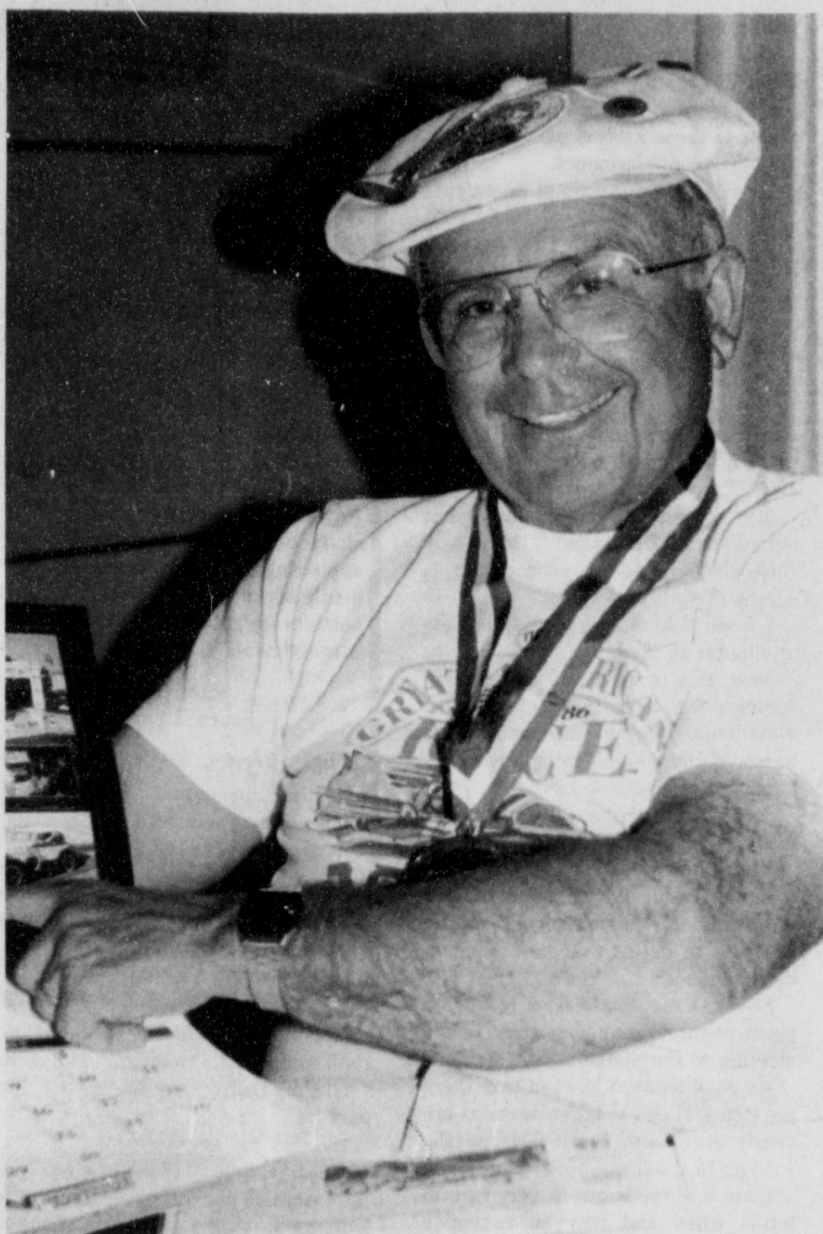

James Cunningham to travel over 2,000 miles . . .

Spearman man in national race

To many he appears to be nothing more than a mild-mannered retired school superintendent -- but, once a year, Spearman's James Cunningham dons his road cap and goggles and becomes a member of the Great American Road Race, an event which receives international attention.

The Great American Road Race is a controlled-time rally which will have up to 115 entrants on a course from Anaheim, Ca. to Orlando, Fl., in an 11-day journey across the United States in automobiles which are 50 years old or older.

Cunningham helps crew a 1936 Oldsmobile 2-door Sedan which is owned by his brother-in-law, Zeke Neely, of Amarillo. Neely's son, Jay, is another crew member.

