# Murray is veteran administrator

As President Harry Truman was so fond of saying, "The buck stops here." And for Spearman city manager Jim Murray that's not a philosophical statement, it's a matter of fact.

As in most cities the size of Spearman, city managers wear a wide range of different hats and Murray is no exeption to that rule. Quiet and direct in both his

statements and views, the Spearman city manager handles everything from public relations to budgets, personnel to contract negotiations and a good deal more. "I enjoy working with the public

and, believe it or not, working with our local elected officials has been a rewarding experience as well," he notes. "If you don't like

working with the public, you really have no business being a city

According to the job description, the city manager for Spearman is the chief administrative and execu-

tive officer of the city.

He operates under the city council for the administration of all city affairs assigned by ordinance or direction of the council. He exercises broad supervisory powers over city operations. And those operations in Spear-

man range from financial management to swimming pool and parks, from water and gas operations to sanitation and landfill, from law enforcement to public complaints and any and all other subheadings which might fall under those

categories and several more.

"You wear so many different hats," Murray reports. "The nice thing about it is the fact that there's always something differ-ent. You have a new challenge every day.'

And the personable city manager has the credentials to back up his work and they've been borne out more than once during his tenure as Spearman's chief executive, a position he's held since 1980.

Prior to his appointment as the Spearman city manager, Murray had been administrative assistant at Spearman, a job he took in August of 1979.

When he received his discharge from the U.S. Marine Corps, Murray went to West Texas State

University at Canyon on the GI Bill and majored in public administra-

He received his Bachelor's de-gree in 1976 and has completed some work toward his MBA, also at WTSU.

His first job out of college was with the Panhandle Regional Planning Commission where he werved as a Public Service Intern out of the Governor's office.

Here Murray conducted an indepth study of a management information and control system for council of governments or regional planning commissions.

Later, he served as an administrative aide for the PRPC in Amarillo and duties here included

# County raises tax rate

Hansford county commissioners tacked on an additional 4.4 cents to their existing tax rate and voted to levy an additional \$5 vehicle licences tag fee during their meeting Monday at the Hansford County

The tax increase brings the 1987-88 tax rate to \$.33.37 per \$100 valuation and is expected to raise some \$1.151 million in revenues for

the upcoming year.

The \$5 tag fee will provide another \$27,000 for the upcoming tax year which will have only nine months in the fiscal year. The new fee goes into effect Jan. 1,1988. Thereafter the \$5 tag fee is expected to raise some \$37,000

annually, reports county judge R.L. McClellan. Expenditures for the 1987-88 fiscal year are budgeted at \$1,758, 643 with the difference between the expected tax revenues and the proposed expenditures to be made up from fees and fines collected by the different agencies within the county.

In other action, commissioners gave sheriff R.L. McFarlin the green light on purchase of a new typewriter, but tabled action on radios requested by the sheriff when the disparity between a pair of bids could not be answered by the sheriff. No representatives from either firm bidding on the radios were present for the commissioner's count to question missioner's court to question.

Commissioners also passed a resolution supporting a regional drug law enforcement agency which would be provided by the Panhandle Regional Planning Commission and Amarillo law enforcement agencies.

The Hansford court joins both Gruver and Spearman city commissions who have already endorsed the proposal.

# New city budget nears record \$2-million

Spearman city councilmembers got their first look at a proposed budget for the 1987-88 fiscal year Tuesday night with projections calling for an increase in the tax rate from the current \$.68 per \$100 valuation to \$.7405, a difference of

Expenditures for the next year were targeted at \$970,333 for the general fund and \$1,026,864 for the city's services which include gas, sewer, and water departments.

Total expenditures for the 1987-88 year will amount to slightly under \$2-million with tax-generated revenues of \$345,674 based on the \$.7405 rate.

Murray also noted that fees for sanitation services would increase by 12 percent under the proposed budget. Residential rates would go from the current rate of \$5.35 to \$6 per month. Commercial rates, which vary according to the sum of containers required, will also increase by the same 12 percent, he

Revenue from a host of sources including the one percent city sales tax, numerous fees and utility revenues are expected to bring in the remaining funds necessary to operate the city government, reports Jim Murray, city manager. Murray also recommended to council members that a study of the city's pay scale be made by Stephens Management Consultants, a firm hired several years back to perform a similar study for

the city government.

