NEW PROTEIN OINTMENT HAILED AS SUCCESS IN TREATMENT OF BURNS

DETROIT, Dec. 16. (AP)—A protein ointment for burns developed by a Detroit physician was reported Thursday to have been used successfully on 500 patients at children's hospital here.

The ointment is called "Epi-therm" and is a product of the Wilcox Laboratories in Chicago. Its discovery was reported to the medical profession about seven years ago and since then it has been used in clinical tests here.

Dr. C. H. Chase, who developed it, said he expected it to become more widely used as result of successful use here. He himself has

used it with good results in industrial cases here, he said.

Dr. C. N. Weller, a member of the Wayne University Medical College faculty, said the ointment had been found excellent for treating the burns of children. He carried out tests at Children's hospital.

The raw material for the ointment is taken from freshly killed beef. The sorts, a large artery near the heart of the animal, contains the healing ingredients, Dr. Chase discovered in research that he started 13 years ago.

These advantages are claimed for the ointment:

It does not kill tissue; it helps a scab to form; favors the growth of new skin; stops the loss of body fluid; stimulates the need for bandages in many cases; it can be removed easily so skin may be grafted if necessary; it can be used as a medium for penicillin and sulfadiazole; any infection can be observed and treated quickly.

British Atomic Bomb Hinted

LONDON, Dec. 16. (AP)—The Daily Mirror gave its readers the impression Thursday that Britain has produced an atomic bomb.

The mass circulation tabloid said in an unattributed, undated article by its atomic affairs writer, Ronald Bedford:

"Britain's atomic weapon, which our scientists have been developing for more than two years, will not be tried out at the forthcoming test of American super-atom bombs."

There was no confirmation from any other source of the inference that Britain already has an atomic weapon.

Government ministers, questioned frequently on the subject in the house of commons, have refused consistently to give any hint as to whether British researchers have succeeded in making atomic weapons.

Bedford noted that Defense Minister A. V. Alexander, in May, 1948, said atomic weapons were "being developed" here.

Bedford wrote that the United States, Britain and Canada at a recent Washington conference on atomic energy decided against testing the purported British weapon during the forthcoming test of American weapons at Eniwetok Atoll in the Pacific.

Texas Sex Crims Laws Under Study

AUSTIN, Dec. 16. (AP)—Adequacy of Texas sex crime laws is being studied by a legislative committee.

It has enlisted the aid of J. Edgar Hoover, chief of the FBI, and attorneys general in other states.

Chairman Cecil Storey of the legislative committee on revision of the criminal code said if the sex crime question is submitted to the special session of the legislature, it will be given "careful and thoughtful consideration." Storey is chairman of the House Committee on Criminal Jurisprudence.

Mother, Daughter Die in Car Mishap

FREESPORT, Dec. 16. (AP)—Mrs. Madeline Bevis, 20, and her year-old daughter drowned yesterday when the car in which they were riding overturned into Oyster Creek.

Roy E. Beets, 22, husband of Mrs. Bevis, said he lost control of the car when he was wiping the inside of the windshield. He said the steering wheel locked after it appeared to have struck a hole in the road.

Christmas Tree Cutting Leaves Forests Unharmed

WASHINGTON, Dec. 16. (AP)—The Department of Agriculture raised this question today—are we ruining our forests by cutting down so many Christmas trees?—And answered: No.

Sparing the tree may spoil the woodland, the department said in a statement, because "in dense stands the thinning of trees stimulates the growth of remaining trees."

What's more, it said, many New England farmers sell Christmas trees which they clear from pasture land. "If the Christmas tree market did not exist, much desirable thinning or pasture clearing might remain undone because of labor costs."

The department estimated that 28 million Christmas trees will be put on the market this year.

The demand for heavier belts is said to have been the principal reason for the exploration and development of Canada.

Industrial Outlook Is Cheering

NEW YORK, Dec. 16. (AP)—Cheery Christmas reading today for many businessmen, many industrialists: Stock exchange price averages this week hit the highest point in over a year. And the total volume of trading also was larger than at any time since a year ago November. A number of people, apparently, are betting on better days ahead.