The 1987 Great American Road

Race will run from Disney Land to Disney World with 11 over-night stops and numerous other breaks along the way.

This is the second consecutive year for Cunningham and company to participate in the international event.

"We learned a great deal last year," he notes. "We think we can be more competitive this year . . . who knows?"

It takes more than speed to win a leg of the Great American Road Race -- it takes endurance, a steady hand and mind, concentration and a good car . . . that is a good, old car.

"The rules are very specific," reports Cunningham. "You're allowed no calculators, you can't have an odometer. Each day you are given your instructions -- 12-15 typewritten

pages -- and a yellow note pad to do your calculations. From that point on, it's up to you."

Since it is a controlled-time course, drivers and their crews compete and a course which is computer-calculated to within 1/100th of a second. No small feat when traveling over an 11-day, 2000-plus mile course.

Instructions will read like, 'Proceed from stop sign east at an average speed of 30 mph' and you have to do it by calculating how fast you have to drive to make up for the time it took you to go from a complete stop to attaining your speed to average the 30 mph," the Spearman Rally enthusiast says.

This has to be done on paper. While the contestants are driving. Everything is timed from the start of that

day's leg, to the finish.

Cars are started at 1-minute intervals each day. Depending upon the number of entries, it will take from 1-1/2 to almost two full hours to get all the vehicles on the road.

Then, at the end of the day, the car and crew with the time closest to what the computer has deemed perfect for that leg is the winner.

"Last year, if you finished more than 25 seconds off the course time, you finished out of the money," notes Cunningham.

The car and crew the Spearman man competed with finished eighth on their best day and wound up in eighth place.

Their next best time had them 57 seconds off the course time and they See "RACE", p-2

I want to tell you a story. It doesn't have a happy ending. But it does have a message.

The story isn't about anybody you know. Chances are you never had the opportunity to meet this young lady. Now you never will. She died last week. At the age of eight.

I didn't know this girl. I did know her mother because I graduated from high school with her. The father lived in the house across the street from where I grew up in Dumas.

Since you don't know them, names aren't that important here. The story is important.

The little girl had leukemia. At the time of her death she had gone through more pain than most of us will face in a lifetime.

While she lived, she loved and was loved in return. In death, she knows more peace than she was ever granted in life.

She died in her father's arms last week . . . at home, surrounded by those she loved. And that was God's blessing in more ways than one.

This is just one story. There are many more. There probably have been, and probably will be, many

stories such as this right here in Hansford county.

Children are dear and special to me. Just as they are to you, I'm sure. There are very few things I wouldn't do for a child, especially if that child asked me.

But, I have a confession to make. If the child doesn't ask me, I don't always respond to a need.

If an adult member of the community broaches me on behalf of a child, I may or may not respond. And, with the economic times we've all been facing, it's become easier and easier to answer in the negative.

Last week, a little girl in Dumas asked her father to take her to the bathroom. Because of her disease, she was too weak to walk on her own. Her father bent over, took her in his arms and lifted her up.

Her body went limp and she gave her final breath upon this earth in that movement. And Daddy had to stand there and say goodbye. I can only imagine what he felt.

It will be easier for me to respond next time if I can keep that image in my mind. Perhaps it will be easier for

Combines are rolling across Hansford county with reports of dryland wheat cuttings coming in from across the area. Test weights are light -- running from 55 to 60 pounds -- and the fields are producing around 25-30 bushels per acre in reports from local farmers.

The first load delivered came Saturday off the John L. Brown farm in north Hansford county. The wheat tested 12.2 moisture with a test weight of 60 pounds.

James Schnell delivered his first load Sunday, also from northern Hansford county, again with light moisture.

