

# Awards Given At Chamber Banquet

The annual Spearman Chamber of Commerce banquet on Saturday, Jan. 27 featured a magnificently decorated high school cafeteria, well-known Texas humorist Stan White as guest speaker, and awards to several special Spearman residents.

The 250 people who attended this gala affair entered Spearman High School only to find its cafeteria transformed into a formal black, white and silver banquet hall. White twinkling lights lined the hallway floor into the room, with black top hats spaced among them. Tuxedoed members of the Spearman Ambassadors Club formed a receiving line at the ticket table.

Inside the dining area, tinsel chandeliers hung from the ceiling in the glow of hundreds of miniature white lights, which were strung across the room. The tables were covered with white paper and decorated with black candles in silver star holders and black and white place mats with the evening's program inscribed. The dais table was skirted in long fringes of silver tinsel. Half-walls of black plastic dotted with silver stars surrounded the room. All of these things combined to beautifully carry out this year's banquet theme, "Puttin' on the Glitz."

Music added the final elegant touch, as Janie Kunselman performed on a grand piano during pre-dinner socializing and the following meal. After being served steak, baked potatoes, salad and cake prepared by the Spearman Jaycees and served by members of the Hansford County 4-H Club, Mistress of Ceremonies for the evening Loretto Cook got the program underway.

Bill Pittman, 1990 President of the Spearman Ambassador's Club, introduced out-of-town guests, who included David Hudson and C.D. and Jimmie Riggins of Perryton; Lauren Haley and Claudette Hand of Canadian; and Margie and Guy Hazlett of Borger. Also in attendance at the banquet were Miss Hansford County, Michelle Cook and Miss Hansford Teen, Tamri Townsen. First United Methodist Church of

Spearman Minister Todd Dyess gave the invocation.

1989 Spearman Chamber of Commerce President Don Townsen briefly summarized the organization's activities and accomplishments for the year and then introduced incoming Chamber President Jackie Pearson. Pearson said the chamber's focus for 1990 will be memberships, stating, "Your membership shows you are interested in Spearman and the retail community of our town." She then named the 1990 Spearman Chamber of Commerce officers, including new Executive Vice President Brett Whitford, its Board of Directors and presented Townsen with a plaque for his year of service.

Next on the program was the Rotary Club's announcement of its Employee of the Year recipient. Kevin Bynum presented this award, which he described as one which goes to an employee "who goes above and beyond the normal duties of a job" to show dedication, conscientiousness, leadership and an active interest in the community. Ernest J. ("Butch") Butler received this honor.

Butler has worked at Thriftway for 39 years as a butcher, having come to Spearman in 1951 from Oklahoma to take the position. He is currently marketing manager at Thriftway. He and his wife Rae, who works for Bob Skinner, reared their three sons here. Butler loves his job, especially his interactions with people.

Karen Babitzke, (1989 Chamber Women's Division president) took the podium next at the banquet. She introduced the past year's officers and board members and all Women's Division members stood to be recognized. Incoming Women's Division President Cindy Rice then presented Babitzke with a plaque.

The Women's Division Member of the Year presentation was given by Babitzke. For 1989, this award went to Pat Dear.

Bill Pittman presented outgoing Spearman Ambassador's President Mike Cudd with a service plaque, saying, "Mike has devoted much time and energy and ability to the town of Spear-

man."

Guest speaker Stan White entertained the diners with a 30-minute humorous speech. He advised all to "laugh and live," asserting that "thirty minutes of laughter relieves eight hours of stress."

The winner's name of the banquet door prize, two round-trip tickets to any city in Texas, was then drawn. Stephanie Brock won these tickets, donated by American Airlines and Pat Dear of Wheatheart Travel.

Next on the program came the much-anticipated annual awards: Citizen of the Year, Citizen over the Years, and Citizen of the Decade.

John Collard, 1963 Citizen of the Year, introduced the 1989 winner of this honor, Pat Dear. In his biographical sketch of Dear, Collard mentioned her many years of service to both Spearman and Hansford County, in particular her support of school athletics over the years. Dear owns the Bunkhouse on Main Street and is also a Wheatheart Travel agent. Among her past and present memberships are the Board of the American Heart Association, the Spearman Chamber of Commerce and its Women's Division and the

First United Methodist Church.

Dear was presented with a plaque and also a Texas state flag that flew over the state capitol in 1989. Lauren Haley of Representative Dick Waterfield's office presented this special flag to Dear.

1988 "Citizen over the Years" Pete Fisher announced the 1989 recipient of this award. Virginia Head was named, and Fisher cited her fifty-plus years of friendship and service to the Spearman community, particularly through the First United Methodist Church's women's organization, United Methodist Women. "Virginia always has time for others," Fisher said, "and her call seems to be to encourage and cheer us on."

Clay Schnell, grandson of the 1979 recipient of the Citizen of the Decade award, Clay Gibner, presented this award for 1989. The winner was Ralph Blodgett, whose many years as a local businessman and 12-year tenure as the mayor of Spearman were cited. Blodgett's past and present memberships include the Spearman Chamber of Commerce, the Board of Directors of the First National Bank, past President of the Texas Tech Alumni Associa-

tion, and First Presbyterian Church.

