## Government loans, steady budget inconsistent

Carrillo Act, begun last spring, provide low interest loans and free tuition, respectively. Now, on top of this largely government-spon sored increase in enrollment, Gov. Connally ask state colleges and universities to "toe the line" in budget requests for the 1968 fiscal year. Con Sidering that tuition fees paid by loans cover
less than 20 per cent of a student's educational expenses, it doesn't take much of an accountant to see the inconsistency.
Either the government should "toe the line" on some of its loan programs, or provide more money for higher education. Failure to do so can only lower the quality of education in an already subpar educational stat