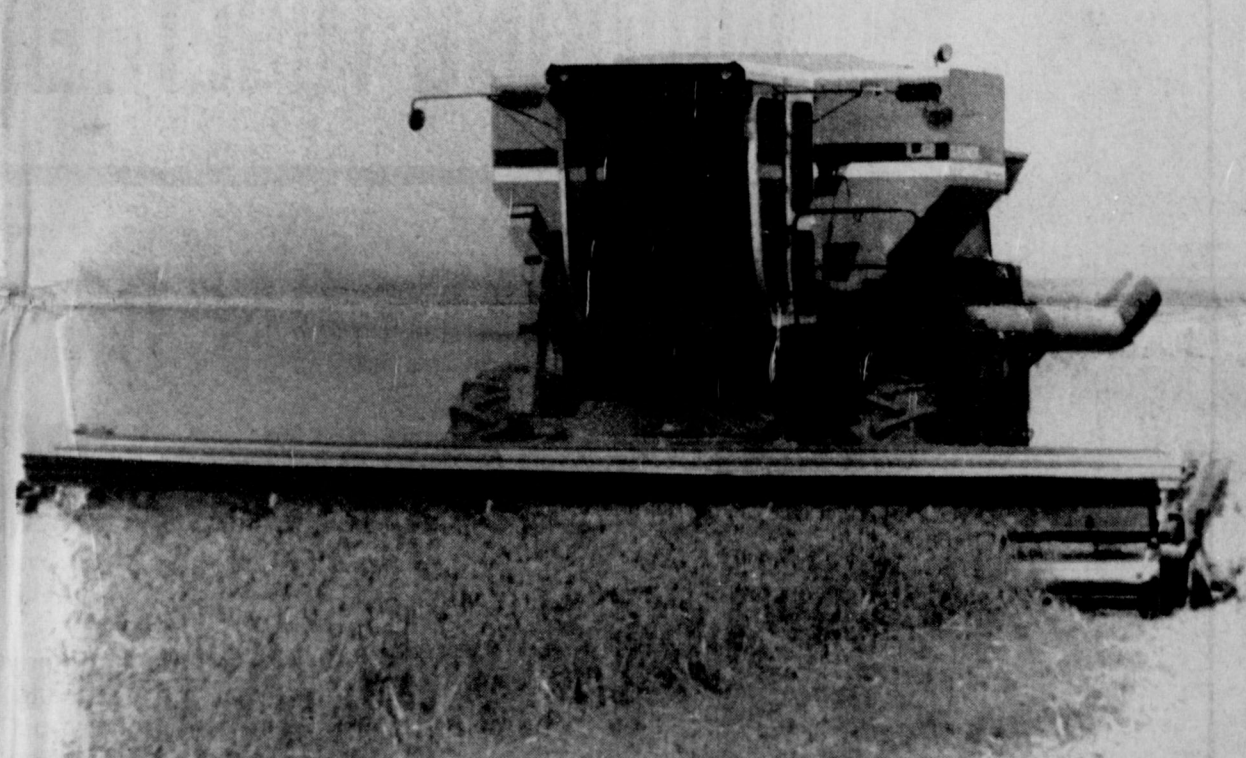
Billy Logsdon was the first to deliver a load in the Gruver area on Monday. Test weight on the dryland wheat was around 60 pounds.

As of press time Tuesday, there had been no reports of any irrigated wheat land being harvested.

The Logsdon load had a moisture content of 12.05 and a yield of slightly over 25 bushels per acre.

The 1987 harvest is expected to run through the better part of June as the county's number one agricultural pro-

Spearman Boy Scout fund drive to begin

The annual Boy Scout Fund drive will kick off in Hansford county next Monday, reports Harry Stumpf, chairman of the special drive.

Hansford Y fund drive tops \$21,000

The 1987 Hansford Y Fund drive wrapped up this past week with a total of just over \$21,000, reports Cindy Schneider and Richie Thompson, co-chairman.

The total leaves the Y campaign almost \$4,000 shy of their \$25,000 goal.

"We appreciate everyone's help and support," declares Thompson. "The Y program couldn't even be possible without the help we have received during this drive."

The Y board will meet this coming Monday where the main item on the agenda will include board member nominations and elections.

The new board members will be installed at the July meeting and this group will then have the responsibility of making funds stretch over the coming year.

Spearman swim team second in Kansas meet

The award-winning Spearman Swim Team captured 14 first place medals and set two new meet records enroute to a second place team finish at the Ulysses meet held this past weekend in Kansas.

