## Brazilian returns friends' visit

Returning a friend's visit is a common courtesy -- but that common courtesy was stretched to its limit this past weekend when Wilson Reis of Brazil dropped in on the Jim Fowler and Wirt Davis families in Spearman.

Fowler and Davis had visited Brazil in March this year on a special Evangelical Mission of the Baptist Church. During their stay there, Reis acted as their interpreter and a special bond of friendship was built between the Texans and the Brazilian.

"We in Brazil identify well with Texans," Reis noted in his heavily-accented English. "You are so open, so friendly and that means a lot to us."

The Brazilian is employed by Xerox corporation in Brazil and he found himself in Leesburg, Vir-

ginia, at a 4-week training school and decided to return the visit to his Texas friends by adding a week to his stay.

Last March, Jim and Virginia Fowler, along with First Baptist pastor Russ Gibbs and his wife, Vikki, and Wirt Davis made a sojourn to the community of Duque de Caxias in the state of Rio de Janeiro, Brazil.

While there, Fowler and his team which included two Brazilian girls, personally helped 300 make decisions to join the church and accept salvation, notes Fowler.

In all, the special group of Evangelists -- composed of several teams -- visited some 57 churches in Duque de Caxias, Reis' home town of some 300,000 people.

Reis' town is located some 18 miles from the city of Rio de

Janerio which is comprised of some 8-million residents.

During the Evangelical Crusade, some 8,000 decisions were recorded for the church, Fowler remembers of the trip.

Now, Reis is returning at least part of the favor, visiting Spearman and the Texas Panhandle. And, while Reis has traveled extensively in the United States thanks to his association with Xerox, he reports that Texas is the most invigorating of all the places he had visited.

"They don't speak English I can understand in other places," he says seriously. "And the way people get along with each other is amazing."

A very pronounced caste system exists in Brazil with a large base of poor, a small medium-income con-

tigent and the rich and wealthy class.

"Our poor are very poor and we do not mingle," notes the Brazilian. "I have seen things here that simply would not happen in Brazil."

While attending a church picnic, Reis was surprised to learn that -- in Texas, at least -- it is often hard to distinguish between a millionaire and a cowboy employee since both wear the same trappings.

"They actually visited together, shared the same food," he laughs. "In Brazil, that is unthinkable."

Topping off the often ignored caste system in Brazil is a country wracked by the ravages of inflation which is at a current level of over 30 percent annually.

### THE HANSFORD REPORT

Sometimes it's nice to be looked at through other people's eyes -- especially so when the reports are flattering and such was the case when we had the opportunity to visit with Wilson Reis, a Brazilian visiting with the Jim Fowlers here in Spearman.

Reis was extremely appreciative of what he saw here in Hansford County. What we take as common, ordinary, everyday type occurrences became items of amazement to the Brazilian.

A fresh look around us, being observed by an outsider without any preconceived notions can also be humbling in many ways.

It's human nature to gripe. And, all too often, I find myself proving just how human I really am.

Then a conversation with someone from a foreign country can make you truly aware of the blessings which living in America give you. Blessings we take for granted. Blessings we often forget.

In Brazil, the people fear the police. In America, all too often we don't even respect them.

In Brazil, the military run the government -- although that is beginning to shift. In America, the government runs the military.

Our road system -- second to none in the United States -- is a virtual dream the Brazilians may never see.

And, there are many, many other things that had Reis amazed as well. Cowboys rubbing elbows with millionaires. In fact, like many of us, the Brazilian wasn't even sure who the millionaires were.

Listening to his stories of the abject poverty so prevalent in Brazil -- where the minimum wage is about \$40 American a month -- is heart-rendering to us. It's commonplace to the native Brazilians, however.

In America -- especially so in Texas -- we wouldn't stand for it. In Brazil, it's a fact of life.

It makes one proud to be an American, especially a Texan, when you listen to such as Wilson Reis. More importantly, Reis was proud to be talking to a Texan. He claims Brazilians identify better with Texans than with any other people in the entire United States.

"I have traveled extensively in the United States," he declares, "and Texans are the best people of them all."

Reis, my friend, you'll find no argument on that declaration. Not in Texas, anyway.

week, reports Larry Butler, SISD school superintendent.

The temporary repairs were finished in time for the start of the 1987-88 school year to ensure student's and teachers' safety in the over 60-year old building.

School officials, meanwhile, have been researching the best and most cost-effective method of solving the building problem on the junior high campus.

"Something will have to be done, we know this," notes Butler. "The important thing is to do it in the most cost-effective manner possible. This is one reason we elected to make temporary repairs. . . to give us time to make the proper decision."

