Family has different type project

Family projects will take on a new definition now that Roy and Martha Boyd and their son, Scott, of Amarillo have placed in a national event with the fruits of their family project -- a modified 1977 Chevy Vega Stationwagon.

The Boyds -- with Scott in the drivers' seat -- took fourth place in the ET bracket of the Super Chevy Sunday races held June 20-21 at the Amarillo Speedway.

The ET bracket -- Estimated Time -requires a special type of driving skill. Not only is speed important, but timing plays as important a factor. Before the race begins, drivers

mark their estimated time for making the 1/4 mile strip. In the Boyd's case, they estimated their time at 13.35 seconds

Then drivers make eight to ten runs through the strip. The driver who most consistantly runs his estimated time each run is the winner. Go ahead, estimate 35 hundredths

of a second Roy, 48, and his son, Scott, 27, worked in their spare time over the course of some eight months modifying the 1977 Vega in Roy's garage here in Spearman.

It was a natural for Roy who quit a mechanic's career to become the local

Beaver Express agent in Spearman. And it was a new experience for Scott.

"This is something I've always been in interested in," laughs Roy. "Scott and I were talking one day last fall and, the next thing you know, we're rebuilding a car.'

How much does a project like this cost. . . not as much as a person would think. At least, not if you have a lot of friends.

"We probably have about \$500 of our own money tied up in the car," reports the older Boyd. "But most of everything was given to us. We couldn't have done it otherwise."

Those donations include the car

itself which was given to the Boyds to rebuild.

The Boyds took out the standard 4-cylinder Vega engine and dropped a rebored 400 cubic inch V-8 into the wagon.

If the worth of a man can be measured by the number of lives he touched, then Nick Gray made an indelible impression here in Hansford county

With his casual manner and almost infectious smile, Nick had become a steady and dependable hand here at the newspaper. There was little he wouldn't attempt in order to put the paper together.

The lives he touched are recorded in pictures within these pages and in countless pages which ran before -the record a lasting one which will grace countless scrap books in both Gruver and Spearman and be permanently bound in the archives here at the newspaper office.

Being a newspaper photographer can be a thankless job. Few people are totally satisfied with their own portrait in the newspaper and -- like the fabled fisherman -- a good photographer is always chagrined by the "one that got away"

Nick not only took the pictures, but he developed the film and printed

them as well. His expertise came from the school of hard knocks. We all know what a demanding teacher experience can be.

In the few short months that I've been associated with Nick, I watched his raw talent with the camera become refined and polished. He was developing into an excellent photojournalist.

That is no small accomplishment for a man who switched careers at the age of 54. Because of Nick the old cliche will have to be modified to "You can't teach an old dog new tricks -- unless the old dog is willing to learn."

Nick was willing and eager. And our readers have been the beneficiary of his ability to learn.

There are many who may not have known Nick other than as the paper's photographer. And that's alright. Nick wasn't out to impress anyone. He was a man doing his job and, for the most part, doing it well.

Just in the few short months we've been in Hansford county, Nick's camera recorded hundreds of shots, hundreds of people. Many of you have had your life affected in a small way by

A pair of rulings from the Federal **Energy Regulartory Commission** the customers they serve -- including Hansford county customers served by North Plains Electric Cooperative out of Perryton.

The ruling is in favor of Golden Spread Electric Cooperative -- a power company cooperative which is comprised of 12 members cooperatives in both Texas and New Mexico.

Golden Spread member cooperatives serve more than 90,000 customers in 48 counties in Texas and New Mexico, including the seven counties covered by the North Plains Electric Cooperative.

The FERC and PUC rulings follow Golden Spread protests over two wholesale rate increases by their power supplier, Southwestern Public Service Company (SPS) Judges for the FERC have ordered substantial reductions in wholesale rates charged by SPS in addition to the refunds. Currently, Golden Spread is waiting for the FERC to complete its review of the initial decisions of the administrative law judges rulings.

"The electric cooperatives are working together through Golden Spread to achieve lower wholesale rates and to resolve common problems," reports J. C. Roberts; chairman of the Golden Spread board of directors.

In the three years since its inception, Golden Spread and its members have protested two wholesale rate increases by SPS.

Meanwhile, Hansford county rural residents, served by North Plains, may realize more stable rates for electric power.

North Plains Electric Cooperative, headquartered in Perryton, is one of the members of Golden Spread. Besides Hansford and Ochiltree counties. North Plains also serves customers in Lipscomb, Hemphill, Wheeler, Hutchison, and Roberts counties of the Texas panhandle.

Grande Electric Cooperative, serves along the U.S./Mexico border, but will not purchase electricity from Golden Spread at this time.





Junior rodeo entry deadline set Friday

Entry deadline for the annual Hansford county Junior Rodeo and Team roping is Friday, reports Burt Williams, extension agent for Hansford county.

