Hansford Manor expansion in dedication



OVER 400 HANSFORD RESIDENTS AND AREA DIGNITARIES attended the open house and dedication of the newly expanded and remodeled Hansford Manor Nursing Home in Spearman this past Sunday. The new nursing home facility features over 33,000 square feet with an 84-capacity.

Included in the remodeling were several new features for the Manor. Those include an expanded dining room, a new living room facility, private television viewing room, private family room, resident's laundry room and others. The newly expanded facility also boasts eight private suites of over

400-square feet each in addition to several other innovations. The Hansford Manor is an intermediate skill nursing facility and currently has 53 residents.

1987 School tax rate set at 88 cents

SISD officials set the 1987-88 tax rate at 88 cents per \$100 valuation at their regular board meeting Monday evening, an increase of 4.7 cents from the 1986-87 rate of 83.3 cents.

While the new rate is an increase over last year's tax rate, the new rate will not generate as much revenue as the current rate since re-evaluation saw a decline in property values which fall under the Spearman ISD jurisdiction.

Under the effective tax rate laws, the Spearman school district could have raised its tax rate to 99.59 cents -- the figure which would have generated the same amount of revenue as was collected for the 1986-87 tax year.

Spearman board members will meet with their architect on Sept. 24 in a noon meeting to look over a new proposal for a junior high building program.

The board also discussed a possible non-binding referendum in order to solicit public response to the proposed building program.

Voters would be able to choose from a list of three possible building programs to give the SISD board an idea of the direction they should go in establishing a building program.

In addition to other routine matters, the SISD board hired the services of Bob Davis of Southwestern Securities of San Antonio in anticipation of selling bonds to cover the expense of the building program.

Davis has handled all of the recent bond programs for the school as well as the selling of bonds for the Hansford Manor expansion project.

Down from proposed 74.05 cents . . .

City trims '87 tax rate to 69.5 cents

In a public hearing on the upcoming 1987-88 budget, Spearman city councilmen were informed the budget had been trimmed by \$21,229 -- the bulk of that coming of savings under a new carrier for employee life and health insurance.

The savings, coupled with a few deletions of capital improvements and the utilization of money which had been in reserve, will lower the proposed tax increase from 6.05 cents per \$100 to a rate hike of only 1.5 cents per \$100.

The current city tax rate of 68 cents per \$100 of valuation, under the revised budget, the rate will be 69.5 cents per \$100, down from the original proposal of 74.05 cents per \$100.

Original budget projections had pegged general fund expenditures at \$970,333 for the upcoming fiscal year. Original figures for the city's gas and water departments was tallied at \$1,026,268.

Under the revised budget, the general fund expenditures have fallen by \$14,633 to \$955,700 and city water and gas department expenditures have been eased back by \$6,596 to \$1,020,268.

In other action, city fathers elected to give \$1,000 of revenue sharing funds to the Panhandle Crisis Center in Perryton.

The money will be utilized by the center to gain matching federal funds through the Panhandle Regional Planning Commission for operation of their facility.

The funds were allocated under the stipulation that future grants would be no more than \$500 each year with the \$1,000 grant this year to make up for a 2-year period.

The Spearman city council also elected to remain with their current financial depository when bids from both city banks were opened.

Spearman will also maintain their contract with the Hansford County Appraisal District for billing and collection of taxes for the 1987-88 fiscal year.

A pair of appraisers were hired by the city to complete requirements made by the Federal Aviation Administration on work being planned at the city airport.

The city also hired the CPA firm of Henton, Beedy and Company to perform and audit of the city's current fiscal year which ends Sept. 30.

Kirkland to be featured Tech speaker

Spearman girls basketball coach Jimmy Kirkland will be a featured speaker at the First Annual West Texas Women's Basketball Clinic to be held Sunday, Nov. 1 in the women's Gym on the Texas Tech University campus.

Sponsored jointly by Texas Tech University and Converse, clinic participants will hear winning ideas from the coaches of the five 1987 Texas high school girls' state championship teams.

