TG&Y/McCrory in Spearman has named Randy Brinkley, formerly of Oklahoma City, as their new manager

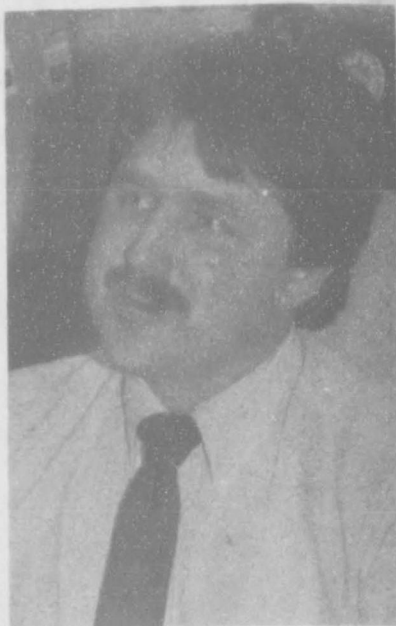
to replace Beth King who was promoted to a New Mexico store in the chain.

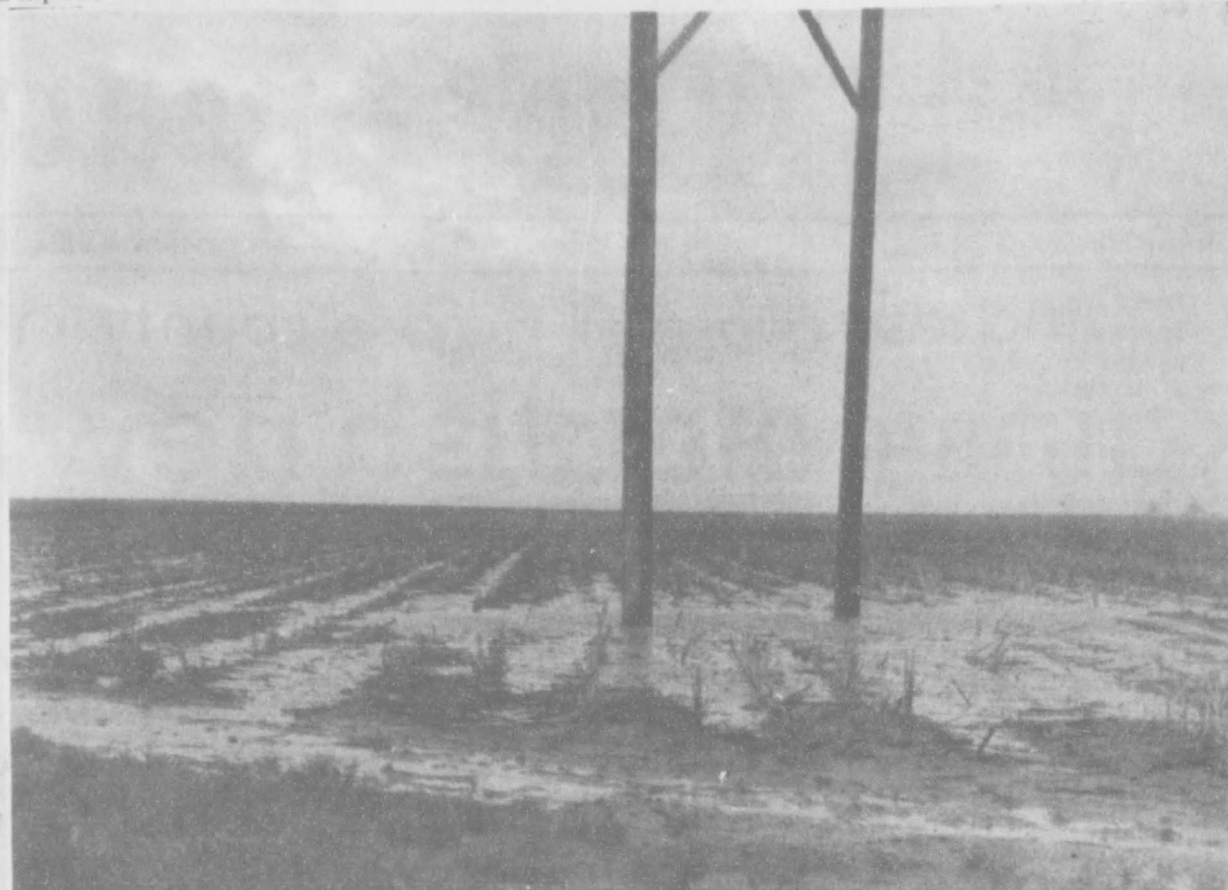

# Farm Bureau president urges no new farm program price cuts

Texas Farm Bureau President S. M. True has told Congress that excessive payments under the farm bill are the "exception and not the rule" and urged that no further reductions be made in the \$50,000 limit per farm.

