

By slim 14-vote margin . . .

Voters okay school project

Spearman ISD voters gave grudging approval to a \$2.185million junior high bond issue Tuesday, with a 14-vote margin passing the proposed project as 256 voted for and 242 voted against issuance of the bonds.

In an otherwise quiet election, 51.4 percent of the 498 people who cast ballots voted for the bond issue while 48.6 percent voted against. Only 2.8 percent separated the two sides of the issue.

The SISD board was schedule to meet Thursday morning at 7 a.m. for their regular monthly board meeting and one of the agenda items is to canvas Tuesday's election results.

Once the election is canvassed and declared official, then board members can proceed with moving toward rating, then selling of the bonds to finance the improvement

# Lynx split games in Dumas tourney consolation tilts

The Spearman varsity Lynx cager crew came within six points of winning their first tournament trophy of the 1987-88 season when they bowed out to district 1-AA rival West Texas Consolidated in the consolation finals of the Dumas Invitational tourney Saturday in Dumas.

Now sporting a 2-4 record, the Lynx's four losses have been by a conbined total of only 11 points.

Three of those four losses have been in overtime and one of those was a double overtime period.

Friday, the Lynx earned the right to advance to the consolation finals when they downed Dimmitt by a 53-43 count.

Three Spearman players gained the double figure column in that matchup with Tim Wooley dumping in 14 points. Brett Davis collecting 13 and Kevin Nelson who turned in an 11-point performance.

The Spearman boys continue to be plagued with low shooting percentages from both the field and the free throw line.

Against Dimmitt they hit on nine of 17 grace shots for 52.9 percent but came up to 45.8 percent from the field, connecting on 22 of 48 attempts there.

Against West Texas in the consolation finals, however, they managed only 35.8 percent from the field and a lackluster 31.3 percent from the free throw line,

In that contest they made 19 of 53 field goal attempts and managed to make only five of 16 grace Spearman lost that contest by a

49-43 count as the Comanches claimed the win and the consolation team trophy. Against West Texas, only Keith


Benson and Nelson managed double figures with 10 and 12 points respectively.

The conservation compliance provision of the Food Security Act of 1985 will affect many farm operators in Hansford County.

This provision states that if operators produce crops on land designated to be highly erodible, without an approved conservation plan, they may lose certain USDA program benefits.

Under this provision, the Soil Conservation Service (SCS) has the reponsibility of determining which cropland fields for each farm number in the county are highly erodible.

Once a field has been designated as highly erodible, an approved conservation plan must be developed on that field and the producer must be actively applying this plan to stay eligible for certain farm program benefits beginning Jan. 1,

The conservation plan must be fully operational by Jan. 1, 1995 or the producer may no longer be eligible for certain USDA pro-

Highly erodible land is defined as land which has the potential of eroding at more than eight times the rate at which the soil can

maintain continued productivity. For a field to be considered

highly erodible, at least one-third or 50 acres of the field must consist of highly erodible soils.

USDA programs which would be affected by conservation compliance includes price supports, crop insurance, Farmer Home Administration loans, Commodity Credit Corporation storage payments, Conservation Reserve Program annual payments and other programs under which USDA makes commodity related payments.

The SCS has just recently completed the distribution of letters to farm operators informing them of highly erodible cropland fields present on their respective farm numbers.

If a farmer has received one or more of these letters or has questions regarding conservation compliance, contact the SCS office in Spearman for additional information and planning assistance.

Those opposing the issue did not seem to be against the project itself, but questioned the necessity of an all purposed gym which was included in the proposed renovation and construction.

Also underlying some of the opposition was the uncertainty of a middle school concept since most of the additional classrooms will be built at the elementary school, giving the elementary-junior high campuses a middle school look.

Once construction is finished -perhaps in 1990 -- the Spearman elemenatary will house kindergarten through fifth grades while the junior high building will have sixth through eighth grades in the west wing of the structure.

The middle school concept -utilized extensively in neighboring states -- is receiving strong criticism in Texas, especially in the Panhandle.

Two panhandle cities -- Amarillo and Dumas -- have had strong voter opposition toward moving to the middle school concept.

Voters in the Dumas ISD turned down a \$6-million plus bond issue this week as opponents mustered an almost 2-1 edge in balloting.

Most school officials in both communities agree that the largest problem concerning the middle school concept is one of misunderstanding, and lack of information available to the general public regarding the idea.

Meanwhile, in Spearman, officials will move toward getting their project started with the possibility of a contract being awarded by late spring or early summer next year.

Included in the project will be the demolition of the east wing of the junior high building, structure which was built in the

Additons will be made to the elemenatary school with a new bank of rooms added along the south edge of the current building and inbetween the current north and south wings. Also included will be the construction of an all purpose gym which will also serve as an auditorium and stage area for both the junior high and elementary campuses.



The store was located at 312 Main Street and stayed there until the partners built the building now occupied at 719 West 7 street about six years ago. The original purchase was made in January, 1979.

Kids Stuff carries a complete line of children's clothing and accessories to please the most discriminating tastes. For boys the sizes are from infant through 6, and for the girls it is infants through preteen. In addition a specialty line in maternity clothing is offered.

Among the well-known lines carried are Healthtex; Oshkoah B'gosh; Buster Brown and J.G.