Kirkland, who came to Spearman from Sudan, will be speaking on "Press Offense" and will be joined by Bob Shields of class AA Morton, Chris Kennedy of class AAA Slaton;

Dean Weese of class AAAA Levelland and Kathy Harston of class AAAAA Plainview.

Also included in the group will be Kelly Chadwick, head coach of the Western Texas Junior College team that finished fourth at last year's national tournament and Texas Tech women's head coach, Marsha Sharp, who has 108 career wins in only five years at the helm of the Red Raider program.

Lynxette cross county team places sixth

The Spearman Lynxette cross country team took sixth in a field of larger schools at the Borger cross country run held this past Saturday.

The girls team was in competition with schools from Hereford, Amarillo Tascosa, Caprock, Amarillo High, Palo Duro, Dumas, Borger, Perryton, Canyon and Dalhart.

Two Spearman cross country runners became medalists in Saturday's run with junior Krista Kirkland placing 12th and freshman Hailey Shieldknight placing 24th. To earn a medal, a runner must finish in the top 25.

In junior varsity competition, Spearman finished fourth behind the running of Nora Garcia who placed 16th and Kyla Nelson who placed 18th.

CofC breakfast set for Sept. 25

The quarterly chamber membership breakfast will be held September 25th in the Sacred Heart Catholic Church parish hall, announces Cora Queener, executive manager for the Spearman Chamber of Commerce.

On hand for the quarterly event will be Jan Stedje -- known as Jan Roper on the after-dinner speaker's circuit -- to give a preview for the chamber banquet.

Another event for the Sept. 25 breakfast will be the recognition of Spearman businesses which have 25 years or more of service to area residents, notes Queener.

Lynx hold non-conference finale with Sunray 'Cats

The win-hungry Lynx will wrap up non-conference play this Friday night when they play host to the Sunray Bobcats of district 1-A in Lynx Stadium.

Game time Friday night is set for 8 o'clock.

The Lynx -- off to their best start in the past several seasons -- bring a 2-0 mark into the contest.

Meanwhile the Bobcats -- having played two other district 1-AA squads -- are 1-1 for the year.

Sunray beat Gruber in their season opener, 28-13, then lost this past Friday to the newly formed West Texas Comanches, 6-27.

Spearman, meanwhile, has wins over district 2-AA Memphis, 25-12, and Hooker, Ok., 20-0.

The Bobcats bring back four offensive regulars and four defensive starters from last season's 11-3 state quarterfinalists team.

Running out of a pro-I formation, Sunray has shown an aggressive front in both of their outings so far this season.

"We can't afford to take Sunray lightly," notes Lynx head football coach Don Mullins. "They have good team quickness and are capable of scoring from anywhere on the field."

Led by quarterback Stacy Nelson (183, senior), the Bobcats boast a talented backfield. There, tailback Les Langley (178, senior) is one of their most potent threats after rushing for almost 1,700 yards last season.

He is joined by fullback Jay Hays (170, junior) who has displayed a tenacious talent running inside for the Bobcats so far this season.

Anchoring the offensive line for the Bobcats is Lane Richburg, a 176-pound guard who has proven adroit at handling opposing teams line charges.

The other big gun for Sunray is tight end Jerry Hunkerpiller (177, junior) who is Nelson's favorite target when he does throw the ball.

"Sunray plays on guts, desire and talent," reports Mullins.

"They're a sound ball club and we'll have to be in top form to beat them."

The Lynx displayed some of that form this past week when they downed Hooker in a storm-shortened ball game in Oklahoma.

The Lynx scored on three of their four possessions and displayed a strong desire to get a fourth TD as they marched from their own 7-yard line to the Hooker 11 before back-to-back quarterback sacks took it away.

"We couldn't have accomplished much more if we had tried," notes Mullins. "The kids had a good game."

Offensively, Spearman racked up 251 yards in two quarters of play while limiting their opponents to only 45 yards when on defense.

Other district games played this week saw four other 1-AA teams up their season mark to 2-0.