Steel production continues its spectacular rebound from strike days. Mills this week are operating at better than 90 per cent of capacity. Output in November is announced at more than four million net tons, compared with strike-bound October's 900,000 tons. December seems staked at still higher goals.

Building records are being broken. The Bureau of Labor Statistics predicts more than a million new homes will have been started this year. The construction industry in general is reported to expect that 1950 will equal the estimated

\$19 billion building peak being set this year.

And hand in hand go hardware sales. Stores in New York report November sales up to five per cent better than last year.

Copper deliveries in November are reported today as the highest since March, 1948. The price of tin turned stronger in Singapore yesterday and sent dealers into the London futures market for active buying.

Paperboard production is reported running six per cent ahead of last year. The industry is considered an industrial barometer because the demand for paperboard

indicates a need for containers to ship goods.

Plywood prices have been rising in the northwest. Homebuilding has spurred the demand for finished plywood.

Wool cloth output has rebounded from the mid-summer slump and weavers now predict that the total in the final three months of the year will be as great as in the same period last year.

ROTAN FIRE INVESTIGATORS REPORT INABILITY TO DISCOVER EXACT CAUSE

ROTAN, Dec. 16. (AP)—What caused the fire that killed 11 members of a family of transient farm workers?

A three-man investigating committee reported to County Judge U. S. Branscum that it could not determine specifically the cause. The men made their report after probing the ruins of a flimsy shack in the middle of a wheat field near this West Texas town.

The skeletons of the 11 persons were found yesterday morning. The family moved into the house only the day before. Those old enough to work had been hired to pick cotton on the C. A. Douthitt farm, eight miles west of here.

With the aid of other transient workers, officers identified the dead as:

- Basilio Perez, 75.
- Manuel Perez, 38, and his wife, 40, son and daughter-in-law of Basilio Perez.
- Alfredo Castillo, 21, and his wife, 14, son-in-law and daughter of Manuel Perez. Officers said the 14-year-old wife was pregnant.
- Other children of Manuel Perez: Juanita, 12; Victoria, 10; Monse, 8; Jesus, 6; Manuela, 2, and a baby girl, about 1.

Officers speculated they may have left a kerosene stove lighted all Wednesday night to protect themselves against temperatures 10 degrees below freezing. Also in the shack was a wood-burning stove made of an empty gasoline barrel.

SPEAKS IN FT. WORTH
Ike Reiterates He Is Not Candidate

FORT WORTH, Dec. 16. (AP)—Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower says there is a growing concern among the people—a bewilderment, sometimes a resentment—because the high hopes held during the war have not been realized.

"In foreign relations we have seen an ideology, an announced foe of our form of government, engulf all of eastern Europe," he said last night, "and threaten western Europe and reach into Asia—until at times we feel almost isolated. To make the solutions to our problems more complicated, we must reach some answer in the atomic shadow."

Eisenhower, who says he will not let any sort of talk by others make him a presidential candidate, spoke at the annual dinner of the Fort Worth Chamber of Commerce. He told an audience of 5,000: "I believe we should not forget that what the founding fathers of America strove for was the diffusion and decentralization of power—strove to keep power out of the hands of the central government to the detriment of the individuals."

"If we can remember that if we surrender responsibility we must surrender a comparable amount of authority—if we can remember this and solve our own problems our own way—then the faith of our founding fathers that this nation can govern itself will be justified."

Earlier yesterday at a press conference he said again that he does not intend to enter the field of politics.

And he emphasized he had no reaction to recent quoted statements by members of President Truman's staff that Eisenhower was "acting like a (presidential) candidate."

"Frankly," said Eisenhower, "I have no political angle and I'm not going to let any sort of talk by others make me a candidate."

No taxation, he said: "How far can a government go in taxing away property rights and still not leave the government the master of the people instead of its servant?"

"We have, I think, repudiated a theory that fundamentally there was a struggle in this country between human rights and property rights. We repudiated it when we realized that property rights are only one of the human rights."

He warned that the simple days of a century ago are gone.

"Today great cities of workers have been built around factories. The slightest dislocation of an industry brings distress that the government cannot ignore. The danger is when the government takes such a problem entirely to itself."

