Choosing of the weekly games for this contest will be handled by the sports department of this paper.

Headline games of the nation and of the Southwest in particular will be chosen.

In this week's warmups Munn won over Beckmyer in three sets, Hightower defeated Houston and Trevor Wolfe took Ed Moore in two straight sets.

A tentative match with Hardin-Simmons scheduled for this afternoon has been cancelled and Coach Allen hopes that West Texas State's tennis team may be obtained as a replacement.

Next year, barring inroads in the ranks of those eligible, may well be a banner year for Tech's varsity net-men, with Joe Elrod, Munn and Jack Kennedy coming up.

Head Coach Pete W. Cawthon played quarterback and end for Southwestern University. He was also captain and four-letter man in leading sports.

The 1940 edition of the Red Raiders will be the fastest Texas Tech team in ten years, including both line-men and backs.