Problems with the building surfaced about two years ago and became critical this year as outside walls began showing an extreme bow and cracks which ran from the outside brick facade through the building and interior walls began to show.

Buying time, school officials decided to make temporary, make-

shift repairs to the building. These repairs consist of steel rods being placed first, at an angle, then parallel to the east wall throughout

the east wing of the complex. Steel plates were welded into place on the outside walls, giving See "SCHOOL", p-2

## Mullins listed in top 10 of all state AA coaches

Coach Don Mullins of the Spearman Lynx has attained the rarified atmosphere that most coaches dream about -- he is ranked among the top 10 coaches of all time in state class AA circles.

With a career record of 106 wins, 57 losses and only five ties, Mullins boasts a winning percentage of .646 and ranks ninth in class AA coaching circles, according to a recent release in Dave Campbell's Texas Football magazine.

Just ahead of him -- by a slim margin of one victory -- is Panhandle coach Stocky Lamberson with a career record of 107-48-3.

Jim Eddins -- of the seemingly omnipotent Seagraves football crew -- has a career mark of 142-30-1 and is ranked third overall in the state.

## Lynx scrimmage Shattuck in first preseason contact

Fine tuning of the Spearman Lynx gridiron machine will begin Friday evening when the Lynx travel to Shattuck, Ok., for both varsity and junior varsity scrimmage action.

This will be the first look the Spearman coaching staff will have of their charges up against outside competition.

The inter-state scrimmage will begin at 7:30 that evening in Shattuck, reports Lynx head coach Don Mullins.

The Lynx now have four full days of contact drills under the belts and are being plagued by nagging, minor injuries the Spearman head mentor notes.

"We're not that bad off," he states. "Really, we're right on schedule for this time of the year."

As of presstime, however, a total of 11 players were either sidelined or seeing limited action as 2-a-days continued for the Lynx.

Most of the injuries are limited to bumps and bruises, notes Mullins. Only a few of the injuries will sideline any player.

Gerald Bland and Shawn Cook are on the injured list with bruised thighs while Stan Brandt suffers from a sore hamstring.

Brooks Beck has a wrist injury while lineman Matt Tucker is nursing bruised ribs. John Hughes has a bruised hip and Tony Pacheco has a bruised calf.

The season tickets will go on sale to the general public next week, notes school superintendent, Larry Butler.

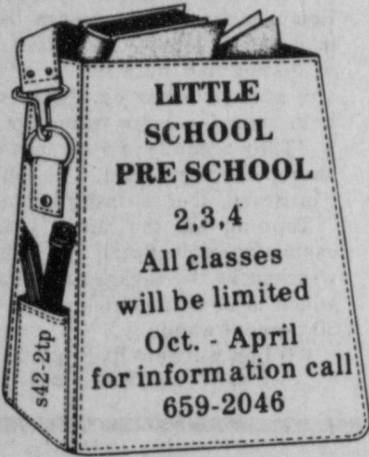

the building the stability required to hold classes in the building this year.

The SISD board of trustees have already reviewed a series of plans submitted by an Andrews architect which run the gamut from razing the east wing only to razing the entire junior high complex and starting from scratch.

The proposed plans carried price tags running from just under \$2-million to just over \$5-million.



One plan called for the building of a competition gym on the high school campus.

Trustees made several suggestions to some of the proposals and asked the architect to incorporate them into the plans and to present these redrawn plans to the board.

Those plans may be available at the next regular board meeting Sept. 14, reports the Spearman school superintendent.

Meanwhile, classes will go on as scheduled in the east wing of the junior high campus this school year, he notes.

The problems at the junior high arise from several modifications made to the 60-plus year old building.

A series of renovations over the years saw some load-bearing walls removed in order to enlarge classrooms along with the pouring of a cement floor on the second story of the structure.

Those floors are braced by steel beams which sit on a 3-inch lip of brick column along the outside walls. This weight load is the main suspect in the extreme bowing of the outside walls of the building.

30 of their Cruzados to make one American dollar," remembers Fowler. "Now, just four months later, it takes 60 of them to make a dollar."

The inflation and caste systems shows up in other ways as well, with the Reis family employing a live-in maid for what amounts to about \$10 a week in American currency.

While in Spearman, the Fowlers took Reis around to see the sights -- and that included a tour of the Hansford County Jail. It and Sheriff R.L. McFarlin gave the Brazilian another cause for amazement.

"In Brazil, the police are feared," he reports. "The relationship here between the people and your law enforcement is amazing."

McFarlin extended the typical Texas hand of fellowship and even went as far as making Reis an honorary deputy of Hansford County.