Panhandle trounced River Road, 41-7, while West Texas downed See "LYNX", p-2

Those decisions are not always popular with whomever brought a particular story in. After all, if it wasn't important to them, they wouldn't have brought it in to begin with.

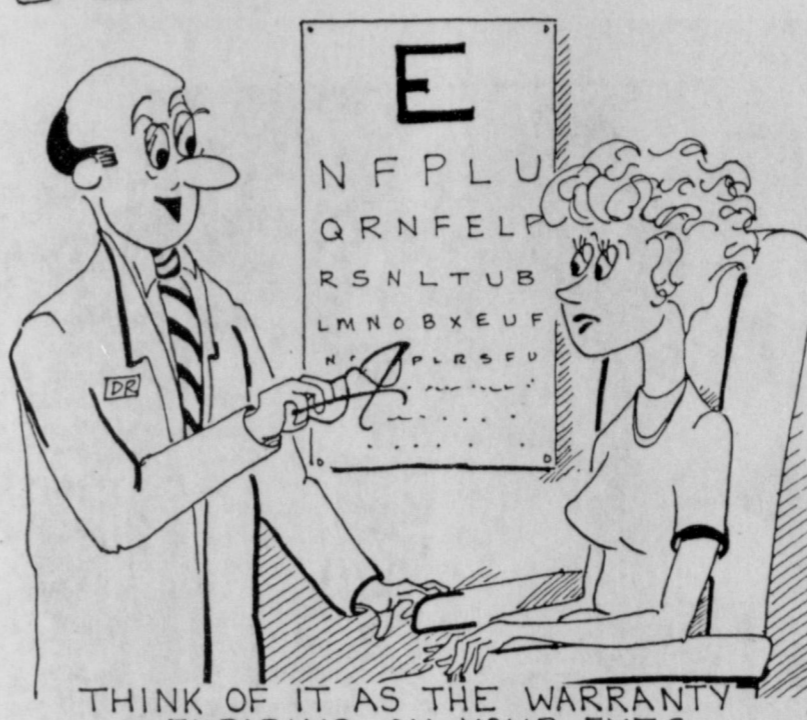
What makes one story more important than another? My first priority is -- is it about local people? They always make priority.

PATCH IT

Picture, if you will, the year 1997.

You've been assigned research duty aboard the United States' first permanently-manned space station. You're floating in the conference room sipping a cup of coffee when there's a sudden jolt, and oxygen in your quarters begins whistling out through a tear in the station's aluminum skin.

What has happened?

It appears some manmade space debris or a micro-meteoroid has penetrated your quarters, allowing life-sustaining atmosphere to escape into space.

But you and your crew members remain cool and collected as you reach for the trusty Boeing Space Patch kit stored in the hold.

Penetration damage control will be easier than when you used to repair the tires of your bicycle, because all you'll have to do is pull out a 7-inch-wide, 8-millimeter-thick patch made of aluminum tape, backed by a silicon-based, space-qualified adhesive with built-in cushioning to prevent tears from sharp metal edges.

Just slap it over the hole and go back to your coffee.

For bigger ruptures, you may have to step outside in a space suit with thick gloves. So Boeing has also developed the specially-designed Boeing Space Handle to pick up and apply large patches.

CRAMPED QUARTERS

We have just the thing for you old submarine captains, researchers who work in aquariums and folk fascinated with geometric innovation.

How about bubble-shaped homes?

In Hertogenbosch, the Netherlands, Dutch architect Dries Kreijkamp has constructed 85 large globes made of cement-reinforced plastic, with 1.2 meter-wide round windows.

Sitting in the center of an immense green field, the structures resemble a rack of billiard balls waiting to be bounced into corner pockets.

Each bubble, or globe house as Dries calls them, is intended to provide shelter for two adults and one baby.

And we mean baby -- if the infant grows at all, parents would be forced to find more linear quarters, or at least a bigger bubble, because these globe houses have just one bedroom, a combination eating-living facility and a storage room.

Dries Kreijkamp says his globe homes are better suited to an overpopulated world, because they maximize interior living, while minimizing exterior space.

