## LIVESTOCK ASSESSMENT

While there is often a question as to the fairness, tax laws in the State of Texas are very definite as they pertain to livestock. Thus, we have
as they now exist.
Livestock is assessed for tax purposes according to its location on January 1st, regardless of the owners residence. All live-
stock in Hansford County on January 1st then must be rendered by stock in Hansford County oners or those in charge or possession. Taxes will be due the following Fall and payment should be made to this office. PERSONAL PROPERTY IN THE CHARGE OR POSSESSION OF SOMEONE OTHER THAN THE OWNER SHALL BE ASSESSED TO THE PERSON HAVING IT IN CHARGE OR POSSESSION. (Arts. 7160,7152 .) Therefore, if you have cattle on your property or if you are looking after someone's cattle you are responsible to this office for the owner's name and address and the number of cartle. Ane not confirmed, then these may be charged to you.

Since by law, the rendering of property is the responsibility of to the Hansford County Tax Office by all owners. A $100 \%$ count is expected.
WHENEVER THE TAXPAYER REFUSES TO MAKE RENDITION OR TO SUBSCRIBE TO THE OATH, THE ASSESSOR SHALL PROCEED TO ASSESS THE PROPERTY OF SUCH TAXPAYER, AND THE ASSESSMENT SO MADE SHALL BE AS LEGAL
AND BINDING AS IF RENDERED BY THE TAXPAYER. (Art. 7193.) An intense effort has been made by the Hansford County Tax Office Personnel this year, to count the livestock on every section of Hansford County. Naturally there will be human error, so the duce this occurance.