ANNUAL AUDIT APPROVED

City Independent School Dist. Resources Exceed \$1,000,000

Resources of the Big Spring Independent School district have topped \$1,000,000 according to the annual audit approved by the board of trustees.

This figure, of course, includes cash and securities (\$261,663), tax receivable (\$48,525), land (\$32,331), buildings (\$532,763), equipment (\$110,182) and buildings under construction (\$53,462). The total is \$1,009,139. Of the cash total, \$194,859 is in the building fund as the residue of a \$200,000 bond issue after land purchasers were made.

Bonded debt of the district amounted to \$499,700 at the end of the fiscal year, Aug. 31, 1948. This was an increase of \$187,600, a total of \$12,600 having been retired during the year. The audit showed \$20,444 still outstanding on refund of overassessment of 1947 taxes, but this had been repaid since the audit made by Merle J. Stewart.

Among revenues for the year, outside of conventional sources, items of \$4,500 for sale of land, \$1,400 from rental of the baseball park, \$2,502 payment in lieu of taxes from Ellis Homes government housing project, \$1,919 donations of taxpayers on overassessed (1947) taxes.

The auditor noted that the bulk of increased expenses of the district for the fiscal year was represented in increased salaries. Depreciation figure for school property was pegged at \$345,178, leaving a net book value of \$297,778. Insurance in force amounts to \$700,000 on school plant. Other structures were protected by an aggregate of \$34,900, plus \$9,925 for fire and windstorm insurance on special auxiliary structures such as stadium, ticket booths, etc.

There was an aggregate of more than \$50,000 in other policies for boilers, band instruments, burglary, fidelity bonds, plus special liability policies for vehicular equipment.

He also noted that the interest and sinking fund had been shorted by \$1,245 by use of an arbitrary 15 per cent on collections in arrears. Actually, the funds out was substantially larger than in former years. Corrective transfers from the general to the interest and sinking fund have been made. He also recommended increasing the bodily injury insurance on one of the school buses, and this has been done.

U. S. Agencies May Be Blocking War On Trusts

WASHINGTON, Dec. 16. (AP)—Secretary of Commerce Sawyer's campaign to overhaul the federal anti-monopoly program will explore the possibility that some government agencies are innocently sabotaging the anti-trust effort.

This was reported today by officials well advised on Sawyer's top-level monopoly committee, set up by President Truman to unify the anti-trust program and bolster voluntary compliance by "educating" businessmen.

Sawyer has assured Congress that the new "positive" approach is not intended to interfere with the government's enforcement drive.

"I am in complete agreement with you," he wrote to Sen. Ke-fauver (D-Tenn.), "that there are anti-trust problems which cannot be dealt with by education."

One major phase of the Sawyer committee's work, officials disclosed, will be to see whether the government's own house is in order. Some legislators— notably Rep. Celler (D-N.Y.), who heads the monopoly subcommittee of the House Judiciary Committee— have voiced their doubts.

Six Killed In Crash Of B-29

ROSWELL, N. M., Dec. 16. (AP)—On the edge of Roswell, an Air Force B-29 crashed and burned late yesterday, killing six.

Three crewmen were seriously injured. Five others walked away from the flaming wreckage with cuts and bruises.

The bomber, roaring into a landing at Walker Air Force Base where it was stationed, sheared off a windmill and tumbled to the ground.

Cause of the crash was not made public.

The plane crashed two miles north of the field and four miles from downtown Roswell.

The B-29 was returning from a training flight. The Roswell dispatch said the pilot apparently understood the field.

The dead included Capt. Charles A. Whitlock, 30, Fort Worth, Texas.

ROME, Dec. 16. (AP)—Film Director Roberto Rossellini says he and Screen Star Ingrid Bergman are "overcoming the difficulties" delaying her divorce from Dr. Peter Lindstrom.

Rossellini told a reporter yesterday he and Miss Bergman expected to announce their marriage plans within a week.

The Italian director did not say what were the difficulties over the divorce but he indicated the couple had found a legal way around them, possibly through a European divorce.

"It might be called an act of God," he said.

