| WASHINGTON - President Johnson's campaign for a $\$ 10$-blllion tax increase was blasted out of deadlock Wednesday when the House Appropriations Committee agreed on an $\$ 18$-bilition total long and short range appropriations cut. <br> The committee specified that the reduction must include an actual spending cut of not less than $\$ 4$ billion during the year beginning July 1 . Because of long-range programs, appropriations and spending never exactly coincide in any one year. <br> THE COMMITTEE action, adoption of a resolution setting out its intentions, does not guarantee that the tax-economy bill will be passed, or even that it will be submitted in the form outlined. |