No late entries will be accepted for this event which will run off beginning at 11 a.m. on Saturday, July 11, in the Oscar Archer arena in Spearman.

Boy and girl all around buckles in each age group as well as first place buckles for each event are up for grabs in the annual junior rodeo. In addition, pay-back in all events in all age divisions will be awarded.

There will be an open jackpot team roping to follow the conclusion of the rodeo. Payback, no buckles, will be awarded here.

Entries may be picked up at the Hansford county extenion office at the courthouse in Spearman.

Entry fees are \$8 for boys and girls seven and under, \$10 for boys and girls 8 to 13-years old.

Events for the 7 and under bracket include pole bending, barrel racing, stake race, goat ribbon and calf riding. Events for the 8-10 year old brack and the 11-13 bracket include barrels, poles, stake race, goat tying, break-away roping and steer riding.

In the jackpot team roping, there will be brackets for junior team--13 and under -- and for senior team roping with ages from 14-18. Entry fee for both is \$13.

In the junior team roping, a junior contestant may rope with an adult. Contestants may enter as many times as they like.

In the Open Jackpot Team Roping which will follow the junior and senior roping events, entry fee is #35 for three head. Books open at the conclusion of the junior rodeo. Entries close after the first steer is run.

Golden Spread is the only electric cooperative subject to the jurisdiction of the FERC. In addition to regulating Golden Spread, the FERC regulates 186 investor-owned electric utilities, five federal power marketing agencies and oil and gas pipeline companies.

The federal agency, in an order dated June 18, authorized Golden Spread Electric Cooperative to wholesale electric power which is purchased from SPS to its 12 member electric cooperatives.

Golden Spread's unique status as a FERC regulated cooperative is due to the fact that Golden Spread has received no loans from the Rural Electrification Administration.

All of the Golden Spread members are locally owned, non-profit electric distribution cooperatives which serve individual customers.

Ten of the Golden Spread member cooperatives are located in the Texas Panhandle and on the South Plains. One member serves in the Oklahoma Panhandle while a 12th member, Rio



Born June 5, 1932 in Kansas City, Kan., Mr. Gray was 55 at the time of his death. He died Sunday, June 28 in Perryton. He suffered a heart attack while attending a church supper and was rushed to Ochiltree General Hospital. Doctors were unable to revive him.

A veteran of the Korean conflict. Mr. Gray served as a marine corpsman for the United States Navy.

He resided at 209 Lonita Drive in Spearman where he had lived since 1984. He had worked in the oil and gas business for several years before joining the newspaper last year. Mr. Gray is survived by his wife,



Hansford county farmers -- already beset by a less than hoped for wheat crop -- are now faced with another dilemma about what to do with the 1987 crop they are harvesting and the options open to them promise only a limited cash flow.

The dilemma is complicated by the grain market, the county loan rate established by the U.S. Department of Agriculture, an appropriations bill stalled in the U.S. congress and federal payments grain producers have applied for.

At present, the \$2.15 per bushel market price appears attractive when compared to the \$2.15 per bushel USDA-established loan rate for Hansford county.

Under the loan through the federal Commodity Credit Corporation, the farmer would net \$1.95 per bushel after paying storage fees and other reductions.

But, that is where the problem begins, report commercial grain handlers in Hansford county.

The biggest problem seems to be in the disparity in the USDA loan rate between counties. The CCC loan rate in Potter county is \$2.36 a bushel while in Sherman county the rate is \$2.19.

While the disparities have been questioned, no good answers have been forthcoming from the state and Washington, D.C. offices of the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service.

The ASCS administers the federal commodity programs.

Most producers expected a rate some 12-13 cents higher. The 1986 rate was \$2.28 per bushel which gave farmers a net of around \$2.09.

The cash dilemma is develop with Hansford producers in the middle of the 1987 harvest. It's a dual problem of no money received on applications already made and no money appropriated for the current crop. In short, the USDA is out of money

The funds, in the form of an emergency agriculture appropriations bill, are tied up in congress. And the farm payment bill is carrying a list of amendments -- from AIDS testing to nuclear arms control.

The stalemate now appears to be over the Arms Control amendent to the appropriations bill.

"I ve been expecting to hear some-thing any day now," reports Keith Martin of the Hansford county ASCS office. "We're hoping to get the bill through congress this week."

Meanwile, payments due from the federal govenment are running 90 days behind to both elevators and grain producers alike from advances See "FARMERS" p • 2

Federal grand jury indicts 9 in mail fraud

On June 24, a Federal Grand Jury in Fort Worth, TX, returned a 40-Count Indictment charging nine defendants with mail fraud, wire fraud, aiding and abetting, and conspiracy, involving a distributorship franchise scheme, according to D.C. Strader, Postal Inspector in Charge, Fort Worth Division, Fort Worth, TX.

