complimentary of the progress we're making here."

The Palo Duro River Authority was created by the Texas Legislature in 1973 with the board organized in Hansford County in March, 1974.

In 1976, the federal government -- through the Corps of Engineers -- began a feasibility study on the project, a study which was completed in 1982.

The Diamond Shamrock plant in Moore County was the first entity to become a part of the

PDRA outside of Hansford County when three voters within that one-square mile block came to Spearman to request inclusion in 1977.

Then, in early 1985, all of Moore County and the city of Stinnett held elections for the PDRA. The vote in Moore County carried by a 5 to 1 margin, while in Stinnett, voters approved the issue by a 17 to 1 margin.

The only negative aspect to date came in the fall of 1985 when Ochiltree County voters turned down the issue there.

Elementary TEAMS exam scheduled

Spearman third, fifth and seventh grade students will take the Texas Assessment of Minimum Skills tests in February -- testing now required by state law.

The tests consist of mathematics reading and writing skills with students' performance regarded in terms of mastery or non-mastery.

Third grade students will take the TEAMS exam Feb. 9-10-11 while grades five and seven will take the test Feb. 15-16-17.

"The lake project has been talked about for a good while," observes the PDRA manager. "In an Aug. 5, 1935 report in *The Spearman Reporter*, a group from the Spearman Lions Club met with county commissioners to discuss a similar project."

That project never materialized, however. But it did help begin conversations which led to the eventual establishment of the Palo Duro River Authority, he notes.

The PDRA board will meet next week to finalize their plans on the construction start of the dam itself. That meeting will be held next Tuesday in the PDRA board room.

One tract of land has already been purchased -- that for the spillway area. A decision on the remaining land for the dam itself will be announced at next Tuesday's meeting.

January is month of contrasts

January was a month of contrasts -- at least in the weather where temperatures went from below zero at the first of the month to balmy, spring-like 60's and 70's near month's end.

Winter's grasp held Hansford County firmly from Jan. 4 through Jan. 9 when the days' highs never got above the freezing mark.

A -6 degrees Jan. 7 was the lowest recorded for the month and the high that day reached only 14 degrees.

A total of 8-1/2 inches of snow fell during the month to account for .72 inch of moisture so far in 1988.

Then, as if to atone for those colder days, near month's end a week of spring-like temperatures set in with highs in the 60's and 70's while lows ranged from 25 on up to 42 degrees.

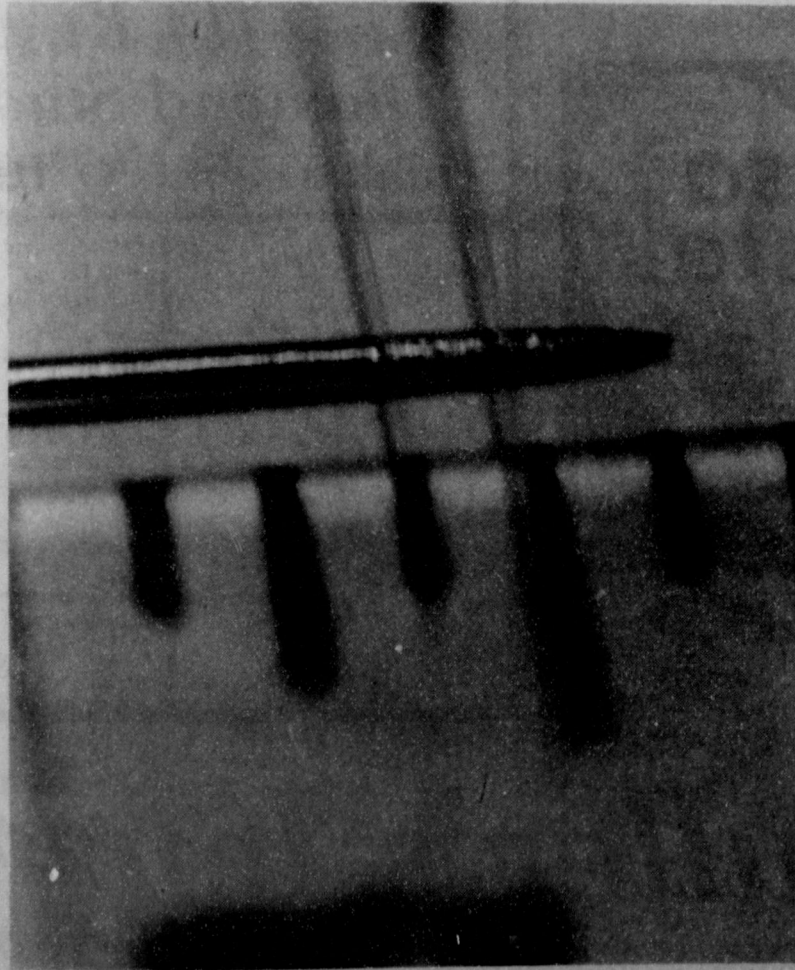
The highest temperature came last Friday when Hansford County reached 74 degrees according to information supplied by KRDF-FM in Spearman, the county's official weather reporting station.

