Natural gas can remain an abundant, cheap and environment
ally attractive fuel in coming years ally attractive fuel in coming years,
but its low price has ended the incentive to explore for new gas, according to an Arthur Andersen and Co. study.
Richard Adkerson, and Andersen managing director, says the
sharp decline in drilling heightens concern about future production levels.
The study says deregulation of the gas industry has created uncerfrom longer term contracts and into the spot market.
The study also notes that fuel switchable markets, which can readily change from natural gas to
oil, have brought permanent changes to the gas industry. About one-third of both the industrial and electric generation market can switch from one fuel to another a hours or days.
