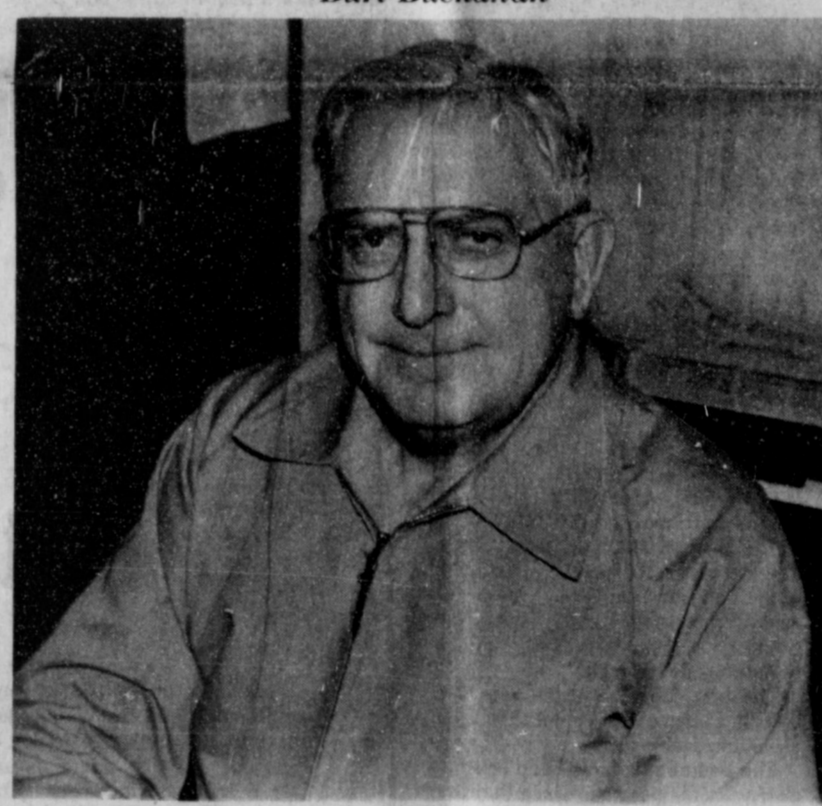

Don Townsen lead all voters in the School Board election with 255 votes followed by Phillip Renner with 241. Robert Queener received a 185 votes, Billy Brown 208 votes and Ronnie Lusby 126 votes. Townsen and Renner are the new School Board Members. In the City election 345 votes were