In addition to the first place wins, Spearman swimmers also took 16 second place finishes, 12 third and 12 fourth place finishes, seven fifth place ribbons and two sixth place ribbons.

Ashley Shieldknight set a new meet record in the 9-10 year old girls 66-yard breaststroke with a time of 57 seconds flat. The old meet record was set in 1970 at 58.6 seconds.

And the Spearman 9-10 year old girls Medley Relay team shaved the old pool mark by eight seconds when they won that event in a time of 4:04.69. The old record was 4:12.7.

Carly Shieldknight -- who won five of the 14 gold medals for the Spearman team -- was 8/100ths of a second off a meet-tying time in the 15-18 year old girls 100-yard breaststroke.

She also won the 100-yard backstroke, the 100-yard butterfly, the 266-yard individual medley and the 200-yard freestyle events.

Jill Lusby captured two first place finishes; one in the 100-yard 11-12 year old girls backstroke with a time of 1:26.1 and also the 100-yard butterfly with a time of 1:25.5.

In the 8 and under girls 33-yard breaststroke, Macy Shieldknight took first with a time of 33.6 seconds.

Haley Shieldknight captured first in the 13-14 girls 266-yard individual medley while Mac Sheppard was first in the 13-14 boys 200-yard freestyle for Spearman.

The Spearman girls 11-12 year old 266-yard Medley Relay also took first place with a time of 3:45.02.

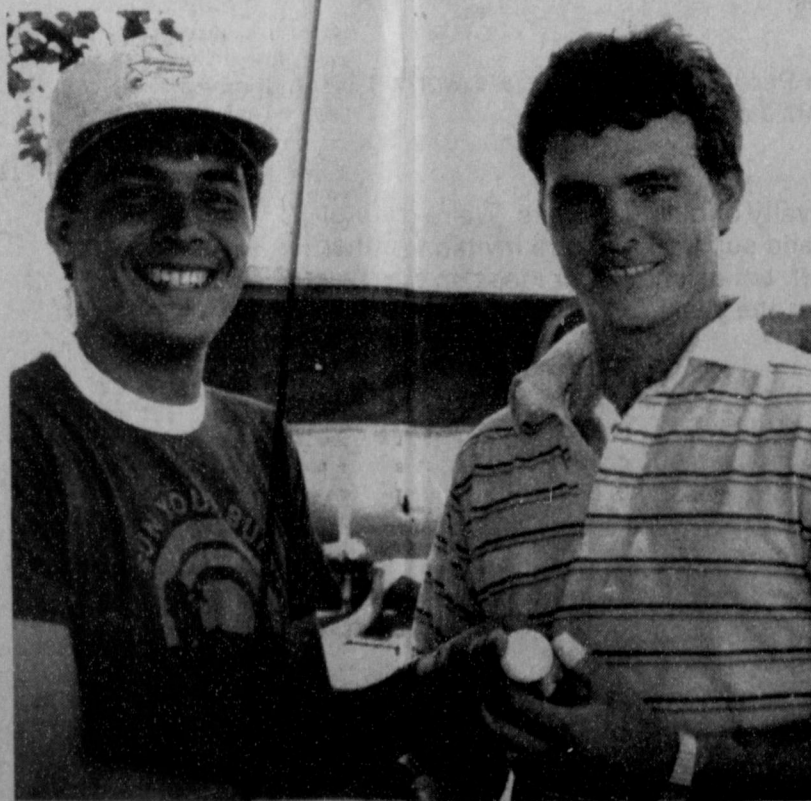

Bill Blankenship of Morse and Randy Dyson of Borger teamed up to stroke a 20-under par performance and claim the top spot in the championship flight of the 2-day scramble held at the Hansford Golf Course this past weekend.

Tindle Ramon of Spearman shot the only hole-in-one during the 2-day tournament. This came off a 3 wood on hole number four at the course.

The 2-man scramble, held Saturday and Sunday, was jointly sponsored by the Gruver State Bank, the First State Bank of Spearman and the First National Bank of Spearman.

