Historical painter may have sold works in area

## The strange and exciting story of

 an artist who sold her works all over the Southwest at the turm of the cen-tury to help free her doctor son from tury to help free her doctor son from
a Mexican prison, may very well have a Spearman connection, because some of the paintings are be-
lieved to be privaly lieved to be privately owned here. Her beautiful pastoral oil-on-tap-
estry paintings have brightened estry paintings have brightened
homes and churches and brought joy homes and churches and brought joy
to their owners throughout the Southwest since the turn of the eentury. Very few know of the despair that
accompanied every painstaking accompanied every painstaking
stroke of her brush. Certainly every painting had its message, but the painung had its message, but the
strange, remarkable, untold story of the artist and the calamity in her live that motivated her for years is a much greater picture. She painted with a
purpose.
And before her story was finally played out ouver international bor-
ders, she would have become inders, she would have become involved in the sphere of diplomatic relations, political lobbying andeven
into the areas of helping finance into the areas of $h$ forcign revolution.