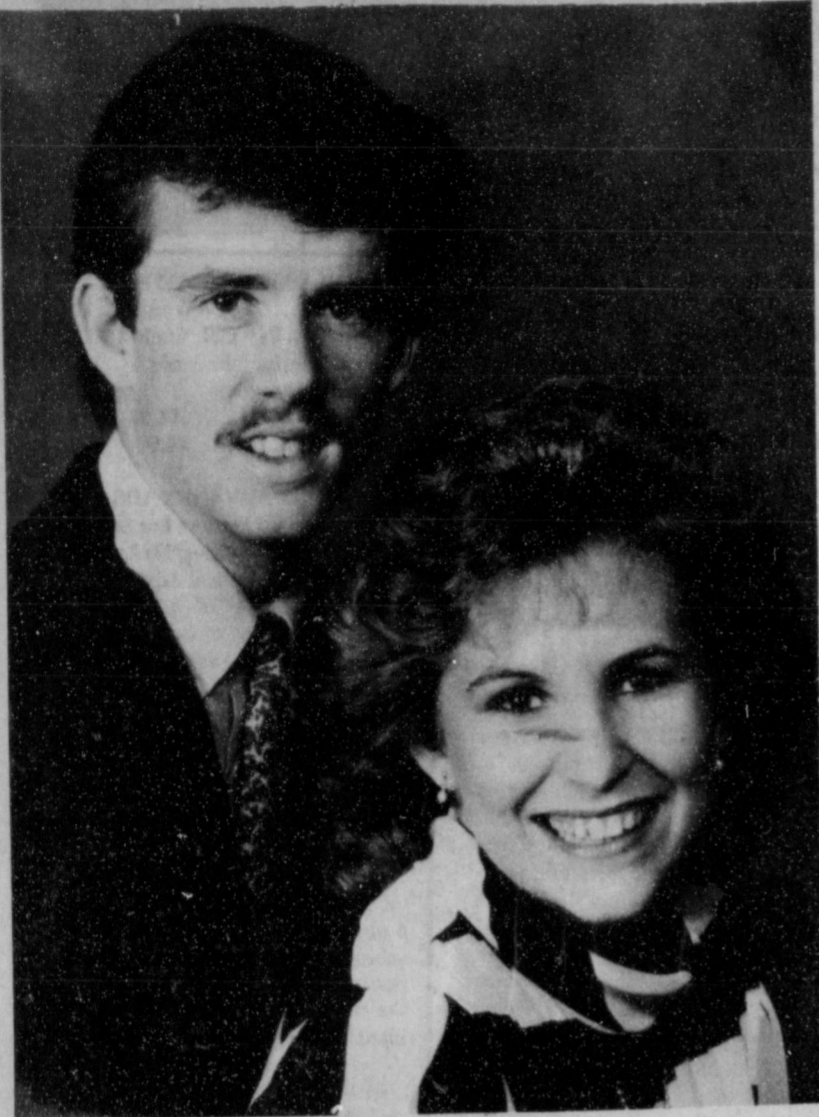

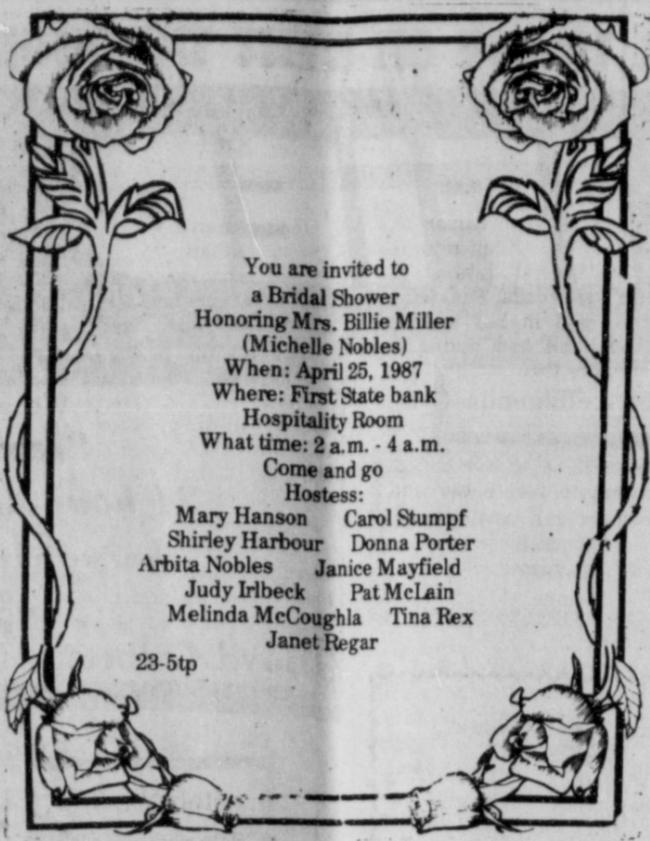

Helping children is the main idea behind the third annual benefit dance for the Children's Protective Services, featuring the Maines Brothers Sat. April 10 from 9 p.m. - 1 a.m. at the Expo Center.

The money raised is used by the children's Protective Services, one of the programs of the Tx. department of Human Resources, to help pay for extras for children in foster care.

"The state pays the (foster) family, but there are lots of things they are not reimbursed for," Jacque Seale, TDH Children's Protective Service Specialist, said.

As an example, Seale said that after the first benefit, one of the first things Children's Protective Services did was pay for one of the foster kids to attend the junior-senior prom, including tuxedo rental, dinner for him and his date and prom pictures. An extra that is very important to most high school kids.

The proceeds have also been used in the past to buy birthday and Christmas presents for the abused or neglected children in foster care. Seale said that an Amarillo bank sponsored a promotion last Christmas which provided gifts for the children. They also help with the costs for foster children to participate in peer activities, such as soccer.

The money is handled through County Judge Howard Stone's office. The funds are used for children whose primary residence is in this county, Seale said. The TDH operates the children's Protective Services in co-operation with counties.

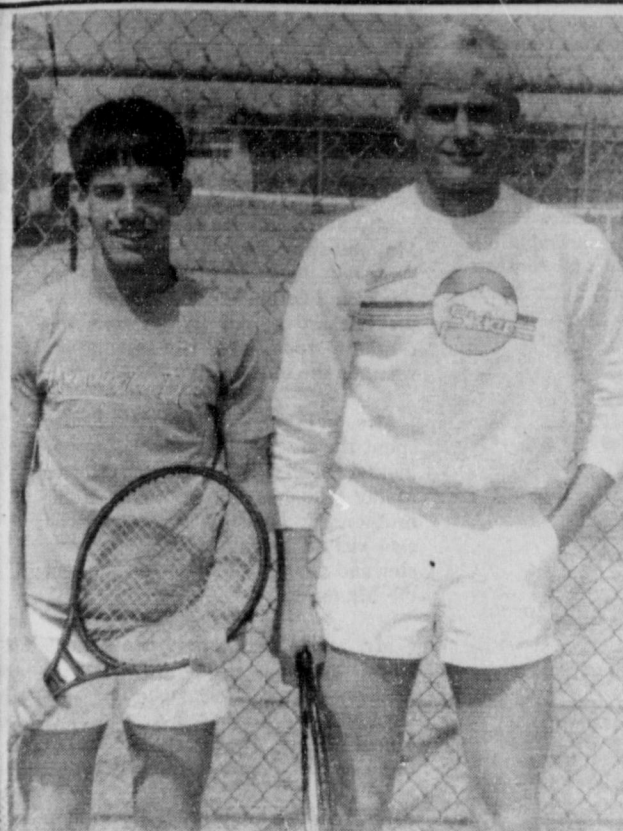
