# Raper handles police chief duties

The day-to-day task of handling law enforcement duties within the corporate city limits of Spearman falls squarely on the shoulders of veteran policemen Joe Raper .. chief of police for the city of Spearman since 1985.

A quiet, almost reticient speaker, Raper nonetheless handles the duties of the office with an efficiency that belies his quiet manner.

A native of Dimmitt, the Spearman chief of police began working in law enforcement shortly after graduating from high school, taking a dispatcher job with the Castro county sheriff's office there at the age of 19.

After only three months on the job, he was approached by the

Dimmitt police chief to work as a patrolman for the city of Dimmitt.

'I enjoyed what I was doing,' observes Raper. "And I felt like I could bring something to the job that would benefit those I served."

Now, at the age of 25, the Spearman police chief displays a maturity which sets him apart from many police chiefs who may have more chronological years to their

"Age has never really been a problem," he notes. "I treat people as I would like to be treated.

It's always seemed to work out." Following a year on the Dimmitt police force during which Raper received his basic certification in law enforcement, he began looking

for other opportunities in law enforcement circles.

Raper was offered a position within the Spearman police force and came to the city in 1982 as a patrolman under D.J. Alberts who was chief of police at that time.

Within seven months, Raper was promoted to sergeant where he began handling not only patrol duties, but began to get his baptism in administrative work as

When Alberts resigned in 1985, the Spearman sergeant was the natural choice for interim chief of police while the Spearman city council began receiving applications for the position.

After sifting through numerous

applications, city councilmembers decided to go with the officer whom they knew the best and Raper moved from interim chief of police to assume the duties on a full-time

It's been a working arrangement which has worked well not only for the city of Spearman and Raper himself, but for the community as a

Meanwhile, the Spearman police chief has assumed the role as a natural, working the headadministrative position with deft ability an! an even hand.

In addition to his administrative chores, Raper also acts as the city's Emergency Management Coordin-

Since Spearman football games are played on Friday evenings, the Sunday paper will be held in order to report on the outcome of Spearman Lvnx games in Sunday's paper.

This will result in papers being delivered through the mail on Monday's rather than the normal Saturday delivery.

Spearman city residents are being offered the option of having their paper thrown via carrier delivery on Saturday during the football season.

"Since all our subscriptions are through the mail, a good number of our subscribers get the paper in their post office box and we do not have their street address," notes Plainsman publisher James Jarrett.

Subscribers who wish home delivery on Saturday will need to call the newspaper office at 659-3434 to request the special service, observes Jarrett.

"We will need their names and their home address in order to effect Saturday delivery of the paper," he reports.

There will be no extra charge for home delivery during the Lynx gridiron schedule.

District will be taken by hospital district trustees in a special hearing tonight [Thursday] in the board room at Hansford Hospital in

Hansford tax payers will have the opportunity to voice their

opinions on a proposed tax increase from the current rate of 26.2 cents per \$100 valuation to a rate of 40.9 cents per \$100 valuation during this meeting which is scheduled to begin at 7 p.m.
Input from the public is being

sought by the hospital district. Following any public discussion. the board of directors then must decide whether to officially set the tax rate at the 40.9 cent level.

Currently, all the district has done is stated their intent to establish the 1987-88 rate at the new, higher figure.

At a second meeting, board members must decide and vote the new tax rate into effect. This meeting will be scheduled before the close of tonight's special hear-

Under Texas law, any taxing entity who wishes to set a tax rate in excess of eight percent of the entity's effective tax rate -- in this case set at 20.6939 cents for the hospital district -- is then subject to a rollback election which can be called by tax payers who fall under the entity's taxing authority.

The hospital district's effective tax rate is less than half of the amount needed to balance the current proposed budget of the hospital district which also oversees the Hansford Manor.

Under the eight percent rollback option, tax revenues for the hospital district could be trimmed from \$1,512,286 to \$765,161 a loss of \$747,125 for the hospital's operation in 1987-88.

The 14.7 cent increase being proposed by the hospital district is a raise of 56 percent over the current level and a raise of almost 113.5 percent above the effective tax rate which is established through a complicated formula prescribed by state law.