The partners make every effort to buy selectively in order that no town to make purchases, Whether the need is for showers, special occasions for the little ones, or just daily wear, the merchandize is available to suit the most discern-

ing tastes. The three partners disavow any claim to being executives, although they have 15 full time or part time, employees.

They own two women's ready-towear stores, one shoe store, and a children's shop all in Perryton in addition to the Spearman store. Having a store in Perryton made it more convenient for them to oversee and manage other locations in the same town. The children's business lends itself to having more than one store since so many brands offer styles by the dozen or half dozen.



AUSTIN-Lawyers for Hispanics and students suing to end segregation in colleges say that Hispanics and Black taxpayers are footing the bill for white students across Texas and getting nothing

The lawsuit swings the reform spotlight on the Texas higher education system, the same spotlight that has recently been focused on Texas prisons, mental institutions and public education.

Whatever the outcome, observers contend the system will no longer be the same.

The lawsuit filed last week alleges the state has failed to live up to commitments to upgrade education in South Texas and bring more minorities into universities and colleges.

The lawsuit was filed by attornevs for the Mexican-American Legal Defense and Educational Fund based in San Francisco. Other plaintiffs are two strong Mexican-American groups: LU-LAC and the American GI Forum, as well as six minority student university organizations.

### **Promise Broken**

The plaintiffs seek a courtordered restructuring of funding for Texas colleges with high minority enrollment and higher minority recruitment at major universities.

They claim that minority students are concentrated in community colleges and less prestigious four-year colleges.

This polarization, they contend, is a broken promise. It does not meet the goals of a 1983 five-year designation plan worked out with the state and federal officials.

State officials, for the most part, are withholding comment while they review the allegations.

### Mental Health Lawsuit

Another lawsuit filed earlier seeks to force the state to hold judicial hearings for each person involuntarily committed to

a mental institution under state laws now held unconstitutional.

State records indicate some 2,900 mentally disabled persons in state mental hospitals and schools could be affected, or about one in four patients.

Lawyers for the plaintiffs say they believe almost all of them have never had their involuntary

commitments reviewed by a court. The state district court is deliberating whether to hear this case as a class action.

### School Finance Policy

The state judge who ruled the school finance system unfair urged school officials to oppose capping local enrichment.

State District Judge Harley Clark, who expects the Texas Supreme Court to eventually rule on the case, said lawmakers can consider repealing the prohibition of a state property tax or capping the amount local school districts can spend per student.

Compliance with his court order to restructure funding by 1990 will cost \$4 billion.

### Mattox, Moody, SMU

Attorney General Jim Mattox said his probe is finding new areas to investigate in the SMU football scandal, but did not elaborate.

Meanwhile, a spokesman for Mattox said his office will insist that the Galveston-based Moody Foundation trustees file suit against former trustee Shearn Moody Jr. to recover \$1.27 million he defrauded from the family charity.

The lawsuit would pit brother against brother. Robert Moody heads the foundation's board of trustees.







# Time, money are precious items for Christmas time

As the number of shopping days until Christmas decreases, it's easy to run out of money, as well as

Christmas is the biggest spending season of the year, yet few families plan ahead for the added burden on their income.

Since gifts are a major expense, setting dollar limits for each gift, making gifts and giving services, limiting gifts to certain members of the family or exchanging names to reduce the number of gifts.

# SWD accepts orders for seedlings

The Hansford Soil and Water Conservation District is now accepting orders for windbreak seedlings from rural landownders. The seedlings will be supplied by the Texas Forest Service (TFS) and the Colorado Forest Service (CFS).

Potted evergreen seedlings, including species such as rocky Mountain Juniper, Austrian Pine, Eastern Red Cedar and several other types, will be available at a

cost of \$33 per thirty trees. Bare root decidious seedlings, such as Bur Oak Russian Olive, Honeylocust, Green Ash and others, will be available at a cost of \$18.50 per fifty seedlings if supplied by CFS or \$12.50 if supplied by TFS.

A new Quail and Pheasant Wildlife Planting Packet is being made available this year through the TFS. This packet will consist of 25 Russian Olive, 25 Lilac, 25 Sand Cherry and 25 Skunkbush Sumac at

a cost of \$25. For further information about the seedling program call 659-2330 or come by the Soil Conservation Service office at 505 West 11th in Spearman.

The delivery date for these seedlings is March 23, 1988 but orders should be placed as soon as possible since the supply of some species will soon be exhausted.

Imagine losing your sight today. Tomorrow, how would you prepare breakfast, get to work, function on the job, read or watch television

that evening? Eye disease or injury can strike anyone, causing sudden vision impairment or blindness. It's rarely preventable—and causes one of the most devastating and difficult life-

style changes individuals can face. In the United States alone, over 300,000 persons lose their sight annually, yet for thousands, it could be saved through corneal trans-plants. Unfortunately, at least 5,000 persons each year continue to wait for medical assistance, due


to the shortage of donated corneas. A new federal law may help. Effective November 21, 1987, hospitals across the country are required to request cornea and other tissue donations from the families of dying patients. The law is expected to increase tissue donations dramati-

cally. In a recent survey, directors of the nation's eye banks, most operated and funded by Lions clubs, indicate approval of the new law.

Over ninety percent agree it will increase cornea donations, although many feel demand will still outweigh supply in some states. Eye banks and the Lions believe they

need to continue to educate the public about the need for corneas.

Communities can take action now to ensure an adequate supply of corneas for area eye banks.