The low of 42 recorded Saturday morning was the warmest night time temperature for January.

Monday's arctic cold front saw temperatures plummet once again as winter came back to the county.

The low Monday at 5:30 a.m. was 24 degrees. As the cold front came through, however, temperatures dipped and the high that day at noon was 20 degrees.

Mist and fog froze on city streets and county highways, leaving an icy glaze. No accidents were reported by either the police department or the sheriff's office, however.

Farmers may enroll land in CRP plan

Texas farmers have another opportunity to enroll highly erodible land in the Conservation Reserve Program.

The next signup period is Feb. 1 to Feb. 19. Farmers may enroll land at Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service county offices where previously accepted bids do not exceed 25 percent of the cropland in the county.

"The February signup is the sixth since the program got underway two years ago," points out Dr. B.L. Harris, soil specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, The Texas A&M University System.

Farmers who participate in the 10-year commitment receive annual rental payments. In addition, the U.S. Department of Agriculture picks up half the cost of establishing a permanent conservation cover.

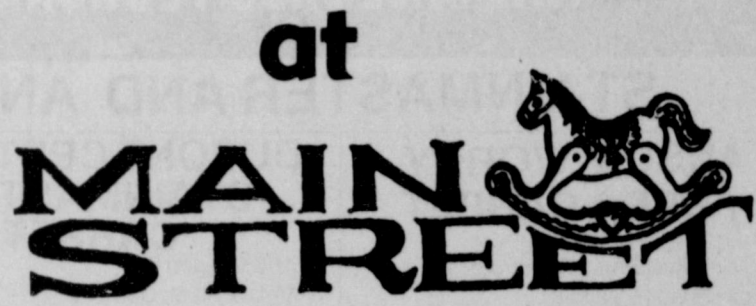
His mother, Lera Langston of Gilliland, Frank Langston of Seymour, Alvin Langston of Victoria and Curtis Langston of Skellytown;

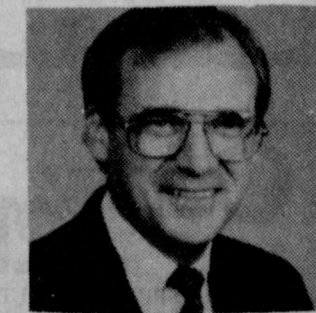

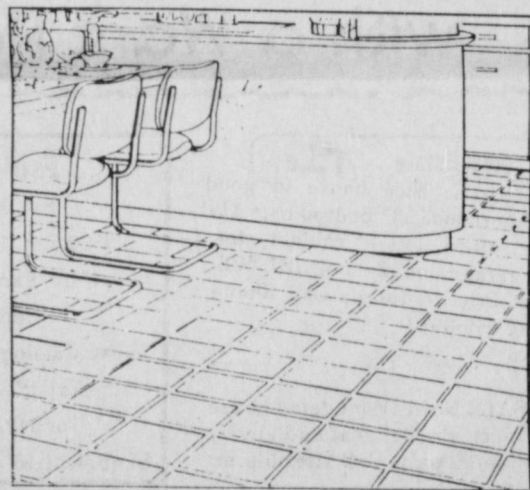

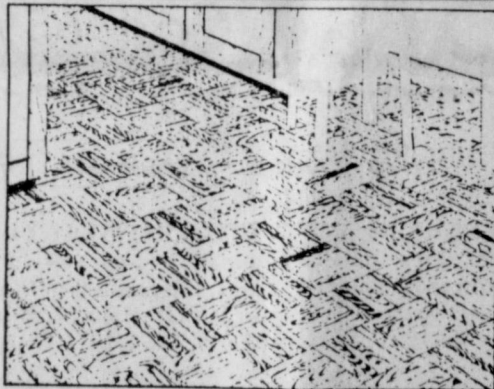