Sub-par performances highlighted the first three flights of the special scramble tournament this past weekend.

Blankenship and Dyson combined for a 2-day total of 122 to claim the win in the championship flight.

Spearman's Tiny Gressett and Bob

Hohertz shot a 125 to capture second place in that flight while Brody Daniels and Terry Jones of Perryton played out a 129 for third place.

wound up in 32nd place. What does it mean, to place in the money? Each day a total of \$8,000 is up for grabs with \$5,000 going to for first place, \$2,000 for second and \$1,000 for third.

The final leg will have \$50,000 going to the winner, \$15,000 for second and \$7,500 for third.

Fourth and fifth place finisher that final leg will receive \$5,000 each while sixth through tenth place will receive \$2,500 apiece. \$2,000 each will go to those placing 11th through 20th.

Of course, entering the race is not an all together inexpensive proposition, either.

There is a \$5,000 entry fee just to compete. Then there is the cost of the overnight stays, meals, parts and miscellaneous expenses for drive and crew, not to mention the cost of a completely refurbished antique automobile which has to be in good enough shape to make a 2,000-plus mile journey.

Estimates by race officials place the cost of the Great American Road Race at \$10,000 to \$15,000 per entry.

"Last year we were sponsored by the Amarillo Optimist Club," reports Cunningham. "They paid our entry fee and we picked up everything else."

This year, the Oldsmobile division of General Motors is sponsoring the trip. In addition, the Texas road company of Neely, Neely and Cunningham will be furnished a motor home for the trip by English Sport-coach of Washington state.

public apathy. The details don't really matter. What did matter was the fact that I couldn't seem to get my concerns across to those around me -- meaning the other commissioners.

I tried to enlist the aid of the public. Most of those I talked to agreed with what I had to say. To put it bluntly, none were willing to appear before the commissioner's court to take a public stand.

At first I was amazed. Then frustrated. Then bitter. I discussed it with my father and concluded my statements to him with the flippant remark, "I just don't understand, Dad. They don't even care."

My father, in his usual quiet manner came back with, "That's why they elected you. . . your caring is what's important."

I hope, one day, to be half as intelligent as my father.

Now, this is what you call coming through the back door to make a statement. It's not intended to be harsh, nor are we slapping anybody's hand.

As a newspaperman, I'm paid to do many things. One of those things is to inform the people.

In that vein, I have been taught, indoctrinated -- use whatever term you desire -- to detest executive sessions by public bodies.

Now an executive session is when a governmental body closes a public meeting to the public.

As a politician, I learned that there are times when executive sessions are vitally necessary. I also learned the wisdom of the law.

State law spells out in very careful terms when and why an executive session can be called. It also details the steps.

By nature, I am not a rabble rouser. Those in the news media who do such things generally are looking for trouble. Even more so in a country town. I do not go looking for trouble.

But I will fiercely protect the people's right to know. Here my passion again shows through.

There is a difference, however, between the people's right to know and irresponsible journalism. I hope God has granted me the intelligence to know the difference. For what it's worth, I believe He has.

Somebody asked me the other day about "journalistic immunity". Prior to that, I had never heard those two words put together. I didn't understand it then. I've mullied it over since . . . I still don't comprehend the term. Chances are, I never will.

Recently, a local governing body had listed on their agenda an item which stated simply, "Executive Session". I was not able to be there for the executive session and it's probably just as well.

The law is very specific about calling executive sessions. A governing body cannot simply list the term, "Executive Session", on it's agenda. If the reasons for the executive session are not spelled out, it is illegal.

Generally, governing bodies will not only list the reason -- such as personnel, land acquisition, etc. -- they will also list the statute which gives them the authority to call the executive session.

No governing body may go into executive session unless the law is followed to the letter. If they do, the meeting is illegal. Any citizen then has a rightful complaint.