Miss Bergman said Rossellini is "terribly upset by the fires of rumor burning around us" and is virtually in seclusion here.

Regarding published reports that she expects a baby in February, Rossellini said: "Ingrid has decided to say nothing. No action means no trouble—that's our policy. And we've had our share of trouble, don't you think?"

"These stories," he continued, "How can anyone be so vicious? It's all so delicate and involved, you understand, one cannot just comment on such things which may involve many others."

Miss Bergman announced last summer that she planned to divorce her husband, marry Rossellini and retire from the screen. The couple's romance developed when she made the yet-unreleased film "Stromboli" under his direction on a small island off the Italian coast.

OFFICERS RECOVER PART OF LOOT

Dallas Detective Arrested In \$150,000 Perryton Gem Theft

DALLAS, Dec. 16. (U) — A one-time Dallas private detective has been arrested and accused of a \$150,000 jewel robbery at Perryton.

The man, who once worked for a Dallas collection agency, was arrested here yesterday by Dallas County deputy sheriffs and Sheriff Ray Phagan of Perryton, Ochiltree County.

On Dec. 7, \$150,000 in jewels were taken from a Perryton drug store. The gems were in simple cases left in the store overnight by two jewelry salesmen, John W. Sims of the Tynes Company of Dallas and Henry A. Mass of the A. Edward Fisher Co. of New York. The drug store has a jewelry repair shop inside the building.

Phagan said that after the arrest he and Sheriff Bill Decker of Dallas were led to a buried suitcase which contained about \$50,000 worth of rings, bracelets and watches. Phagan said the arrested man told them the rest of the jewelry "about \$100,000 worth," was buried on a farm near Perryton.

Phagan and Decker named the man as Lloyd Edwin Roberts, 34.

They said he admitted to them he took the jewels Wednesday night, Dec. 7, from the Burg Drug Store in Perryton.

At Perryton late last night officers recovered the rest of the jewels. They were found in an old cellar under some boards and tin on a farm where no one was living. The abandoned cellar was near a barn.

Phagan planned to return Roberts to Perryton today.

The Ochiltree County officer said at the time of the theft the former private detective had worked in a bakery at Perryton. Phagan said Roberts gave this account:

He broke into the store to knock the knob on the safe. When he failed to open the safe he looked around and found the sample cases of diamonds the two salesmen had left in the store overnight.

The jewels, said Phagan, were hidden in a hog pen about six miles south of Perryton. The former detective said he stayed in town until Sunday. He told a Dallas News reporter he took a bus to Dallas carrying some of the jewelry Sunday. Then, he told the reporter, he went to Amarillo Tuesday by plane and

called Phagan in Fort Worth. He was there to talk to the Tarrant County sheriff about the theft.

The deputies told Phagan they had found a jacket in a trash pile with some empty jewel boxes in it. Phagan brought his information to Dallas. Decker assigned Dallas Deputies Wayne Winton, John Porter, J. W. Massey, and Joe Ellis to the case. They found the former private detective in a parked car at an intersection at Zang and Illinois in Dallas.

Phagan said four other persons were being held at Perryton in connection with the theft. "But I don't think they had anything to do with it," he said.

West German Parliament Session Broken Up Over 'Puppet' Charge

BONN, Germany, Dec. 16. (U) — For the second time in three weeks a session of the West German parliament broke up in an uproar today over charges that Chancellor Konrad Adenauer's government is a puppet of the western allies.

Tumult broke out on the floor when Communist Leader Max Reimann bitterly accused Adenauer of fostering a German rearmament plan "backed by German and American imperialism."

"If it were left the German people, this puppet government would be finished off in 48 hours," Reimann shouted.

At this, members leaped to their feet, shouting angry objections. The parliament president, Dr. Erick Koehler, recessed the session, but Reimann continued shouting over the uproar for several minutes before he strode from the chamber.

Socialist Leader Kurt Schumacher also disrupted a parliament session Nov. 25 when he called Adenauer "chancellor of the allies" during criticism of the chancellor's decision to end West Germany's boycott of the international Ruhr authority.

Schumacher was expelled from parliament for 20 sessions but this ban was later removed.
