While power lines carry needed electricity to farms and ranches," said safety manager Bill Greaser "even the slightest contact with these lines can injure or kill. pipes coming into contact with powe lines is the leading cause of electricityrelated farm injuries and deaths,
Greaser said Greaser said.

"Irrigation pipe can be a deadly conductor of electricity," he said. " 1 I
someone lifts a tall section of pipe into an overhead line, he could be severely burned or electrocuted.
"But, any equipment with parts
that extend high enough to tous that extend high enough to touch power lines can create a danger,"
Greaser added. "Be especially careful when using a combine, cotton stripper or module builder, portable grain auger, skid steer loader, bale wagon, or any other equipment whose parts
are tall enough to come into contact with a power line. When working on the farm, play it safe and always look up for power lines.
