A recent bulletin coming from the Agricultural Adjustment Administration gives Hansford land owners an opportunity to earn additional revenue on lands where the wheat failed and the land offers a wind erosion hazard. The practices that are necessary to earn up to as much as 75c per acre are listed below in the copy of government bulletin. One item in this list that is a bit confusing is the contouring payment. The payment of 25c per acre can be earned for contour furrowing even though no crop is planted. County Agent Hatton states that it is imperative that farmers come in this week and sign-up for any or all of the new programs, since the work of checking the land must be completed at an early date. He makes the suggestion that individuals who are in doubt about their respective grogram come to the county agents office and take the matter up direct with officials here.

A new ordinance based on Penal Code article 480 of the State of Texas was passed at the meeting of the city commissioners held ledneday of this week Basis for the ordinance is in the article which is printed below. Penal Code, Article 480:—Shooting in public places—any person who discharges any gun, pistol or firearm of any kind, or discharges any cannon cracker or torpedo on or across any public square, street or alley of any bown or city, or within 100 yards of any business house in this state shall be fined not more than \$100. A "cannon cracker" is any combustible package more than woo inches long and more than one inch through.

An ordinance to regulate the use and sale of fireworks; to prescribe and impose penalties; to repeal certain ordinances, and eclaring an emergency.

Be it ordained by the board of Commissioners of the City of Spearman. Texas:

Section 1. If this form of advertising is to be encouraged in the State, it seems that some regulation should be imposed requiring theatres to make a revision of their lists eleminating the names of those who would never have another opportunity of attending the programs.

Proposed Amendments to the Constuti of the State of Texas

S. J. R. No. 9 A Joint Resolution

A Joint Resolution

—proposing an amendment to Section 16, Article 16, of the Constitution of Texas; providing that the Legislature shall authorize the incorporation of banking bodies and provide for the supervision and regulation of same; providing for all of the capital stock to be subscribed and paid for before charter issued; restricting foreign corporations from doing banking business; restricting corporate business to one place.

Section 1. That Section 16, Article 16, of the Constitution of Texas, be amended so as to hereafter read as follows:
"Section 16. The Legislature shall by general laws, authorize the incorporation of corporate bodies with banking and discounting privileges, and shall provide for a system of State supervision, regulation and control of such bodies which will adequately protect and secure the depositors and tect and secure the depositors and creditors thereof.

"No such corporate body shall be chartered until all of the au-thorized capital stock has been subscribed and paid for in full in cash. Such body corporate shall not be authorized to engage in business at more than one place which shall be designated in its charter.

"No foreign corporation, other than the national banks of the United tates, shall be permitted to exercise banking or discount-ing privileges in this State."