"Rather than an across the board pay raise, I feel any inequities which might exist can be located and corrected by an outside

firm," Murray stated.
While the budget presented to councilmembers at Tuesday night's regular meeting did not reflect any pay raise, a \$30,000 float was built in by the city manager in the event a pay raise is

granted by the city commission.
Capital expenditures are at minimum in the 1987-88 budget with two new vehicles -- one for the police department and a pick up for city crews -- the main items on the list. Also included is the city's share of the purchase of a new fire

# SISD adopts \$3.2 - million budget

The Spearman ISD board gave official approval to the 1897-88 budget Monday evening, adopting a \$3,224,841 figure which includes maintaining local support levels for teachers' salaries.

Spearman teachers are currently paid \$4,500 above the state level for a bachelor's degree and \$4,900 for a master's degree, reports SISD superintendent, Larry Butler.

Trustees then took an analysis of tax rates ranging from 86 to 88 cents per \$100 valuation to study in preparation for setting the rate for the 1987-88 fiscal year.

They scheduled their September 14 meeting to officially set that

# Hearing on Martin award slated

A hearing will be held before the 84th District Judge J.E. Blackburn Thursday morning at 9 a.m. in the district court in Spearman on a motion by attornies of James Martin who have requested a new trial following a condemnation suit jury award of just under \$14,000

The motion for a new trail requests the court to set aside the jury's verdict and judgement with defense stating,"...the trial court erred in admitting into evidence the zoning ordinance passed by the city of Spearman and the county of Hansford . . .

The motion further states that Martin was denied due process by the admission of the zoning ordinance as evidence.

The trial came about when the city of Spearman began acquiring property and air space for an airport expansion. FAA guidlines required the additions in order for the city to qualify for a federal grant to help pay for the expansion.

The city had been in negotiations with Martin since 1983 for 5.41 acres of land and air space over another 27.03 acres. Originally, the city had asked Martin to donate the land.

Following that, the Spearman city commission made their first of a series of written offers which ranged from near \$10,000 to a final offer of \$36,500 after the land was appraised utilizing FAA guidelines.

Later, a special commission awarded Martin a \$46,000 figure which was also declined by the Hansford land owner.

In other action, councilmembers adopted a zoning ordinance change in order to enable the Hansford Hospital District to make a parking lot directly across from the new Hansford Manor.

They also approved the piat on the South Park Addition subdivision to the city of Spearman along with utility and street specifications on the plat.

Councilmembers made only one change to the specifications, requiring streets to be 40-feet wide, rather than the 37 feet called for in the plans.

A June 9 jury trial in Spearman awarded Martin \$13,949.50 as total payment for land, air space and damages.

The motion for a new trial also states, "Because such evidence was admitted for the jury to consider and because statements of counsel were made that same (the zoning ordinance) was legal and binding and because the objections which were made by the Martins to such were proper, the trial court has committed error."

The motion requests the court to set aside the verdict and judgement and that the case be tried again with the exclusion of the ordinance in question.

assisting the PRPC executive director and financial offer in preparing the annual budget and in preparing regular budgetary reports.

In 1974, Murray took his first city manager's position. This came at Fritch and he served for two years.

If possible, his duties there were even more varied than here at Spearman as he oversaw 10 employees and juggled a \$350,000

In 1977, he returned to Amarillo in order to work toward his MBA. While there he worked as management analyst for the City of

Murray was responsible for the city's financial assistance program which involved federal, state and local agencies.

Here he prepared regular financial and budgetary reports, liaison coordination, did technical research and preparation of written proposals.

He left the public sector for a short stint in the private sector, serving as office manager with an excavation company in Colorado.

Then, being young and single, he set out on what became an almost one-year vacation trip which saw him travel throughout Mexico and on down into Central and South America.

Returning to the states, Murray began looking around to find what he could do to get back into the public administrative sector.

"I decided it was time to settle back down and get on with my career." he remembers with a smile.

That job has branched out and grown considerably since Murray came on board in 1979. At that time, Spearman was just in the process of owning its own natural



Oil analyst Sanford Margoshes notes that the second-quarter results of oil companies indicate that the industry is now in transition. "It's moving back to higher levels of profitability from the disaster of last year," he said.

Margoshes added that, despite the relatively poor showing of the refining and marketing units of major oil companies, the earnings of those units shoud improve in the third and fourth quarters. The reason is that, as crude oil prices remain between \$18 to \$20 a barrel, oil companies will gradually pass on those increased costs to consumers.

Last month, the average retail price of gasoline in the U.S. edged over \$1 a gallon for the first time since January 1986, and many industry analysts expect it to increase further because gasoline demand has thus far significantly exceeded expectations.
