## Arson Fires

The crime of arson apparently is
becoming more profitable in Texas becoming more profitable in Texas.
The number of set fires increased 31.5 The number of set fires increased 31.5
percent in the first six months of 1986, compared with the same period in 1985, according to statistics reeently
compiled through the Texas Fire compiled through the Texas Fire
Incident Reporting System (TEXIncident
FIRS).
TEXFIRS is an automated system operated by the State Boarde of
Insurance, State Fire Marshal's Off. ice, to document the number, nature and causes of fires in Texas. Three
hundred and ten fire departments protecting 71 percent of the state population report fires to the system.
During the first six months of 1986 , fire departments reported a total of
9,045 incendiary or suspicious fires 9,045 incendiary or suspicious fires
which resulted in at least 11 fatalities, 53 injuries and an estimated $\$ 39.2$ million in property loss. The amount of property loss de-
creased 12 percent from the same

Wild Animals a Some 10,500 animal specimens,
from armadillos to zebras, were tested at the Texas Department of Health
(TDH) for rabies last year. Of these, (TDH) for rabies last year. Of these, 470 were found to carry the disease.
Although no human cases of rabies were reported in Texas during 1986,
Dr. Foy V. McCasland, chief of the Dr. Foy Vureau of Veterinary Public
TDH Bur Health, said the diseessin is a continu-
ing threat to people. He warned that ing threat to people. He warned that
anyone with pets, or who frequently
works with domestic animals, should see that the animals are vaccinated see thal the animals are vacces.
annually, ts the law prescribes.
He also warned He also warned against adopting
wild animals as pets. Wild animals are wild animals as pets. Wild animals are
the most frequent carriers of rabies and there are no approved rabies
vaccines for them, Dr. McCasland explained. He said that although a wild animal may be vaccinated with
the same shots used for dogs and the same shols used for dogs and cats,
the vacine may or may not be
effective. "A wild animal, sooner ot effective. "A wild animal, sooner or
later, is likely to bite or scrateh its owner," he added. Wild animals, chiefly skunks anc
bats, constitute about rabies cases confirmed ty TDH. Dr MeCasland said that most cases of domestic animal infection can be
traced to contact with traced to contact with rabid wild
animals. Teeting for rabies in Texas is partment laboratories in Austin,
Houston, San Antonio, Houston, San Antonio, and Ei Paso. In rabies in 275 skunks, 132 bats, 14 dogs, 14 cows, 13 cats, 11 foxes, three bobeats, three horse, two coyotes, raccoon, a goat, and a sheep.
Rabbits, sauimels rodents are not considered to be othe threats to humans because of their characterisics. "Aithough they may not bite, they may carry the disease,
and it is remotely possible and it is remotely possible for a person them," Dr. McCasland explained. Most areas of Texas have effective animal control units to enforce vaccin auion laws for domestic animals. These
