In a group of 2,000 students, tennis nd track enthusiasts are just as plentiful in proportion a are basketball and football aspirants. There are stars a our college in tennis and track just as there are in ootball or basketball, who only need to be discovered. It is true that basketball attracts an entirely differnt group of athletes than does football. It is reasonable o expect that tennis and track would bring out others who are neither in basketball nor football.

The coaching department has issued the statement hat there will be no track or tennis again this year because of lack of funds. Granted that there are no funds, with a heavy spring football program planned, would it not be fairer to put tennis and track on an intramural basis rather than to leave them out entirely.

There are students here for the third year, heart and soul track-minded, who have not been given an opporanity to earn a letter in their sport, Some will graduate without having had a chance to win honors in track. The Toreador recommends that track and tennis be begun again on a large scale, even if spring football has to be dispensed with. A four point athletic program is far more inclusive than a two point. It is more democratic. Why should football be practiced two-thirds of the year and track not at all?

Tech is called a democratic institution. The student body must cooperate with the athletic department, and make our college democratic in spirit, in name, and above all—in athletics.

Does it not seem logical that a team playing only four games has not the chance to show its real strength or weakness as much as the team playing ten games?

If such a board were appointed, it could manage the schedules of each sport by setting a minimum number of conference games to be played before a school would be eligible for the championship. This board could also settle any dispute that might arise between the schools concerning the sites of the various games by planning a complete schedule for the conference.

FINALS ARE NEAR

Mid-term reports again remind us that Tech is an institution of higher learning. But are we to take these reminders seriously or just casually dismiss them, whether we were reported or not?

Students who received notification that they were doing unsatisfactory work in their studies should be thankful that their instructors are interested enough in them to give a definite measure of their standing.

Of all the students in Tech, forty-seven per cent were reported in one or more subjects as unsatisfactory or failing; the remaining fifty-three per cent of the students who drew clean reports might or might not have grades of C or above. Thus far in the winter term they might have "lucked out" and escaped the notice of professors, but the final examinations—only two weeks away—will tell the true story of the student's capacity for work.

Let us again-remind ourselves of our studies and return to work. Let us again raise our grades to a safe margin so that the impartial final examinations will not find us wanting.