"I am amazed," Reis smiles. "And your jail, why it is a hotel compared to the ones in Brazil. There simply is no comparison."

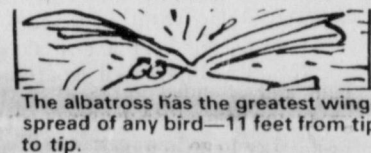
The Brazilian also heaped praise upon the city of Spearman as well, declaring "I have never seen a rural city that is so clean and neat. It is wonderful . . . there are no snobs, no division among your people."

While here, Reis was also impressed by the technology utilized in both farming and feeding, another aspect of what Texans have come to consider commonplace.

And, his visit to a modern cattle feeding operation also left the Brazilian somewhat envious of the Texas method of agricultural industry.

Reis and his brother are involved, in a limited way, with agriculture in Brazil. The two men own a modest pork operation with some 150 hogs on feed in Brazil.

The Brazilian left Wednesday morning for his native country, taking with him stories he can relate to his wife and three sons in Duque de Caxias.

**DPS urges caution**

**TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY, NEWS RELEASE**

Texas Department of Public Safety officials are asking all drivers to begin thinking about the safety of school children as the beginning of a new school year commences.

The first few weeks of school are the most dangerous, according to Major V.J. Cawthon, Regional Commander for the Texas Department of Public Safety. "This time of year presents safety problems for both the school children and the driver," Major Cawthon explained. "Many youngsters are attending school for the first time and others might be going to a different school where they are unfamiliar with local traffic conditions."

Another problem is that during the summer vacation some drivers have gotten out of the habit of being alert for both school zones and school buses. "Every year there appears to be an unnecessary rash of accidents caused by drivers who fail to follow safe driving habits for a stopped school bus," Major Cawthon stated.

Texas state law requires drivers on the same roadway as a school bus that is stopped to load or unload students, to also stop until the bus driver has turned off the flashing red lights. This law applies unless the vehicle is separated from the bus by a divided highway with a median strip.

Let's all work together to make this a safe school year for our children by observing the speed limits in school zones and be alert for increased pedestrian traffic in neighborhoods at the beginning and ending of each school day.

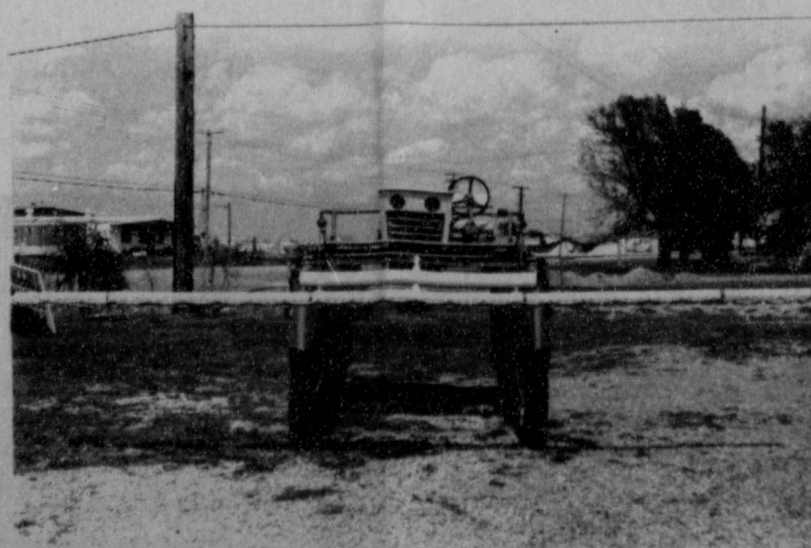

T. Boone Pickens, Jr., general partner of Mesa Limited Partnership, recently predicted a rise in natural gas prices for the energy industry. He expects the spot price for gas to reach \$1.75 by the upcoming winter.

An economist for the Independent Petroleum Association, Richard Sparling, also believes natural gas prices will rise although he sees a slow climb. "I think the average price will push \$2.00 in 1987, but I see a gradual increase over the longer term, not a quantum jump," Sparling commented (The New York Times, August 9, 1987). The economist also foresees a 10 percent annual increase in natural gas prices for the next five years.

In Midland, Texas, another oil executive is looking to higher natural gas prices to lead the recovery in the industry. "If the Permian Basin makes a comeback, it will be through natural gas, not oil," Clayton Williams, Jr. commented. Although an expected recovery of natural gas markets "has been two years out for the past five years," Williams pointed out that it is bound to happen. "When the gas price moves," he adds, "that's when you'll see the rig count could get about 1,200-1,500" (Houston Post, August 9, 1987).