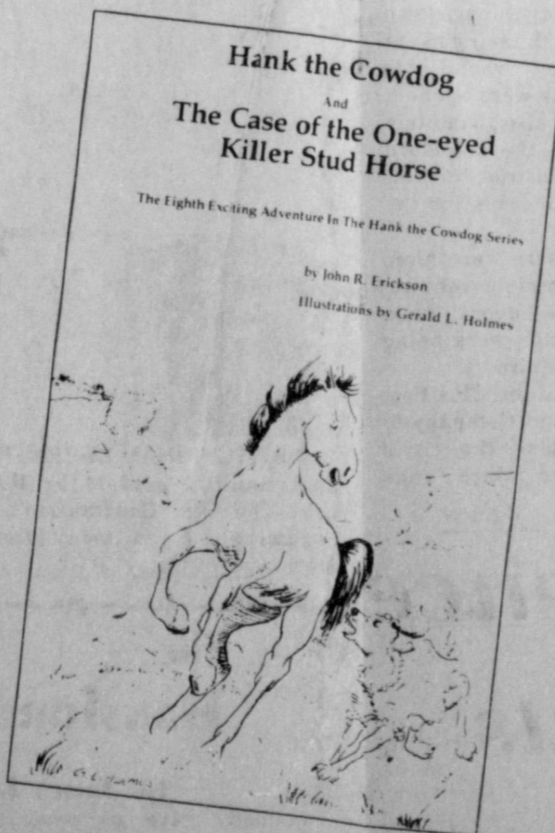
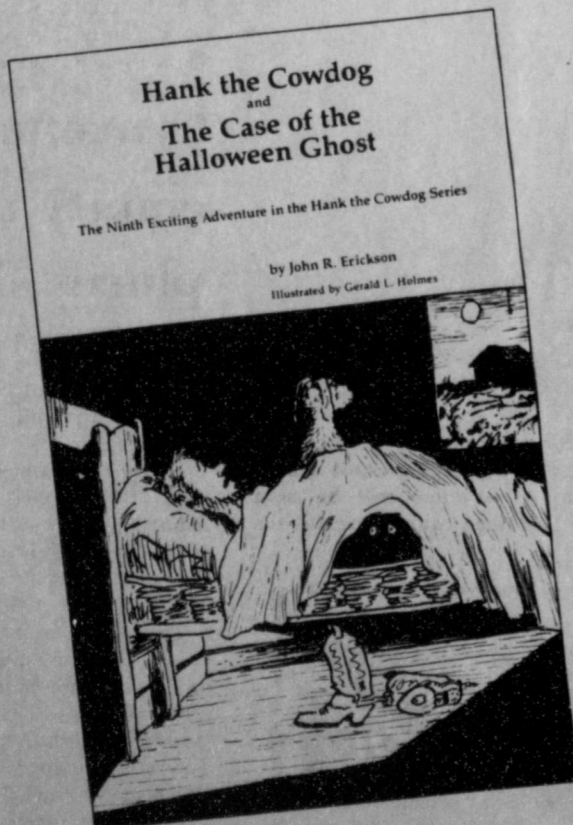

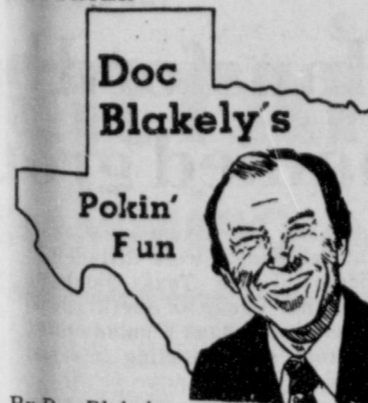

of a possible 60 to become the top scorer in all classes for the day and to capture the Oklahoma state AA championship title.

