


Armes featured artist in Perryton



Perryton Library as Artist of the Month and the Gruver oil painter has some 24 paintings on display there.

"I was very flattered when they invited me to show," she declares. "While I've sold a few pieces and have done a few commissioned works, most of my paintings are for my children and friends."

That explains why most of the paintings she has on display over at

the Ochiltree-based library belong to her children.

A woman of many talents and varied interests, Doris began painting -- one of her life-long ambitions in 1967 where she felt she had raised her family to the point where she could devote a little time to

Since then she has studied under several artists, including Harold V. Scott, Ben Konis, Lee Parkinson and has even attended a workshop headed by Dalhart Windberg.

While today she has only one of her four children still at home, time remains a problem for the rambunctious Hansford county lady. Active in many different projects, the time she can devote to

"Painting is no different from anything else a person wants to become proficient in," Armes notes. "It just takes practice, practice and a little more practice. And that takes time."

Meanwhile, her time is being shared by her husband, John who farms near Gruver, her son, Justin who is a sophomore at Gruver high school and a variety of projects which also keeps her busy.

While painting is her first love, Doris currently is working on a quilting project and is even taking classes to become more proficient in this art.

An extra room in their home in Gruver has been converted for her

use and it has become a combination studio, sewing room and hobby room for the talented artist.

As far as her talent with brush, oils and canvas, Doris tends to be her worst critic. "I'm never satisfied with any-

thing I do," she laughs. "Often, I'll do a painting then go over a part of it I don't like and completely redo it. It might not even be a similar scene.'

For that reason, Doris feels more comfortable with oils than any other medium -- either pastels or watercolors.

Symbols. Over the ages symbols have provided mankind with imagery and passion words alone could not produce.

words. They are a language, words without sound. They mean. They're symbols.

You look at them, you know what

they are. They speak without

with a tea this Sunday.

Messages. Of what? Of hope, of fear, of faith, of love and hate. Last week, 18-month old Jessica McClure became a symbol of sorts.

Millions of people across the nation, perhaps the world, watched as this tiny, 18-month old girl became the symbol of man's struggle against seemingly insurmountable

And, when she was finally rescued some 50-odd hours after her lonely ordeal began, our nation cheered. For a brief, intense moment in history, a little girl in Midland, Texas became America's symbol for hope.

But the symbolism is already beginning to fade. Friday, almost anyone in America could have told you little Jessica's name. Today, she is remembered as that brave little girl in Texas. A month from now she will be a dim memory.

Oh, there'll be follow up stories for the next few months, perhaps even a year from now on the anniversary of her brush with death. While that may seem sad, there's no real tragedy there.

Men and women have fought and died through countless ages, all rallying around one symbol or another. The tragedy is when those symbols are forgotten. Does that mean those lives were lost in vain? Not at the time, perhaps not even

The pyramid with an eye staring out of it. We've all seen it, in fact it's a commonplace adornment now. How many can tell you where they last saw it? How many can tell you what it means?

An old rugged cross. A simple band of gold. Old Glory. The bald eagle. It would appear these are all symbols which are getting less and less attention from the American

And, as these symbols fray, the messages behind them begin to dim and the words they spoke so eloquently for so long begin to lose their vigor.

America is in search of a symbol right now. Facing an uncertain economy, criminal acts in the highest levels of our government and political posturing of unseen before proportions, America needs a new symbol.

It needs a symbol speaking of truth. Of justice. Of strength. We need a rallying point, a symbol to once again feed the passions of a proud but humble nation.

Perhaps, in this year which is being proclaimed as the Constitution's Bi-Centennial, it's time to return to the basic premises this country was founded upon.

It could be we don't need a new

symbol at all. Maybe all we need to do is dust off some of the old symbols which were tucked away as embarassing during our country's more liberal movement.

Indeed, what America may need now more than any other thing is a return to the basics, the fundamental ideals which made this nation

Perhaps it's time to remember that we are, indeed, one nation under God and that God should not be barred from the classroom any more than He should be ignored in

Lynx attack Comanches in AA bout

The district 1-AA football title chase will come into sharper focus Friday evening when the smoke clears over Lynx stadium as Spearman plays host to the West Texas Consolidated Comanches from Stinnett.

Game time for the 1-AA clash which is being billed as an area high school football spotlight will be at 7:30 p.m.

Now four weeks deep into the conference race, the district title remains up for grabs but at least one team in Friday's clash could be technically eliminated from postseason play.

The winner, however, will still have an odds-on shot at either an outright district championship or a

No team in 1-AA has an unblemished district record at this point and the district crown is still up for

But this week Spearman (2-1) takes on West Texas (3-1) while Panhandle (2-1) and White Deer (2-1) face off. In the other district game this week, Stratford (2-2) ekes on winless Highland Park

Last week's action saw West Texas topple White Deer from the unbeaten district ranks in a 21-14

Panhandle effectively eliminated Stratford from post-season contention with a 21-14 win. Spearman dropped Gruver, 47-0, while Highland Park lost to LCHS, 33-12, in a non-conference tilt.

Defensively, West Texas runs out of a split-6 formation which has proven more than effective for the Comanches from Stinnett.

Bolstered by the addition of players from Phillips and Plemons in a 3-way school district consolidation, West Texas has proven formidable, boasting as much size as the Lynx have gone up against this year.

Leading the offense for the Comanches is 3-year starter Clayton Smith, a 165-pound senior who has proven an excellent all around athlete.