Strader said that the nine defendants were part of a scheme that defrauded investors beginning in March, 1985, and continuing through December, 1986. Approximately 700 investors throughout the United States answered ads in local newspapers and purchased distributorships ranging in prices from \$7,900 to \$9,900 each. Over one-half of the investors did not receive all of the merchandise for retail marketing as promised in the distributorship agreements.

The companies named in the Indictment included - Raphael Cosmetics, Inc., 8150 Brook Drive, Dallas, TX 75247; Max, Inc., 7929 Brook River Drive; Movies, Inc., 7929 Brook River Drive

The nine defendents indicted were Carl Ray Helms, Charles Vandervort, Paul Earl Briggs, Larry M. Stout, Shirley Harris, Dennis Harris, Fred Ellis, Carl Dunn, and Ron Perry.

Strader said that Assistant U.S. Attorney Jane Jackson is assigned to the case and has worked closely with Postal Inspectors in the Dallas office throughout this investigation.

Texas Affiliate, fireworks are not always handled by professionals and many fireworks are readily available both legally and illegaly. The result is an alarming number of injuries each

The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission estimated that 12,600 people were injured in fireworks-related accidents in 1986. Alarmingly, these injuries have increased 22 percent over the 1985 figures.

While some of the 1986 increase can be attributed to a dual celebration of the Fourth of July and the Centennial of the Statute of Liberty, it should be noted that fireworks injuries have been increasing steadily every year for the past decade.

"Of particular concern to the National Society to Prevent Blindness is that more than 15 percent of all fireworks injuries reported by Product Safety Commission involved the eye(s)," said Tod Turriff, Manager of

There's something rewarding about being a farmer, tilling the soil and seeing your efforts grow before your eyes.


But the reasons for being a farmer are becoming more esoteric each year. And the reward at the market place is getting thinner.


This I know it's easier to write about it than live it.


Miss Pittman is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Steve Mathews of Spearman. She will be a senior this next year at Spearman high school.



AUSTIN - - Impeachment remarks flew like bullets in an old-fashioned "cowboy shootout" and partisan politics filled Capitol halls when lawmakers reconvened last week.

The heat on Gov. Bill Clements has never been hotter as some lawmakers scorched him for his role in the ponygate scandal, as depicted in the freshly released Methodist bishops' report.

Two House members, Paul Moreno, D-El Paso, Al Edwards, D-Houston, filed a resolution to begin a inquiry geared to Clements' removal. Lena Guerrero, D- Austin, and Debra Danburg, D-Houston, were also vocal for in starting the probe now.

Attorney Gen. Jim Mattox said his office is investigating whether Clements broke any state laws during Ponygate or committed other impeachable acts.

By the end of the week, cooler heads urged members to work instead on the task they couldn't finish in regular session, the forging of a new state budget in the face of dwindling revenues.

Hobby Sets Pace

Lt. Gov. Bill Hobby quickly established the pace of the special session by zipping his previous budget plan through the Senate in a quick two days.

"His administration has been unfortunate for the state, as there have been other unfortunate administrations, but I see no grounds for impeachment," Hobby said.

Make no mistake about it. The opposition is intense between the Hobby and Clements political camps, and may diminish only with the political demise of one or the other.

Here It Comes!

So stuck in the middle again with the burden of forging a budget compromise is Speaker Gib Lewis and the House.

Their package doesn't spend as much as Hobby's, but opposes Clements because it will necessitate almost a penny increase in the state sales tax.

Thus, the House leadership prepares to make the end-game run voters have anticipating for months: pass a tax bill in the face of Bill Clements and then override his veto.

Even veterans will learn new tricks in the coming political hardball which will change the course of this state forever.

Clean House Movement?

Speaking of change, some say that wholesale changes will occur almost immediately out of this special session. A larger-thanusual number of lawmakers in both parties, because of the forced vote on new taxes, will opt to retire or be defeated in the '88 elections.

Other Capital-watchers are beginning to speak quietly of the possibility of a "clean house" movement by the voters.

The political squabbling, the budget failures, and the charges of improper conduct on the part of several officials have some observers wondering how long voters can stomach it all.

Comments

After scraping the bottom of the barrel for 18 months, the U.S. oil industry is beginning to see signs of life. The number of active drilling rigs in operation has reached 800, and the Petroleum Information Corporation, a Denver consulting firm, estimates that the weekly rig count will average 950 to 1,050 for the whole of 1987. That would mean about 38,000 new wells drilled this year, compared with 35,000 last year.

Meanwhile, OPEC oil ministers are gathering for their first meeting this year and are generally agreeing to stick with the cartel's current \$18-a-barrel price for crude oil.

Manei Saeed Al-Otaiba, the oil minister of the United Arab Emirates, told The Wall Street Journal in a recent interview, "You don't want to see the price go up because this will harm the oil demand recovery."