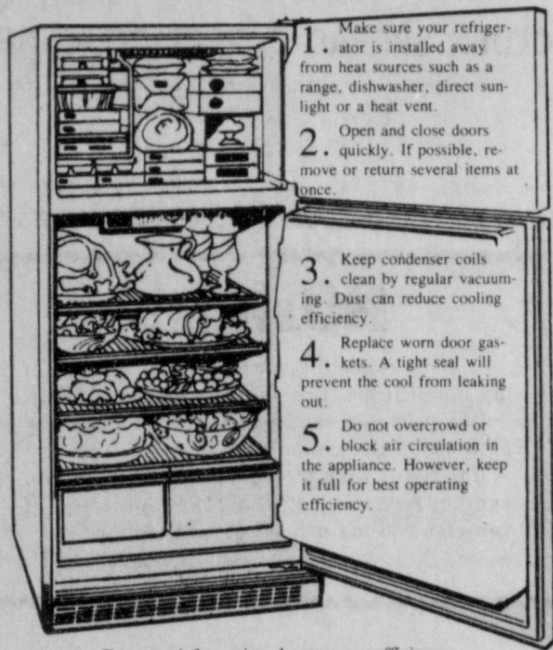
Gruver's Danny Carthel also had a strong showing in class AA as he took fifth place overall for the Hansford Gun Club.

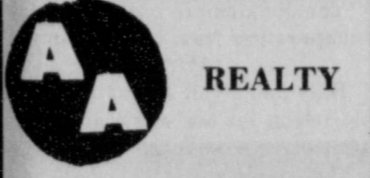

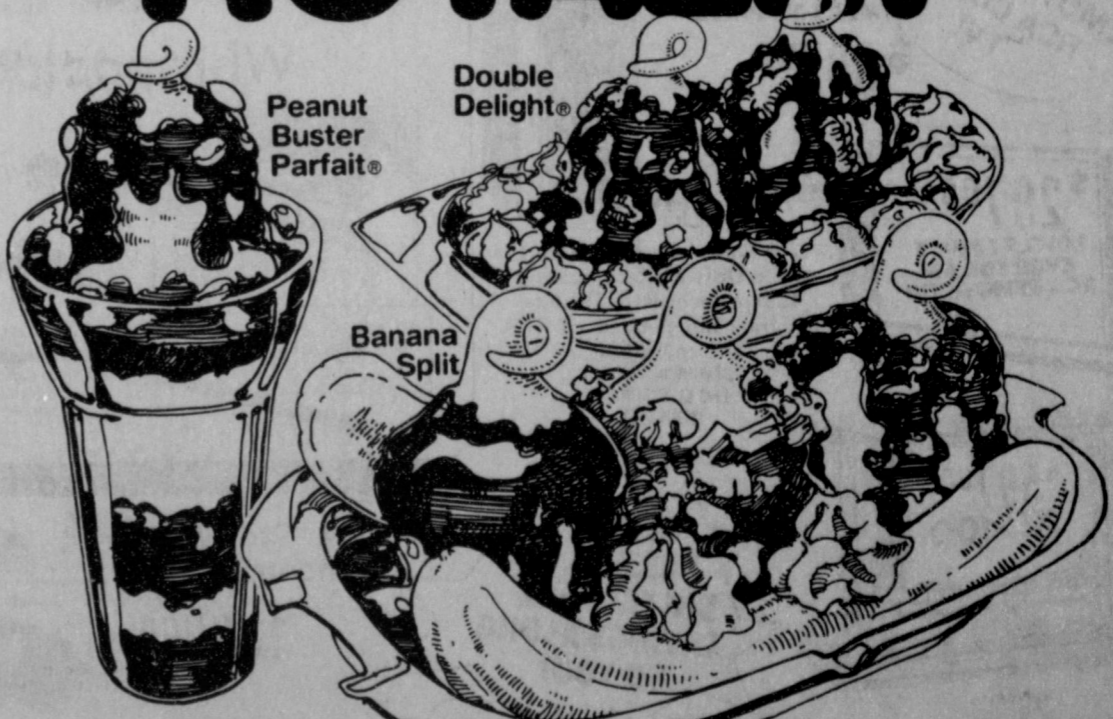