They are further bolstered by returning All State tight end Chad Willimon, a 205-pound senior who has played varsity now for four years and who had made all district three of those.

Running out of the tailback slot will be Casey Boyer, a 170-pound

Their defense is anchored by Billy Delung, a 180-pound junior linebacker who has proven devastating to opposing offenses when

There are no easy answers for the Lynx throughout the remaining district contests. In order to make the post-season fray, they must win their remaining games.

A loss to either West Texas or Panhandle could eliminate Spearman from even a shot at the runner-up spot.

Panhandle plays White Deer this week, then will host Spearman the next week and will end regular season play against Gruver.

West Texas has only to get by Spearman before meeting Gruver and finish regular season play with an open date.

Their post-season fates lie firmly in their own hands and the Lynx will have to be in their best frame of mind and will have to utilize their abilities to the maximum to attain the goals they set out for themselves in 1987.

published by the League of Women Voters. Information is non-partisan and factual, gathered from a variety of sources.

The guide is a basic source to shed light on issues addressed in each amendment.

First on the list is a constitutional amendment that provides for the surety from public funds of a fund to protect farmers and others who deposit grain in public warehouses.

The Legislature would be permitted to guarantee a self-insurance fund up to \$5 million. Money for the fund would be deposited by grain-buying and grain storage

Arguments for the amendment point out that state and federal regulations require storage companies to provide insurance coverage for their customers and the premiums have become unafford-

Proponents of the amendment claim its passage would allow the Legislature to authorize the fund, thereby providing Texas farmers with grain storage at an affordable

On the other hand, says the anti-amendment faction, the state should not be called on to provide surety for industries that become poor insurance or bonding risks.

There is nothing in the amendment to provide for oversight of the fund to eliminate abuse, a negative say opponents.

However, with such a fund, elevator and storage companies could obtain the needed bonding, assuring their customers of reasonable storage prices and insurance.

Amendment Two on the ballot

The amendment would allow rural fire prevention districts to assess an ad valorem tax to a maximum of six cents per \$100, on approval of voters.

The amendment would permit additional revenue to be raised through taxation for such districts to provide adequate fire protection say those in favor.

Negative reaction from opponents is based on economics and a belief that such districts could contract at cheaper rates.

Amendment Three on the Nov. 3 ballot has significant meaning to a particular segment of the population. It proposes to limit school tax increases on the residence home stead of a survivor's spouse if that spouse is at least 55 years of age.

Purpose of this amendment is to extend protection against school ad valorem tax increases on homesteads that have the 65 or older exemption, as long as the surviving spouse continues to reside in the property.

Those in favor of the amendment believe that the 55 age cutoff is justifiable while opponents argue that it gives special consideration to homeowners age 55 to 64.

The ballot's Amendment Four issue would authorize the Legislature to provide assistance to encourage economic development in the state.

The Texas Constitution now contains specific prohibitions against providing public funds for private purposes, but the amendment would permit the Legislature to foster programs.

Entities wishing to take advantage of special programs would be required to get approval of voters before issuing bonds for any project, a strength of the proposal, say those in favor.

Arguing against the amendment are those who believe the scope is to broad and that there is danger in the attempt to circumvent constitutional provisions now in force.


Amendment Five is lengthy and applies, primarily, to high population centers where turnpikes, toll roads and toll bridges might be feasible.







Comments: The Oil & Gas Journal recently reported that independent operators are recovering from the worst depression that ever hit the U.S. petroleum industry.

Bouncing back from the slump of 1986, independent producers in general report reduced losses or vastly improved profits this year. Improved performance comes from higher crude oil prices and an abasence of huge writedowns taken last year on leases and equipment.

T. Boone Pickens, general partner of Mesa Limited Partnership, believes the industry has seen its lowest point in terms of crude oil prices and rig count. He recently told the International Association of Drilling Contractors that oil prices would reach \$22 a barrel by early next year.



New regulations to affect trucks

All companies operating trucks in excess of 10,000 pounds on Texas highways, whether private or for-hire, need to prepare now for a number of new state regulations that will affect the maintenance and operation of their fleets, urges the president of the trucking industry's state trade organization.

"Legislation passed by the 70th Texas Legislature and regulations recently adopted by the Railroad Commission of Texas (RCT) apply to private carriers that operate trucks weighing more than 10,000 pounds in Texas as well as all other segments of the industry," said Robert Floyd, president of Texas Motor Transportation Association. "I would encourage every company to become educated on these regulations as soon as possible, since many of their provisions went into effect September 1."

One of the major changes is in the are of driver's logs, Floyd said. Already in effect is a RCT regulation requiring operators of Commission-certificated commercial vehicles in Texas to keep daily logs. Specifically, these carriers are required to meet Department of Transportation (DOT regulations





Turner estimates that on the Texas High Plains alone, some 75,000 large-capacity irrigation wells have been drilled since the late 1930's. Many of these wells have been abandoned or currently are not in use.

Those that have not been properly plugged or capped pose a serious safety hazard for animals, children and adults.

They also provide a direct conduit for possible contamination of the Ogallala aquifer.

State law and water district rules require such wells to be covered at all times, Turner notes. A well is considered an open hole even when the pump has been pulled for

Wells are considered properly covered when the cap can support 400 pounds and extends at least three feet into the casing.

The surface should be large enough to assure the hole remains covered if the cap is shifted to the