In dollars and cents, the proposed tax increase would result in a home valued at \$50,000 raising from \$131 to \$204.50 in hospital district taxes.

A \$30,000 home has current taxes of \$78.60 and under the proposed rate, the taxes would climb to \$122.70.

A \$75,000 home would have taxes of \$306.75 under the new rate while taxes amount to \$196.50 under the current tax rate.

The Hansford Hospital District will be going into the new fiscal year -- which begins Oct. 1 -- with a deficit in excess of \$800,000. The new tax rate is expected to balance the budget by the end of the upcoming fiscal year if revenue projections are met by both the hospital and the Hansford Manor.

# Commissioners amend 86-87 budget Monday

In a quiet special session Monday morning, Hansford County commissioners amended their current budget to align it with actual expenditures and handled several other routine matters.

Precincts three and four experienced higher than anticipated expenses for the current fiscal year in road repair due to heavy latewinter snows and early spring thunderstorms.

Precinct three had its budget upped by \$30,000 while \$70,000 was added to the precinct four budget to bring them in line with actual expenditures during the 1986-87 fiscal year.

In other action, commissioners okayed an easement for General Telephone and received the treasurer's quarterly report.

# School registration set Friday for all students

Some 825 Spearman school students are expected to register for the 1987-88 school year Friday as the Spearman ISD gears up for the first day of classes which will begin next Tuesday.

Junior high students -- who have not had to register in past years -will also register Friday, beginning at 9 a.m. in the junior high auditorium.

School offricials hope the preregisteration by grades five through eight will cut down on first day class interruptions next Tuesday, they report.

Elementary students will report to their grade levels beginning at 9 a.m. Friday as well.

When classes start next Tuesday, enrollment is expected to be at 575 at the Spearman elementary and junior high campus and 250 at the high school campus which houses grades nine through twelve.

All classes at Spearman High School will attend registration sessions in the high school auditorium at different times throughout the day Friday.

Senior registration begins at 8 a.m. with junior registration beginning at 9:30 that morning.

Sophomores are scheduled to begin their registration at 1 o'clock Friday afternoon with freshmen to report at 3 p.m. All students are requested to bring writing materials

ator -- the new term for Civil Defense -- where he is in charge of the many different emergency volunteer groups within the city who would come to play in the event of a disaster.

Raper, meanwhile, continues to handle the 10-member city law enforcement department with / a capable hand.

He has four patrol officers, five dispatchers and an animal control officer who reports to him and works with the patrol officers in investigating felonies committed in the city.

Being a police chief in a community the size of Spearman carries some additional responsibilities as well. Not only does he handle the administrative work, but he also fills in on patrol duties when the need arises.

And being cheif of police isn't exactly a nine to five proposition. It requires a special dedication, one which Raper readily brings to the job.

He and his wife, Beth, are familiar faces to residents in Spearman and both have been busy with school work in addition to their regular jobs.

Joe is working toward higher certification within law enforcement while Beth -- a secretary with a Spearman accounting firm -- is attending PSU in Goodwell, working toward an accounting degree.

The couple has made a solid contribution to the community they've decided to call home. And it's proven a mutual benefit to both.

## City awards hospitalization bid

The Spearman city council heard requests from a pair of groups which requested continuing financial aid from the city government's revenue sharing funds in a special public hearing Tuesday evening at Spearman city hall.

Both the Hansford Museum board and the Spearman senior citizen's group were on hand to request financial help from the city for programs the two groups sponsor.

While federal revenue sharing funds have been discontinued from Washington, the city of Spearman found itself with \$8,247 in fund money and interest left over from prior years.

City officials expressed their gratitude to both organizations for their efforts in the community and

In other action, city councilmen voted to accept a bid from Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Texas for the city's group life and health insurance.

City officials elected to accept a bid which pegged the rate for employee and family at \$189.00 per month plus the cost of employee life and accident and dismemberment insurance as well as dependent life insurance.


City mayor Ralph Blodgett received authorization from city councilmembers to proceed with repairs to the Spearman Airport T-hangars which were damaged in a summer thunderstorm.

Estimates for repair of the hangars was \$28,727 from Kelly Wood Company of Amarillo. All but \$200 of that will be paid by the city's insurance carrier.