If there is no citizen there to

In addition to Spearman, places represented were Dumas, Memphis, Pampa, Stinnett, Houston, Missouri City;

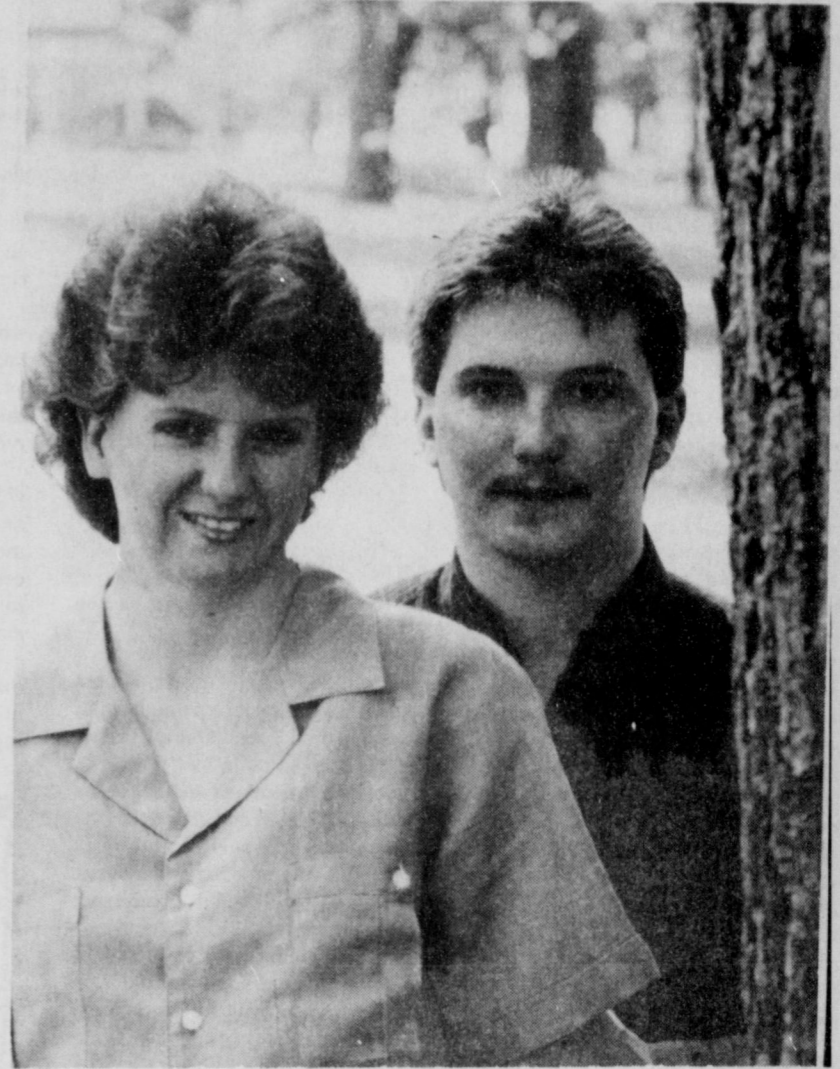



Texas post offices are burglary targets

Texas and Oklahoma continue to be the target of post office burglars, according to Postal Inspector in Charge D.C. Strader, Fort Worth.

Strader, whose area of responsibility includes the northern half of Texas (north of Austin) and all of Oklahoma, said that over 50 burglaries will occur within the boundaries of the Fort Worth Division this year if the current trend continues.

Most of the burglaries have occurred at post offices that are located in rural communities that have limited or no local law enforcement available for routine patrols at night.

"A majority of the burglaries do not involve the loss of postal funds, because very little money is kept overnight in post offices and postal stations. Safes and security containers are used to secure the money and blank money orders which are kept overnight," stated Strader.

"In addition to burglary-resistant security containers, we are continually adding and updating existing alarm systems where appropriate. However, we need for the residents of each city, town, and community to help us protect their post offices and stations from burglaries and vandalism," he adds.

Local postmaster T. Ray Robertson emphasized the need for citizen involvement. "Even though postal funds are secured in a safe, burglars who are unsuccessful in attempting to break into a safe will sometimes steal mail left in customers' post office boxes. Even when they don't steal mail, they sometimes just cause malicious vandalism."

