Stay Off The Grass

Within the past two weeks several acres of campus grass have been moved, sidewalks laid, grounds leveled off and trees trimmed. These changes have been made through the use of city funds donated by interested citizens of Lubbock.

Working from another angle, the Campus Beautification committee, appointed two years ago to supervise the use of student funds in grounds' improvement, expects to meet next week to discuss further beautification plans for the year. The committee now has at its disposal \$1,148. For the last several years, with the exception of this term, each student has donated 50 cents of his breakage deposit to the beautification fund which is to be executed as the committee sees fit. Nine-tenths of the students giving the 50 cents did not miss that small amount. In most cases, they were glad to be instrumental in helping Tech, and it was easier to give the money than to go to the trouble of begging off. With improvements actually being made, would it not be well to continue these donations for the beautification of the campus?

It is not entirely money from the two funds that has made our progress possible, however. George Long, superintendent of grounds, and his assistants are doing a splendid job despite the shortage of help and equipment. Filling up foot paths and running concrete, these men have been constantly on duty. The general improvement of the campus gives everyone's spirit a lift.