A lone, dissent vote for authorization of the repairs was voiced by councilmember Wilson McClellan who then asked fellow councilmembers to consider alternate manners of repair which had been discussed earlier by the Spearman city council.

COMMENTS:

The number of active rotary rigs drilling domestically this week reached 998, the highest level since March 1986. The International Association of Drilling Contractors said the latest active rig count compares with the 1987 low of 744 recorded during May.

After seven years of surplus, the "gas bubble" is finally shrinking, said the American Gas Association. The glut, caused mostly by unusually warm winters and hard times in the U.S. energy industry, is expected to disappear by the end of 1990, predicted the AGA. The association estimated excess producing capacity will total 2.5 trillion cubic feet this year, down from four trillion in 1986.

# Former Hansford woman escapes Africa hostage situation

Editors note: A former Hansford county resident was recently involved in a hostage situation in Africa. A story, written by Mary Dudley, of the escape and eventual return to safety of Kindra Bryan is reprinted here by permission from the Perryton Herald.

After over three months as a hostage in Mozambique, Africa, Kindra Bryan of College Station was released Aug. 18.

Bryan, 28, a medical missionary, along with six others were taken at gunpoint from a rural medical clinic in Mozambique May 12. She had arrived at the clinic only two days before.

She is the daughter of Claud and Mary Jo Free of College Station, and the late Wayne Bryan. She is also the niece of Nadine Crum of Perryton.

After their release, Bryan and the other missionaries walked 300 miles into Malawi, a Christian country north of Mozambique. Her shoes worn through from the journey, Bryan had walked the last

miles barefooted. During her captivity, there was little information coming out about the hostages. The International

Red Cross acted as an intermediary between the State Department and RENAMO, the group claiming

responsibility for the capture.

The coastal nation of Maozambique has been involved in a civil war since it won independence from Portugal in 1974. Warring groups include the Marxist government in power, troops on loan from neighboring Zimbabwe and Portuguese-backed right-wing guerrillas known as RENAMO.

RENAMO claimed responsibility for the abduction, but denied the seven were hostages. RENAMO spokesmen in Washington, D.C. claimed they took the seven to protect them from Zimbabwean bombing in the area and were trying desperately to release them

It is still unclear why they were taken hostage in the first place, or how exactly the hostages earned their freeedom. The important thing to Bryan's family is that she is safe, and alive.

Mrs. Free talked with Mrs. Crum to tell her Bryan had been freed, and she had spoken with her daughter. Bryan was expected to return to College Station in about a week.







"Lots of foreign people come to the United States," a white man once told an audience of Apaches.

I have mixed emotions about the subject since my ancestors are a mixture of Scottish, Irish, and Choctaw. I have this strange compulsion to drink whiskey and go on the warpath in kilts.

Others have had strange experiences while adjusting to America. A Russian immigrant wrote a contest letter to a salad oil company, "Don't know if is your oil or my wife but no better salad a man is ever eating." The guy won a furnace, a stoker, and eight tons of

He had to pay the freight bill to

his home in the Mojave Desert. Some Polish immigrants told me of their method of earning a living as painters and roofers. One of the guys had lost an arm in the war so he just sat on a tall ladder with his head sticking through the roof or a skylight. He recited poetry while the others laid the shingles and painted shutters. He had poems long enough to come out even with any size job. On one dramatic, suspense-filled oration, a guy said, "Don't tell more like that. I painted this same shutter three times over.'

Some refugees from Cambodia tried farming. After several failures, they hit success raising oriental vegetables for Chinese restaurants. They said they learned the best way to make money farming was by not raising chickers.

A Yugoslavian immigrant told me of his early years in America. "We go to Chicago," he told his relatives. "What got to lose but our health?"

He was in the attic of his old

house in the hot summer doing some wiring. His wife was below shoving wire through a hole. It was so hot he was just in his underwear. He fell through a weak spot in the ceiling just as a neighbor lady knocked on the door. Jumping inside an antique grandfather clock bought at an auction, he watched through a crack as the lady was given a tour of the house. Proud of the old clock, his wife announced, "Is signed inside," and threw open the door.