"In either event, it does cost the Postal Service money to repair the damage incurred and for the Postal Inspectors to conduct an investigation. Our local tax money is also spent by our local law enforcement officers who incur expenses, because they are usually the first agency to respond, and they also provide valuable assistance in the investigations to the Postal Inspectors."

"But the most important reason for citizen involvement is because it causes a hardship to those whose mail is stolen or destroyed as the result of a burglary or a senseless act of vandalism," said Postmaster Robertson.

Residents can help reduce burglaries and vandalism by reporting suspicious activity at or around the postal facilities which occurs after business hours.

This activity would include such things as automobiles or trucks with license plates from outside the local area, unfamiliar people asking suspicious questions about the post office or amount of law enforcement patrol at night, or loitering in the post office box lobby or around the post office by groups of young people at night and on weekends when the post office is closed.

This information should be reported to the local law enforcement agencies and to the postmaster.

Post office burglary is a Federal crime which carries a penalty of up to a \$1,000 fine or up to five years in prison, or both.

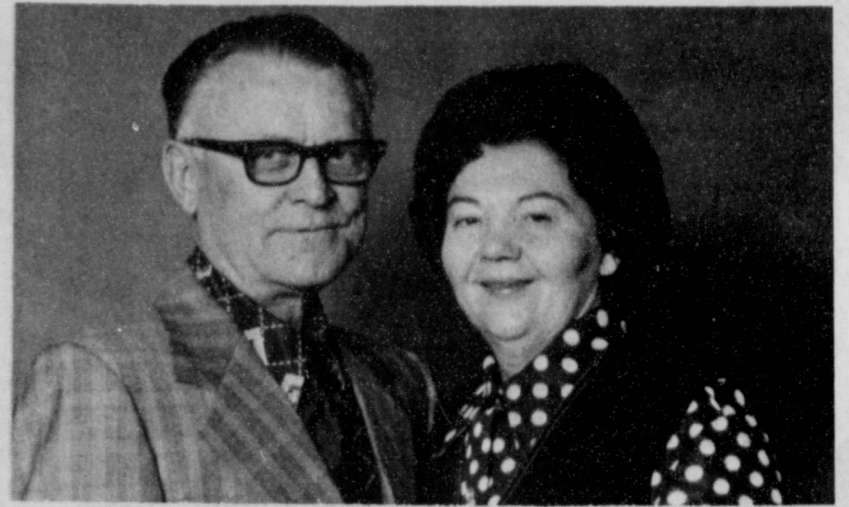
SPEARMAN - Ann B. O'Loughlin, 82, died Saturday.

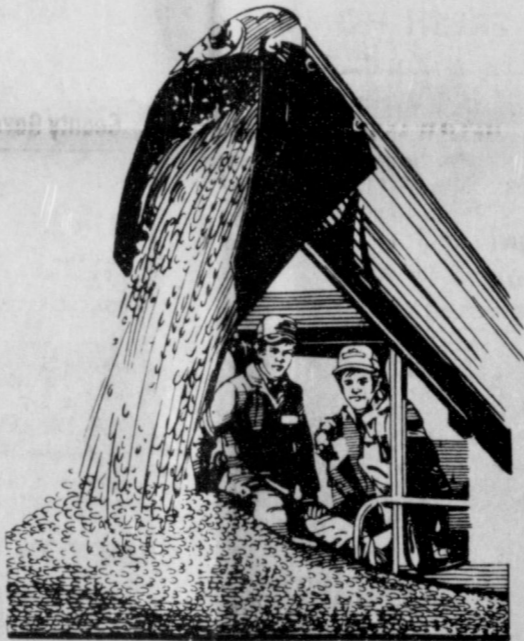

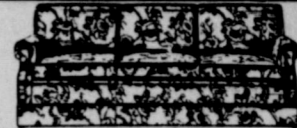
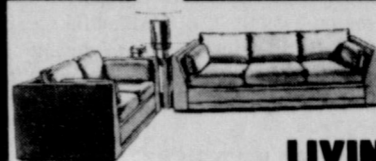