True, a Plainview, Tex., cotton and grain farmer and a member of the Board of Directors of the American Farm Bureau Federation, told a House Ag subcommittee April 28 that most

farm consolidations are legitimate and within the spirit and letter of the law.

"Congress knew when they passed the Food and Security Act of 1985 that it would require additional payments to farmers," True said. He added that this was consistent with the objectives of maintaining net farm income and making the U. S. farmer more competitive and more market responsive.

"Further cuts in per-farm payment limitations could force some farmers to break up their operations into smaller and less efficient units, counteracting the move toward improved competitiveness," he said.

True urged Congress not to redefine payment limitations under the farm bill and to "be careful" in making any changes that would "weaken our competitive market position or disrupt normal farming operations."

The seminars are held in compliance with Texas Statute and Supreme Court Rules. Topics covered include a review of the newly published revision of the Justice Court Deskbook, Civil Law, Code of Judicial Conduct, Attorney General's Opinions, the Texas Property Code, Disposition of Stolen Property, the Penal Code, Probable Cause, the new Criminal Rules of Evidence and Bond Setting.

# 88th District residents want reduced state budget

Some seventy percent of residents in the 88th Texas House District believe that reduced state spending is the best answer to solving the budget crisis, Rep. Dick Waterfield, R-Canadian, announced today.

The results come from responses to a state issues questionnaire circulated to newspapers in the district. The questionnaire asked voters' opinions on the budget, lottery, tort reform, education, Homestead Act, and the role of state government.

Waterfield said the results clearly indicate the desire of respondents to reduce the cost of government in order to get the state's budget balanced.

"I am glad to see such a response from the district because it makes my job a lot easier," Waterfield said. "I realize that many things must be considered whenever you attempt to 'check the district's pulse', but when the opinions are so one-sided, I think it pretty well tells you what the people are thinking."

The most overwhelming response was that people felt government should limit its involvement in peoples' lives. More than 96 percent of the responses said that state government should become less involved in the affairs of private citizens or business.

"To me this is the most important figure on the survey," Waterfield said. "That folks so strongly believe that they can be responsible for their businesses and lives is very impressive. And, that those who can take

care of themselves will take care of themselves."

Waterfield emphasized his pleasure with the amount of response he is receiving from the district, regarding issues and specific legislation. He also encourages anyone who has a question or comment to be sure to let him know.

"Input from the district greatly helps me in my decision making in Austin," Waterfield said. "When I know what the people are thinking, representing them in the Legislature becomes a lot easier."

- 6.b. What is the most important role of your state representative? Represent District - 67.6, Fiscal Responsibility - 22.8, No Nuclear Waste Site - .8, No Income Tax - 1.7, Balance Budget - .8.

## Texas health department sponsors Buckle Up Week

"Texas Buckle Up Week," part of the national "All-American Buckle Up Week," is set for May 18-25, just in time for Memorial Day weekend and summer vacation driving. The Texas observance is sponsored by the Texas

Department of Health (TDH) Safe Riders Program.

Although state law requires all front seat passengers to buckle up, only about 59 percent of Texas' drivers fasten their safety belts, according to the latest survey by the Texas Transportation Institute of Texas A&M University. Compliance is down from 66 percent in 1986.

Texas law also requires children less than age two to ride restrained in child passenger safety seats, and youngsters from two to four years of age to ride in safety seats or restrained by safety belts. In 1986, two years after the child passenger safety law was passed, only half of the children observed in surveys by the Texas

Transportation Institute were properly restrained.

According to David Zane, coordinator of the Safe Riders Program in TDH's Public Health Promotion Division, said overall death totals on the highways are declining.

"Safety belt laws, combined with the 55 mph speed limit and stricter enforcement of drunk driving laws, have helped reduce traffic accident deaths in Texas to the lowest number in ten years," he said.

In 1986, 3,568 persons died in vehicle accidents, down 3.1 percent from 3,682 in 1985.

"But we know that further compliance with the law could make a more dramatic reduction in deaths," Zane said. He added that drivers and their passengers can protect their lives by buckling up, refraining from drinking while driving, and by driving defensively.

The Texas Safety Belt Survivors' Club, operated by the Safe Riders Program, honors persons who were spared injury or death because they were buckled up. Children who were restrained in a safety seat when a vehicle accident occurred also may become members.