Many people pooled their ideas and efforts to make the 1989 Spearman Chamber of Commerce

## Enrollment Steady

As of Monday, Jan. 29 a total of 42 students have enrolled to attend kindergarten during the 1990-1991 school year. These students will be invited to attend school during Pre-School Roundup in April according to Eddie Gage, Spearman Elementary School principal.

Gage pointed out this number does not represent the total enrollment for next year. "Between now and the time for Roundup, we'll probably pick up another 15-20 students," he said. "Right now we have 61 students in kindergarten."

Enrollment figures remain fairly constant, said Gage. "For several years, the enrollment has been about 60 students even with changes in the economy and other things. We do have 94 third-grade students, but that is an unusual class number. The other elementary grades have around 60 students each. The number of students we have enrolled now is

approximately the same as we had last year at this time," he explained.

"We just have to remind parents to enroll their children between now and Roundup time," he continued. He said the list of students compiled between now and April will be used as a mailing list. The list will be used to send forms and other information to the prospective kindergarten students in Spearman. Anyone who knows of a child who will start kindergarten next September and is not on the list should call the Spearman Elementary School office.

Those students enrolled so far include Sasha L. Allen, Loree Marie Baca, Daniel Lance Baker, Samantha Kay Baker, Kevin Scott Beedy, Allison Nicole Behney, Travis Bill Brown, Julie Ann Burch, Brianne Burkhammer and Billy Frank Close, Jr.

Others are Jeffery Ryan Coates.

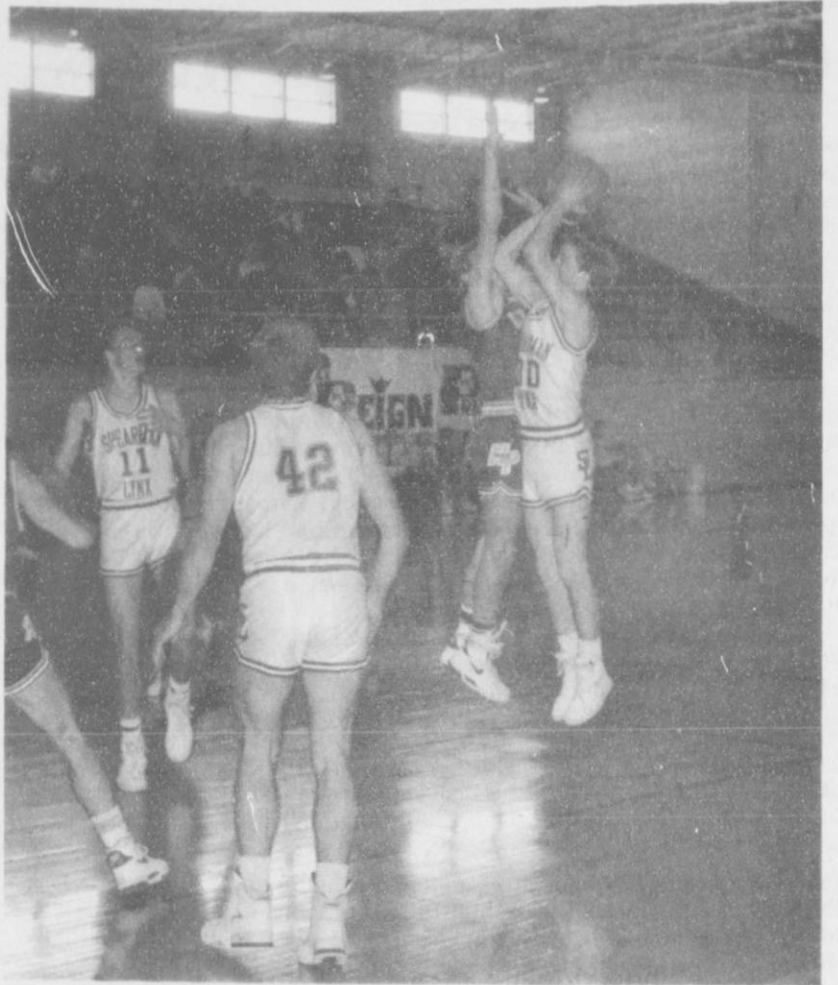

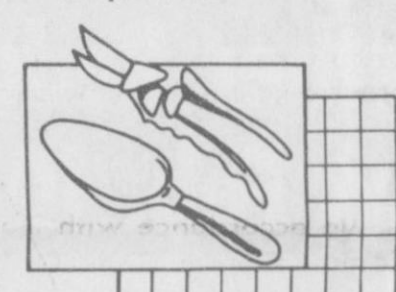

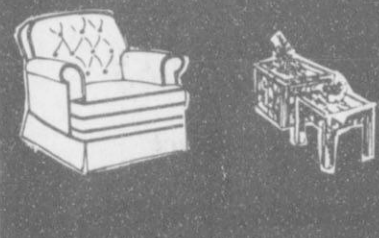
